WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of April, 1923 (C.W.11741/21), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 26th day of October, 1914, and the 29th day of January, 1923, to provide that the rank of Lieutenant-Commander or its equivalent should be extended to Officers of certain classes on the Retired and Emergency Lists who were retired from the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant and have attained or may attain eight years' seniority therein, these classes including certain of the Warrant Officer classes in Your Majesty's Navy:

“And whereas we are of opinion that advancement to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant-Commander on the Retired List

should be extended to all Warrant Officer classes under similar conditions:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to give authority for all Officers retired from the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant in Warrant Officer Branches which are not provided for in Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 26th day of October, 1914, and the 29th day of January, 1923, or in which the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant on the Active List may be established in future, to be advanced at our discretion to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant-Commander on attaining eight years' seniority in the rank of Lieutenant or its equivalent.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section six of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's Dominions other than the Irish Free State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State and make such provision with respect to the management of the National Debt and Government Securities and Annuities (including India Stock) as may be necessary to secure that the management thereof shall not, except to such extent as may be authorized by the Order, be transacted within the Irish Free State, or to enable the business of the Bank of Ireland in relation thereto to be partly transacted at an office of the Bank in Northern Ireland and in the latter case to apply in respect of any securities or annuities inscribed or registered in the books and registers kept at such office the provisions applicable in respect of securities and annuities inscribed or registered in the books and registers kept at the Bank of England or the Bank of Ireland, and that any such Order in Council may contain such supplemental consequential and incidental provisions as may appear necessary or proper for the purposes of the Order:

And whereas it is provided by Article 2 of the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, that subject to the provisions of that Order and of any subsequent Order in Council made under Section six of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, references in any enactment passed before the establishment of the Irish Free State to "the United Kingdom" or "the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland" or "Great Britain and Ireland" or "Great Britain or Ireland" or "the British Islands" or "Ireland" shall, in the application of the enactment to any part of Great Britain and Ireland other than the Irish Free State, be construed as exclusive of the Irish Free State (except as regards the enactments mentioned in the schedule to that Order to the extent specified therein); subject to the proviso that nothing in the said Article shall apply to any enactment so as to affect the liability to, or the assessment or collection of, any tax or duty the liability whereof, or the assessment or collection whereof, is regulated by Section two of the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922:

And whereas no arrangement has been made under sub-section (2) of the said Section two of the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, for an extension of the provisions of that Section so as to regulate the liability to or the assessment or collection of any tax or duty payable in respect of the financial year commencing, as respects Income Tax (including Super-tax), on the 6th day of April, 1923, and, as respects other taxes and duties, on the 1st day of April, 1923, or in respect of any period ending within that year or payable on any occasion happening within that year:

And whereas provision is made by the Bank of Ireland (Belfast Register) Order, 1923, for

the business of the Bank of Ireland in relation to the management of the National Debt and Government Securities and Annuities (including India Stock) to be partly transacted at the principal office of the Bank of Ireland in Belfast:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Taxing Acts) Order, 1923, and shall be deemed to have come into operation as from the commencement of the current financial year.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

The expression "financial year" means as respects income tax (including super-tax) the year commencing on the sixth day of April, and as respects other taxes the year commencing on the first day of April.

The expression "Government stock" means stock, bonds, and annuities transferable in the books of the Bank of Ireland under the National Debt Act, 1870, as amended by any subsequent enactment, the Government Annuities Acts, 1829 to 1888, or the India Stock Transfer Act, 1862, or transferable by deed under section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1911, or section six of the Government of India (Amendment) Act, 1916.

The expression "dividends" includes interest, annuities, and shares of annuities.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) For the purpose of any enactment relating to taxation, the identity of a tax shall not be affected by reason only of the establishment of the Irish Free State or any changes in the area of taxation or other changes consequent thereon.

(2) Any enactment providing in relation to any tax as continued or renewed in a subsequent year for the continuance of any enactments in force with respect to such tax in the previous year shall, notwithstanding anything contained in the proviso to Article 2 of the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, hereinbefore recited, be construed as continuing those enactments as adapted and modified by that Order and by this Order.

