

The Orders of the Minister, dated the twelfth day of March and the seventeenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, defining the said premises as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of two Barbary Sheep and three Deer, respectively, shall not apply to the movement into the said premises of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Regulations applicable to the Animals on Landing.

3.—(1) The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days, and during such period no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animals shall not be moved out of the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station defined in this Order until the expiration of the prescribed period of detention and until the animals, after such expiration, have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and declared by him to be free from disease and from the conditions imposed by the said Order of 1896 and this Order.

This condition is substituted for the fifth condition in Article 3 of the said Order of 1896 in respect of the said animals.
