TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th April, 1923, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option

of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th April, 1923, to Saturday, the 21st April, 1923, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

FOUR PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax and will in all respects rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th April, 1923, to Saturday, the 21st April, 1923, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1923, will represent in the case of each

Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England, not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

SACK AND BAG TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES AS VARIED FOR MALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 9th April, 1923, except where otherwise shown.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates (as varied) shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 15th April, 1923.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES.

- I. Certain Special Classes of Male Workers of 21 years of age and over (see Section I of Part I of the Schedule below), 1s. 2d. per hour.
- II. All other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over, 11½d. per hour.
- III. Male Workers under 21 years of age. (See Section II of Part I of the Schedule below.)

Provided that all male workers of the classes specified in this Section entering the Trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years may be employed for a period not exceeding two months at a General Minimum Time-Rate which is less by ½d. per hour than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable under the provisions of this Section.

*NOTE.—These rates, which remain unchanged, have been effective as from 1st September, 1922.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE TO BE as follows:—

IN ANY WEEK	48
ON ANY DAY (OTHER THAN SATURDAY)	9
ON SATURDAY	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sunday and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a male worker EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work shall be as follows:—

(1) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME - AND - A-QUARTER.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half

times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

NOTE.—The hours which Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts; the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920; and the Education Acts, 1918 and 1921.

PART III.

The respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Sack and Bag) Order, 1920, and set out in Part IV of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice S.B. (5), dated 28th July, 1922.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

NOTE.—In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work

SCHEDULE—PART I.—*continued.*

Basis Time-Rate to an ORDINARY Worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

For the purpose of the above Rates the following definitions apply :—

BRAZIERS :

A Brazier of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on brazing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Brazier of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Brazier and who is employed in brazing all classes of metal except aluminium.

A Brazier of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is also employed in brazing aluminium OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

BURNISHERS :

A Burnisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on burnishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Burnisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Burnisher and who is employed as a hook and straight Burnisher at the vice and satisfactorily burnishes deep thin shell work at the lathe.

A Burnisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is an expert in speed and quality in all classes of work OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

DROP-STAMPERS :

A Drop-Stamper of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on drop-stamping and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Drop Stamper of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Drop-Stamper and who is employed on all classes of deep or shallow work.

A Drop-Stamper of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is an expert in all classes of work OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

DIPPERS who are also BRONZERS :

A Worker of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on dipping and bronzing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Worker of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Dipper and Bronzer who is employed in dipping or bronzing or on art bronzing and colouring, or electro-plating.

A Worker of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, also has an expert knowledge of art bronzing or metal colouring or electro depositing and solutions OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

POLISHERS :

A Polisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on polishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Polisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Polisher and is employed in any process of any class of common work and who emery-bobs or mops.

A Polisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is also an expert in all processes of both common or best work OR is a charge hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

PART II.**OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED, FOR MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).**

In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows :—

In any week	47
On Saturday	4½

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piece-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows :—

- (a) For all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, **DOUBLE-TIME**.

SCHEDULE.—PART II.—*continued.*

- (b) For all hours worked in excess of four-and-a-half on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.
- (c) For all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the first two hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

PART III.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all MALE WORKERS who are employed as Braziers, Burnishers, Drop-Stampers, Dippers, Dippers who are also Bronzers, or as Annealers or Polishers, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919.

The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or hand-bags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles;

INCLUDING:—

- (a) The operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non vitreous enamelling, tinning or assembling, where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;
- (b) The operations of carding, boxing, packeting, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

BUT EXCLUDING:—

- (a) The operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;
- (b) The making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;
- (c) The making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;
- (d) The making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair curlers, snap fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;
- (e) The making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;
- (f) The minting of coinage of the realm;
- (g) The process of hand embossing.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactment, or deductions authorised by any act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other Provident Fund.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated respectively 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the Branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 27th August, 1920, with respect to the General Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Male Workers under 21 years of age, the proposed Minimum Rates being as shewn in the Schedule below.

PAYMENT OF HALF-YEARLY INCREASES.

SECTION II.—In the case of workers of 14½ years of age and under 21 years of age the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age specified in Section I shall only become payable on the first pay day in January or July, as the case may be, which corresponds with or immediately follows the date on which the worker attains such age. Until such time the rate payable shall be that applicable to a worker of the next lower age group.

SECTION II.—In the case of Male Workers under 21 years of age employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, at least the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, to an ORDINARY WORKER, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES FOR ALL MALE WORKERS UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the proposed minimum rates of wages specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule of the Notice D. B. (7) issued by the Trade Board and dated 30th January, 1923, shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked by male workers under 21 years of age in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part III of the Schedule of the above mentioned Notice D. B. (7) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The proposed minimum rates of wages, specified in this Schedule, shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers under 21 years of age in Great Britain, in respect of all time during which they are employed in the General Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade Board, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 27th August, 1920, and set out in Part IV. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice D.B. (7), dated 30th January, 1923.

Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this Notice the above Proposed Minimum Rates shall NOT apply to Male Workers who are engaged in the loading of discharging of water-borne craft in any Section of the Trade.

SECTION II.—THE ABOVE PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES ARE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO WORKERS WHO ARE EARNING HIGHER RATES OF WAGES, OR TO AGREEMENTS MADE OR THAT MAY BE MADE FOR THE PAYMENT OF WAGES IN EXCESS OF THE MINIMUM RATES.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO FIX which may be lodged with them within two months from the 6th April, 1923. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, General Waste Materials Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His

Majesty's Treasury, and will come into force on the 1st May, 1923, viz.:—

GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING APPOINTMENT TO HIS MAJESTY'S CIVIL ESTABLISHMENTS UNDER THE ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 22ND JULY, 1920.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration at any time.

Whereas by Order in Council (hereinafter referred to as a "Principal Order") dated 22nd July, 1920, it is provided that (subject to the exception therein mentioned) the qualifications of all persons proposed to be appointed whether permanently or temporarily to any situation or employment in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments, shall before they are appointed be approved by the Civil Service Commissioners, and no person shall be so appointed until a certificate of his qualification has been issued by the Commissioners;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 4 of the Principal Order that the Commissioners may, subject to the approval of the Treasury, make regulations prescribing the manner in which persons are to be admitted to His Majesty's Civil Establishments or to any situation or class of situations therein, and the conditions on which the Commissioners may issue certificates of qualification for the purposes of the Principal Order;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 8 of the Principal Order that Articles 2 and 10 of the Consolidated Order in Council dated 10th January, 1910, shall be repealed as from the date on which the Principal Order came into operation, and that the other provisions of the Orders recited in the Principal Order should be repealed as from the date on which regulations are made under the Principal Order repealing or re-enacting with or without modifications those provisions;

Now, therefore, the Civil Service Commissioners with the approval of the Treasury make the following regulations.

These regulations prescribe the conditions on which the Commissioners may issue certificates of qualification for admission to any situation or employment in His Majesty's Civil Establishments. These regulations are General Regulations applicable to both sexes and all situations. Words importing the masculine gender or the male sex in these Regulations denote either sex unless exception be made in the context.

Age.

1. Every candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners that he is within the limits of age (if any) already prescribed or hereafter in due form prescribed for the situation or employment to which he desires to be admitted. From the actual age of the candidate such deduction shall be made on account of military service, civil service, or otherwise, as is laid down in regulations for the situation or class or group of situations to which he desires to be admitted.

2. If no limit of age is prescribed by Regulations for the situation or class or group of situations concerned, the candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners that his age is suitable to the duties of the post which he seeks; but no person not already holding an established post shall be appointed to an established situation at an age exceeding 50 without the consent of the Treasury.

3. On the application of the Head of a Department and with the approval of the Treasury, the Commissioners may, if they are satisfied that there is due and sufficient cause, extend the upper prescribed limit of age for any candidate, except in an open competition.

Health.

4. Subject to the provisos appended to this clause every candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners that he is free from any physical defect or disease that would be likely to interfere with the proper discharge of his duties.

Provided that where an officer holding a pensionable situation in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments is nominated by the Head of a Department for the issue of a certificate of qualification in respect of his promotion in the same Department, or of his transfer to another Department, the Commissioners may, at their discretion, if they see fit, grant their certificate of qualification on being satisfied that he is fully qualified in respect of age, character, knowledge and ability, without requiring evidence as to freedom from physical defect or disease, provided they are satisfied that the situation to which he is promoted or transferred does not require a higher degree of physical capacity than the situation which he already holds.

Provided also that in the case of persons whose health has been impaired by reason of service in His Majesty's Forces during the Great War, the Commissioners may on the conditions and in the manner prescribed by the Order in Council of 22nd March, 1918, issue modified (War) Certificates and Special Recommendations which shall have effect as laid down in that Order and as if that Order had been part of the Regulations now made under the Order of 22nd July, 1920.

Character.

5. Every candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners that his character is such as to qualify him for the situation or employment which he seeks.

Knowledge and Ability.

6. Every candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners that he is qualified in respect of knowledge and ability to discharge the duties of the situation which he seeks.

7. The tests shall be such as are prescribed by the regulations (if any) for the situation or group of situations to which the candidate desires to be admitted.

The normal method of entry will be by means of competitive examinations, according to regulations framed or to be from time to time framed by the Civil Service Commissioners, and approved by the Treasury, open to all persons of the requisite age, health, character, and other qualifications prescribed in the said regulations who may be desirous of attending the same upon application made at the time and in the manner prescribed and subject to the payment of the fees from time to time prescribed. Such examinations shall be held at such periods, and for such situations or groups of situations, as the Commissioners with the approval of the Treasury, shall from time to time determine.

8. Where in exceptional cases no regulations have been made prescribing tests for the situation in question, the candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners in such manner as (having

regard to the nature of the duties to be performed) they in their discretion may require of his fitness in respect of knowledge and ability for the duties of the post that he is seeking.