3. If an arrangement is made between the Commissioners of Inland Revenue and the Revenue Commissioners of the Irish Free State for the interchange of information necessary for the purpose of determining the liability of any person to any tax or the title of any person to repayment or allowance of any tax the liability whereof or the assessment or collection whereof is regulated by Section 2 of the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, the obligation as to secrecy imposed by the Income Tax Acts or any other Act upon persons employed in relation to Inland Revenue shall not prevent the disclosure of such information to the authorized officer of the Government of the Irish Free State.

4. In the application to Northern Ireland of sub-section (1) of Section 191 of the Income Tax Act, 1918, for the words "at the head office of the said Commissioners in Dublin"

there shall be substituted the words " at such office of the said Commissioners as those Commissioners may direct."

5. The management of the National Debt and Government Securities and Annuities (including India Stock), so far as it involves the assessment to Income Tax of dividends and the setting apart and retention of the amount of the tax, shall not be transacted in the Irish Free State, and as a consequence thereof the following provisions shall have effect:—

(a) The powers conferred by Section sixty-eight of the Income Tax Act, 1918, on the Governor and directors of the Bank of Ireland in relation to dividends payable to that Bank and to dividends intrusted to that Bank for payment shall in relation to dividends payable to that Bank and to dividends on Government Stock (other than India Stock) inscribed or registered in the books of the Bank of Ireland in Dublin be exercised by the Governor and directors of the Bank of England instead of by the Governor and directors of the Bank of Ireland.

(b) The money issuable to the Bank of Ireland under section fourteen of the National Debt Act, 1870, or otherwise payable to the said Bank for the purpose of dividends on Government Stock (other than India Stock), except so far as it represents dividends payable by that Bank at its principal office in Belfast shall be issued and paid to the Bank of England.

(c) The Bank of England shall set apart and retain out of money so issued and paid to them the amount of the Income Tax on the dividends payable to the Bank of Ireland and on the dividends on the said Government Stock inscribed or registered in the books of the Bank of Ireland in Dublin and shall deal with the amount of the tax so set apart and retained as if it were tax in respect of dividends intrusted to them for payment.

(d) Such retention shall have the same effect as if the amount of the tax had been retained by the Bank of Ireland.

(e) The Bank of England shall pay to the Bank of Ireland the residue of the money so issued and paid to them to be applied by the Bank of Ireland to the payment of the dividends.

(f) In Schedule C to the Income Tax Act, 1918, the expression " United Kingdom " where it first occurs in the General Rules applicable to that Schedule, shall, notwithstanding anything in the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, be construed, in relation to the dividends on the said Government Stock registered or inscribed in the books of the Bank of Ireland in Dublin, as including the Irish Free State.

6. The powers conferred by Section sixty-eight of the Income Tax Act, 1918, on the Governor and directors of the Bank of Ireland in relation to dividends intrusted to that Bank for payment shall in relation to dividends on Government Stock inscribed or registered in the books of the Bank of Ireland at their principal office in Belfast be no longer exercised by the Governor and directors of the Bank of Ireland, but shall be exercised by such of the officers appointed by the Bank of Ireland under the Bank of Ireland (Belfast Register)

Order, 1923, for the management of the said stock as the Treasury may nominate.

7. Subject to the provisions of Articles 5 and 6 of this Order, section sixty-eight of the Income Tax Act, 1918, shall be construed as containing no reference to the Bank of Ireland.

8. (1) In the proviso to sub-section (2) of section fifty-two of the Finance Act, 1920, and in section fifty-seven of the Finance Act, 1921, the expression " United Kingdom " shall, notwithstanding anything in the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, be construed as including the Irish Free State.

(2) For the purposes of Corporation Profits Tax in the case of a company incorporated by or under the laws of or carrying on any trade or business partly or wholly within the Irish Free State, the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may, if they think fit, where part of an accounting period is after and part before the beginning of the first day of April, 1923, apportion the total profits of the accounting period between the period up to and the period beginning on that date in proportion to the respective lengths of those periods, and the last-mentioned periods shall thereupon be deemed to be accounting periods.

