PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act and which re-enacts similar provisions by the said Act repealed of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854), it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of these establishments, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by certain Orders in Council made on the dates set out in the First Schedule

hereto, in pursuance of the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1854 and 1894, the establishment which might be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioners) being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in those Acts, and the amount of the salaries to be paid to the officers of the said establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas it is expedient that the establishment of the Commissioners should be reorganised in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such reorganisation of the establishment.

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is desirable that certain provisions in respect of age, examination, appointment and retirement should be applied to the reorganised establishment of the Commissioners:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- This Order shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette.
 - 2. The Orders in Council the dates whereof

are set out in the First Schedule hereto are

hereby revoked.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Order the establishment of the Commissioners shall consist of the posts enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto at the salaries of which the minimum, annual increase, and maximum are respectively mentioned in the same Schedule, but the annual increase of such salaries shall (except in the case of the Secretary) be only granted on a Certificate by the Commissioners that the preceding period of the officer's service has been distinguished by zeal, industry and regularity.

4. The staff at present employed by the Commissioners shall, subject to individual fitness, be absorbed so far as possible into the reorganised establishment under such terms as may be agreed upon by the Commissioners and the Board of Trade, but in no case shall such terms be better than those given to Civil Ser-

vants under similar conditions.

5. The salary of Mr. A. A. Dick at present serving as Superintendent on the establishment of the Commissioners shall be £600 per annum as from the 1st April, 1922.

6. The salary of Miss I. A. Scott at present serving as a Shorthand Typist on the establishment of the Commissioners shall be increased by a special increment of 2s. 6d. a week to 41s. Id. a week as from the 1st January, 1922.

7. The following provisions in respect of

age, examination, appointment and retirement, shall take effect, that is to say:—

- (a) All persons appointed in future to the Executive Shorthand Typist and Typist Grade on the establishment of the Commissioners shall subject to the provisions in paragraph (c) below previously to their appointment pass such examination as may be arranged and such examination shall be held under conditions which are similar to those for candidates sitting for examinations for similar posts in the Civil Service.
- (b) Any Officer who is appointed to a post of a technical character or superior to a higher grade executive post on the reorganised establishment as fixed by this Order may in exceptional cases and with the approval of the Board of Trade be granted a commencing salary exceeding the minimum, but in no case exceeding the maximum salary of such post as fixed by this Order.
- (c) All officers appointed to posts on the reorganised establishment fixed by this Order shall be governed by conditions of service, including promotion and superannuation benefits, similar to those governing Civil Servants of the corresponding grades.
- 8. The salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

To authorize the Corporation upon the lands hereinafter described or some part or parts thereof (being the lands upon which the Gas Works of the Company are situate) to maintain, alter, extend, renew or improve works for the manufacture, storage, conversion, utilisation and distribution of gas and of residual products arising therefrom, and to make and store gas, and to make, store, utilise and distribute all such residual products and materials aforesaid, and upon such lands to construct and maintain houses, buildings and other works. The lands hereinbefore referred to are situate in the parish of Repton, in the Rural District of Repton, in the County of Derby, and are:—

All that piece of land containing an area of one and a quarter acres or thereabouts bounded on the west by the road leading from High Street, Repton, to Bretby, on the north by lands belonging or reputed to belong to Frank Bentley, on the east by the brook flowing from Repton Corn Mill, and on the south by lands belonging or reputed to belong to Jervis Brown.

- 3. To confer further powers upon the Corporation with reference to the purchase and utilisation of residual products arising from the manufacture of gas.

To extend the area for the supply of gas of the Corporation and to enable them to supply gas within the parish of Repton and also within so much of the parish of Newton Solney as is not already included within those limits under the existing enactments relating to the gas undertaking of the Corporation, and to exercise within their limits of supply as so extended all powers, rights, privileges and authorities which they have or may exercise

from time to time within their existing limits of supply.