9. Where tests are prescribed for any situation, the regulations will lay down whether they shall be qualifying tests of candidates nominated by the Head of a Department, or competitive tests, and if competitive whether among candidates nominated by the Head of a Department or open to all persons who satisfy the conditions prescribed, and whether by examination or by examination and interview or by interview or otherwise.

10. The Commissioners may, if they think fit, dispense wholly or partly with any examination, competitive or qualifying, prescribed for any situation or groups of situations if one or other of the following conditions be fulfilled:—

(a) That the Head of the Department and the Treasury consider after inquiry in the Civil Service that for a particular situation qualifications wholly or in part professional, or otherwise peculiar and not ordinarily to be acquired in the Civil Service, are required. The relevant particulars of every such case shall be published in the London Gazette and included in the Annual Report of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) That the candidate or group of candidates concerned having been employed in a quasi-permanent capacity on work which has proved to be of a permanent character, and having given throughout a sufficient period of trial proof of fitness to perform the duties required, are put forward with the approval of the Treasury by the Head of the Department for establishment.

(c) That it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Treasury and the Commissioners that the transfer or promotion of an established Civil Servant from one post to another not in customary course of promotion is desirable in the interests of the public service.

In every case falling within any of the classes (a), (b), (c), the Commissioners shall require such evidence as they think desirable to satisfy them of the fitness of the candidate in respect of knowledge and ability.

(d) That the Head of the Department has satisfied the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners that the admission of a particular candidate to a specified situation is for special and exceptional reasons justified by the needs of the public service and the proved merit of the individual. The relevant particulars of every such case shall be published in the London Gazette and included in the Annual Report of the Civil Service Commissioners.

Reinstatement and Reduction.

11. In any case in which the Head of a Department with the approval of the Treasury nominates a candidate for reinstatement in the Civil Service or for appointment to a situation inferior to that which he already holds the Commissioners may dispense with any further test of knowledge and ability.

Nationality.

12. Every candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners that he or she is a natural-born British subject and the son or daughter of a

father also a natural-born British subject. Provided that exception may be made—

(a) In the case of candidates who are serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of persons who, being British subjects, and having served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, are serving and have served for not less than six months in unestablished uncertificated employment which in normal course, by departmental custom or by the grant of establishment to an unestablished class, confers a claim to nomination singly or by limited competition for established and certificated appointment and are nominated for that established and certificated appointment.

(c) In the case of persons serving in unestablished uncertificated employment which in normal course, by departmental custom or by the grant of establishment to an unestablished class, confers a claim to nomination singly or by limited competition for established and certificated appointment; who are nominated for that established and certificated appointment, and who satisfy the rule in respect of nationality for established appointment which was in force when their unestablished service began, and

(d) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

A candidate will not be eligible for assignment or appointment to the Foreign Office or services under the control of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs unless he is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those Territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs of this regulation he may be admitted to appointment or competition by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

Fees.

13. Candidates shall pay fees in such manner at such times and in such amounts as the Commissioners with the approval of the Treasury have prescribed or shall from time to time prescribe in regulations or other notice published in the London Gazette.

The Commissioners may, with the like approval, exempt from the payment of fees such classes of persons as they may think fit to exempt. Every such exemption shall be published in the London Gazette.

The Commissioners, with the like approval, may, by notice in the London Gazette, cancel any preceding notice therein, or any part thereof, and may, by such or by any further notice, vary the amount of the fees to be paid by persons attending examinations held by them, or the manner, or the time, of paying such fees, or the classes of persons required to pay them, or exempted from paying them.

Repeal.

14. Articles 3, 4, 5, 7, 9 and 11 of the Consolidated Order in Council of the 10th

January, 1910, and the associated Orders in Council of the 22nd March, 1918, 23rd October, 1918, 18th December, 1918, and 9th December, 1919, are hereby repealed.

Provided that all Regulations and rules for the admission of candidates to situations in the Civil Service made by the Commissioners under the Order in Council of 10th January, 1910, or under other Orders and still in force, are hereby confirmed, and shall remain in force until fresh or amended regulations or rules are made by the Commissioners under the Orders in Council of 22nd July, 1920, or one of them.

Note as to procedure for settling Regulations for particular situations, classes of situations, or groups of situations.

Subject in both cases to the provisos in Clause 2 of the Principal Order above mentioned,

(a) Regulations as to conditions of entry into any situation, class of situations, or group of situations, peculiar to one Department, will be agreed between the Head of the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners and submitted to the Treasury for their approval.

(b) Regulations as to conditions of entry to any class of situations or group of situations common to two or more Departments will be framed by the Civil Service Commissioners and submitted to the Treasury for their approval.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD APRIL 1923.)

NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK (FOOT-AND-
MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area Affected.

1.—(1) This Order applies to the Area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the Area is referred to as the Prohibited Area.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of or within Prohibited Area.

2. (a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Area is prohibited, except as provided in the next following Article; provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(b) The movement of any such animal along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Area is prohibited.

(c) No such animals shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Area.

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in that Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

(iii) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

4.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

5.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923.
