“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of August, 1897, it was provided that Charles Herbert McKay, Pensioned Chief Writer, retained on the books of Your Majesty's Ship ‘Vernon’ in the special rating of Confidential Clerk and Keeper of Torpedo Records, should receive his Chief Writer's pen-

sion in addition to pay on a special scale, and by His late Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of December, 1906, his scale of pay was extended to a maximum of 13s. a day by annual increments of 6d. a day, the first such increment accruing to his former maximum of 10s. a day as from the 9th day of March, 1907:

“And whereas it was further provided by Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of August, 1897, that Mr. McKay's service after being pensioned should not reckon for Civil Pension or for any increase of Naval Pension, and by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of February, 1912, which granted him the relative rank of Lieutenant, it was also provided that the bestowal of such rank should not entitle him to any increase of pay or pension but only to the usual advantages as regards widow's pension and compassionate allowances, which would be at the rates applicable in the case of Lieutenants:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of December, 1915, to approve of Mr. McKay being granted, on retirement, an addition at the rate of £10 per annum for each year's service from the 1st day of November, 1915, to his existing pension of £40 6s. 0d. per annum, subject to the proviso that he should

receive a pension of not less than £80 per annum:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the financial conditions which have obtained since the termination of hostilities call for an increase in the pay and pension sanctioned for Mr. McKay:

"And whereas Mr. McKay vacated his appointment in H.M.S. 'Vernon' on 30th October, 1922, and reverted to the pension list:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to pay Mr. McKay at the special and inclusive rate of Full Pay of 25s. a day from the 1st February, 1919, until 30th October, 1923, in addition to his pension, and further, to grant him as from the date of reverting to the pension list on relinquishing his duties an addition to his pension as a rating of £15 a year, instead of £10 a year as formerly authorized, for each complete year's service after the 1st November, 1915, 20 per cent. of the additional retiring allowance thus granted over and above his former pension as a Chief Writer being regarded as in respect of the increased cost of living and being subject to review, on or after the 1st July, 1924.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas a Petition has been presented to His Majesty in Council by the County Council of the Administrative County of Wilts praying that the Second or Middle Wilts Coroner's District shall cease to be a separate Coroner's District and that the Parishes in the Warminster Union now included in the said Middle Wilts Coroner's District be added to and included in the Third or South Wilts Coroner's District and that the remaining Parishes now included in the Second or Middle Wilts Coroner's District be added to and included in the First or North Wilts Coroner's District and that henceforth the said Third or South Wilts Coroner's District be known as the Second or South Wilts Coroner's District:

And whereas the said Petition with the reasons on which it is founded has been duly certified to His Majesty:

And whereas all the provisions in that behalf of the Coroners Act, 1844, have been complied with:

And whereas the Coroners for the said County have not presented any Petition to His Majesty concerning the proposed alterations:

And whereas His Majesty has, with the advice of His Privy Council, taken into consideration the said Petition and is minded to make such alterations as are hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, direct and declare, and it is hereby ordered, directed and declared, that:—

1. From the commencement of this Order the division heretofore made of the County of Wilts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the Coroners Act, 1844, shall be altered as follows, that is to say:—

(a) The First or North Wilts Coroner's District shall comprise the areas mentioned in Part I of the Schedule to this Order.

(b) The Second or Mid Wilts Coroner's District shall cease to be a separate Coroner's District.

(c) The Third or South Wilts Coroner's District shall be henceforth known as the Second or South Wilts Coroner's District.

(d) The said Second or South Wilts Coroner's District shall comprise the areas mentioned in Part II of the Schedule to this Order.

(e) For the purpose of defining the area of the said Coroners' Districts, any area mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall mean the Borough, Urban or Rural District, or Parish, as the case may be, as constituted and bounded on the 1st day of January, 1923.

2. This Order shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1923.

And whereas it is expedient to extend the duration of the said Council from and after the 9th day of May, 1923, as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as The Southern Rhodesia (Legislative Council Extension) Order in Council, 1923.

