APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, William Thomas Francis Horwood, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby appoint a Standing for Eight Hackney Carriages at Ferry Road, Barnes, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

On north side of roadway, commencing at a point opposite the side entrance to No. 1, Castlenau, extending westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for eight carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the east.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
