called 'the said Benefice') of Binham and the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Little Ellingham with Great Ellingham, both in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Binham and Little Ellingham with Great Ellingham is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Reverend Frederick Blackett De Chair, of Number 91, Cromwell Road, Hove, in the County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Norwich, and Leonard George Bolingbroke, of the Diocesan Registry, Norwich, in the said County of Norfolk, Solicitor, upon trust to present such Clerk or Clerks as the Bishop of Norwich for the time being should himself select or nominate for presentation:

"And whereas the said Frederick Blackett De Chair and Leonard George Bolingbroke are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Binham and Little Ellingham with Great Ellingham, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefices of Binham and Little Ellingham with Great Ellingham which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Binham, and Little Ellingham

with Great Ellingham:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Frederick Blackett De Chair and Leonard George Bolingbroke (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Binham and Little Ellingham with Great Ellingham, now vested in them the said Frederick Blackett De Chair and Leonard George Bolingbroke as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been ap-

proved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Norwich.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Harrow on the Hill, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Roxeth, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, all in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Harrow on the Hill, the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, and the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Harrow on the Hill, of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, and of the said New Parish