Any apportionment under this paragraph of this Article shall be made in proportion to the number of months or fractions of months in the respective periods representing the divided period.

9. Nothing in this Order shall affect the construction of any enactment so far as it applies to any tax leviable by the Government of the Irish Free State.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, shall apply to the British Protectorates hereunder mentioned:—

The Protectorate of Kenya.

The Protectorate of Sierra Leone.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the making, registration, confirmation or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any maintenance order as defined in sections 10 and 11 of the said Act.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Devonshire, K.G., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 25th day of January, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Newton Poppleford to part of the neighbouring Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Harpford with Venn Ottery and the union of the residue of the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery to the contiguous Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tipton Saint John, all which

Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Newton Poppleford with a portion of the said United Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery and further to inquire into and report upon an union of the said Benefice of Tipton Saint John with the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the severance of the Benefice of Venn Ottery from the said United Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery and the union of the said Benefice of Venn Ottery so severed with the contiguous Benefice of Tipton Saint John and therein further recommended the union of the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery that is to say the Benefice of Harpford with the neighbouring Benefice of Newton Poppleford and the terms for effecting the said two unions and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for effecting the two unions of Benefices so recommended as aforesaid which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas each of the said Benefices of Newton Poppleford, Harpford with Venn Ottery and Tipton Saint John is now full, the Reverend William Kendall Stuart being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newton Poppleford, the Reverend Douglas Hodgson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery and the Reverend George Every being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tipton Saint John:

"And whereas there is at present no Parsonage House standing within or belonging to either of the said Benefices of Tipton Saint John and Venn Ottery:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That a portion of the said United Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery, that is to say, the Benefice of Venn Ottery, shall be severed from the said United Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery and the Benefice of Venn Ottery so severed and the said Benefice of Tipton Saint John shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Tipton Saint John with Venn Ottery' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices of Tipton Saint John and Venn Ottery shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

"2. That the church of the Parish of Tipton Saint John shall be the Parish church of the United Benefice of Tipton Saint John with Venn Ottery and that the Table of Fees for

the said Parish of Tipton Saint John shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish of Tipton Saint John with Venn Ottery.

"3. That the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery after the severance of such portion as aforesaid and the said Benefice of Newton Poppleford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Newton Poppleford with Harpford' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Newton Poppleford and Harpford shall continue distinct in all respects.

"4. That with the consents of the said William Kendall Stuart and George Every (testified by their signing this Scheme) the union (a) of the said Benefices of Newton Poppleford and Harpford and the union (b) of the said Benefices of Tipton Saint John and Venn Ottery shall, if upon the day of the date of the publication of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery be then vacant, take effect forthwith, but that if upon that day the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery be not vacant then the said unions shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery.

"5. That upon the said unions taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Venn Ottery shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Tipton Saint John with Venn Ottery to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

"6. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newton Poppleford shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Newton Poppleford with Harpford.

"7. That upon the said unions taking effect all the glebe situate within the Parish of Harpford and all the Tithe Rent-charges arising within the said Parish of Harpford being part of the endowments at present belonging to the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery and all capital sums of money and stocks representing or being the produce of the sale, redemption or other conversion of any part or parts of the said glebe or Tithe Rentcharges shall become and be part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Newton Poppleford with Harpford and all the other endowments of the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery shall become and be part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Tipton Saint John with Venn Ottery.

"8. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Newton Poppleford with Harpford from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Newton Poppleford and Harpford with Venn Ottery alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Newton Poppleford having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery having the right of presentation upon

the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter and (b) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Tipton Saint John with Venn Ottery shall be as follows that is to say that in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination for ever thereafter the Patron of the said Benefice of Tipton Saint John shall have the first and third turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Harpford with Venn Ottery shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the Scheme or any part thereof within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas none of the Benefices affected by the said Scheme are situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION (PETER DUFFUS MILNE).

Whereas Peter Duffus Milne, of 9, Countesswells Road, and 39, Market Street, Aberdeen, being a person duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920:

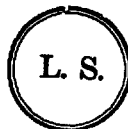