- 5. To make provision for enabling the Corporation to charge different prices in different portions of their area of supply, and in particular to specify the prices which may be charged by the Corporation—
 - (a) in areas outside the boundaries of the Borough of Burton-upon-Trent but included within the present limits of supply of the Corporation;
 - (b) in the part of the parish of Newton Solney proposed to be included within the limits of supply of the Corporation under the provisions of the intended Order; and
 - (c) in the parish of Repton.
- 6. To make further provision with regard to the supply of gas by the Corporation, and in particular to provide for the following amongst other matters:—To enable the Corporation to lay down pipes in private streets and also to lay down pipes for ancillary gas purposes; to empower the Corporation to vary the price of gas according to the purpose for which such gas is used; to confer powers upon the Corporation with regard to the fixing of gas fittings and appliances and to exempt such fittings from liability to distress or legal proceedings; to empower the Corporation to refuse to supply persons in debt to them; to make provision for the supply of gas to premises having a supply of electricity, gas, etc., from other sources; to make further provision with regard to the method of cutting off supplies of gas; to amend the obligations of the Corporation with regard to the supply of gas in cases where the capacity of the main is insufficient; to empower the Corporation to enter premises and remove fittings, etc., under certain circumstances; to require gas consumers to give notice to the Corporation before removing; to make provision as to the manner of meeting expenses of reconnecting disconnected supplies of gas, to require the giving of notice of intention to discontinue a supply of gas; to require the provision of valves where highpressure air is used; to require the use of antifluctuators for gas engines; to empower the Corporation to take out licences for the use of patents; to enable the Corporation to enter into contracts with respect to the giving or receiving of a supply of gas in bulk and other matters incidental to the foregoing subjects.
- 7. To confer further powers upon the Corporation with regard to the breaking up and interference with streets, roads, highways (whether dedicated to the public use or not), footways, railways, bridges, sewers, drains and other works, within the limits of supply of the Corporation.
- 8. To empower the Corporation to acquire by agreement further lands for and in connection with their gas undertaking; to confer powers upon them with regard to the retention and disposal of lands; to make provision as to the proceeds of sale of surplus lands and to enable the Corporation to purchase or take on lease houses or buildings for persons employed by them, and also offices, showrooms, etc., for the purposes of their gas undertaking, and to erect, fit up and maintain any such buildings, offices, showrooms, etc.
- 9. To authorise the Corporation to borrow or raise money for and in connection with the purchase of the gas undertaking of the Com-

pany and for and in connection with the general purposes of the undertaking of the Corporation, including the laying down of new mains, extensions of mains, and for paying the costs, charges and expenses of the Order; to charge the moneys so borrowed on the District Fund and General District Rate, and the undertakings, estates, rates, rents, revenue and other property of the Corporation or any of such securities and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities; to authorise the Corporation to apply any of their funds or other moneys authorised to be raised to any of the purposes of the Order, and to provide that moneys borrowed under the Order shall not be reckoned in the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875.

- 10. To make provision for the formation, maintenance and application of sinking funds, the method of meeting any deficiencies in the receipts of the gas undertaking of the Corporation, and to make further provision in regard to the borrowing, reborrowing and repayment of money by the Corporation.
- 11. To vary or extinguish all rights, powers and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer other rights, powers and privileges.
- 12. To incorporate with the Order, with or without modification, all or any of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847, the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1871, and the Acts amending those Acts respectively.
- 13. To enact all provisions for giving full effect to the intended Order, and in particular to make provision for the authentication and service of notices, the recovery of penalties and demands, the dealing with several sums in one summons, the service of notices, etc., on local authorities, and the exemption from personal liability of the Corporation and their officers in certain cases.
- 14. To alter, amend, repeal or re-enact and extend to the Order (with or without modification) all or some of the provisions of the Town of Burton-upon-Trent Act, 1853, the Burton-upon-Trent Improvement Act, 1878, the Burton-upon-Trent Corporation Act, 1896, the Burton-upon-Trent Order, 1911, and the Burton-upon-Trent Order, 1913.
