PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of February, 1923, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas the payment of Submarine

Allowance was approved by Order in Council dated the 4th November, 1901, the rates being subsequently modified by Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing dates the 28th July, 1915, 22nd January, 1920, and 13th October, 1920:

“And whereas the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service authorize the grant of Hard Lying Money to Officers and men serving in certain vessels:

“And whereas we consider that the rates of Submarine Allowance should be revised, and that in view of the nature of the employment payment of Hard Lying Money should be extended to Officers and men serving in Submarines:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the proposals set forth in the accompanying schedule, with effect from 19th May, 1922.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“SCHEDULE.

“Submarine Allowance to be granted to Officers and men serving in the Submarine Service as follows :—

“I. OFFICERS.

Rank.

Officers forming part crew :

Officers of the rank of Captain when appointed in command of a Submarine	...	6s.
If above the rank of Sub-Lieutenant and below the rank of Captain	6s.
If of, or below, the rank of Sub-Lieutenant	3s
