URBAN DISTRICT OF SELBY.

WATER UNDERTAKINGS (MODIFICATION OF CHARGES) ACT, 1921.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Selby, in the West Riding of the County of York, have made application to the Minister of Health, under the above Act, for an Order modifying Sections 15 and 19 of the Selby Urban District Council Act, 1904, which it is proposed to modify, so as to enable them to make charges for water supply for domestic and trade purposes in the water limits within which they are empowered to supply water in accordance with the following scale:—

Houses not exceeding £5 rateable value, 13s. per annum.

Houses exceeding £5 and not exceeding £7 10s. rateable value, 19s. 6d. per annum.

Houses exceeding £7 10s. and not exceeding £10 rateable value, £1 6s. per annum.

Houses exceeding £10 and not exceeding £30 rateable value, £12 per cent. on rateable value.

Houses exceeding £30 rateable value, £10 10s. per cent. on rateable value.

Water by meter for trade purposes, 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

And to modify the agreement dated the 15th day of March, 1909, and made between the Selby Urban District Council of the one part, and the Selby Rural District Council of the other part, so as to enable the Selby Urban District Council to increase the charge of 9d. per 1,000 gallons to 1s. 1½d. per 1,000 gallons.

WEST WILTS ELECTRICITY.

(Supply of Electricity; Laying of Electric Lines; Breaking up Streets, etc.; Maximum Price; Supply for Haulage, etc., beyond Limits of Supply; Transfer of Undertaking and Powers of Order, etc.)

APPLICATION has been made by the Western Electric Distributing Corporation Limited, whose registered office is situate at the Electricity Offices, Cainscross, Stroud, Gloucestershire (hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers"), to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for a Special Order for the following objects:—

1. To authorise the Undertakers to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts within the boroughs of Calne, Chippenham and Devizes, the urban districts of Bradford-on-Avon, Melksham, Trowbridge, and Westbury, and the rural districts of Bradford-on-Avon, Calne, Chippenham, Devizes, Melksham, and Westbury, and Whorwells-down, all in the county of Wilts (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Undertakers to exercise within the area of supply all powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity, and to authorise the exercise of any of those powers with reference to the breaking up of roads and execution of works in any district within the area of supply after the purchase by the local authority of the portion of the undertaking to be authorised by the Undertakers within that district.

3. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for electricity.

4. The streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time are:—

Borough of Calne—

Curzon Street from High Street to lane connecting Curzon Street to High Street; High Street from The Strand to Oxford Road; The Strand; Church Street.

Borough of Chippenham—

High Street; New Road; Malmesbury Road, from New Road to Rectory; Marshfield Road, from New Road to Oak Lodge; Market Place; London Road, from Market Place to Primitive Methodist Chapel.

Borough of Devizes—

Market Place; Northgate Street, from the Canal Bridge to Market Place; St. John's Street; Long Street; Brittox; New Park Street, from Sidmouth Street to Wharf Street; Sheep Street; Sidmouth Street.

Urban District of Bradford-on-Avon—

Silver Street, from Town Bridge to Mill Lane; St. Margaret's Street, from Town Bridge to Almshouses; Market Street, from