2. Notwithstanding anything in the Southern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1898, or in any Order in Council amending the same, or in any laws for the time being in force in Southern Rhodesia with respect to the election of Members of the Legislative Council or otherwise concerning the Legislative Council, the duration of the Seventh Legislative Council of Southern Rhodesia, unless sooner dissolved, is hereby extended for a period of six months from and after the 9th day of May, 1923.

3. This Order shall come into operation forthwith, and shall be published in the Gazette, and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

4. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage

be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect":

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, certified to His Majesty in Council, by his Report dated the 25th day of November, 1922, as follows:—

"The undersigned Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, doth in pursuance of the twenty-sixth Section of the Act passed in a Session of Parliament held in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That there is in the County and Diocese of York the Vicarage of Wetwang the Parish whereof comprises amongst other places the ancient Chapelry of Fimber the boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That according to the last Census the population of the said parish of Wetwang exclusive of the said Chapelry amounts to 300 people and that of the said Chapelry to 110.

"That there is in the said Chapelry an ancient Chapel to which the Inhabitants of the said Chapelry have for a long series of years been accustomed to resort.

"That the said Chapelry is situated at a distance of three miles from the Church of the said Parish of Wetwang.

"That there is in the said County and Diocese of York the Vicarage of Fridaythorpe the Parish whereof lies at a distance of one and a half miles from the said Chapelry of Fimber.

"That the Church of the said Parish of Fridaythorpe is with the Chapel of Fimber capable of affording accommodation to the inhabitants of the said Parish of Fridaythorpe and of the said Chapelry of Fimber.

"That it does not appear that any of the inhabitants or land owners of Fimber possess any legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews and sittings in the Parish Church of Wetwang or that any of the inhabitants or land owners of the said Parish of Wetwang possess any legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the Chapel of Fimber.

"That I the Archbishop aforesaid am the Patron as well of the said Vicarage of Wetwang with the said Chapelry of Fimber annexed as of the said Vicarage of Fridaythorpe, and the Reverend Albert Edward Baker, Clerk, M.A., is the Vicar of the said Vicarage of Wetwang with the said Chapelry annexed, and the Reverend Bernard Scott Cockin, M.A., is the Vicar of the said Vicarage of Fridaythorpe.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Acts passed in the Sessions of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, and of the second and third years of the reign of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 49, the said Chapelry of Fimber may be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage and Parish of Wetwang and be united to the said Vicarage and Parish of Fridaythorpe for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said first mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme he doth by this report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty together with the consent in writing to the said scheme of the said Archbishop as Patron of the said two Benefices and of the respective Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the consents of the Patron and Incumbents of the said Benefices respectively are as follows:—

"Scheme.

"1. That the said Chapelry of Fimber shall be separated from the said Parish and Parish Church of Wetwang and for ecclesiastical purposes be united to and deemed part and parcel of the said Vicarage and Parish of Fridaythorpe.

"2. That the said Chapelry of Fimber shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said Parish of Fridaythorpe and the Incumbent of Fridaythorpe shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the said Chapelry.

"3. That all the fees and payments for churchings burials marriages and other

ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within or in respect of the said Chapelry and of other ecclesiastical dues, offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said Chapelry shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Fridaythorpe.

"4. That the inhabitants of the said Chapelry shall not be entitled to accommodation in the said Church of Wetwang nor shall the parishioners of the said Parish of Wetwang be entitled to accommodation in the said Chapel of Fimber.

"5. That no change shall be made in regard to the Glebe lands Tithe rent charges or other endowments of the said Vicarage of Wetwang, except that with the consent of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England there shall be transferred to the said Vicarage of Fridaythorpe as an addition to the endowments of the Benefice the annual sum of £109 which under the authority of two Orders in Council respectively dated the 28th day of April, 1863, and the 9th day of May, 1866, was granted by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the said Vicarage of Wetwang-cum-Fimber to be paid to the Incumbent thereof conditionally upon the employment of an Assistant Curate in that Parish.

"6. That the Inhabitants of the said Parishes of Wetwang and Fridaythorpe and of the said Chapelry of Fimber shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repair and maintenance of the Churches in the said Parish and of the Chapel in the said Chapelry as heretofore.

" Given under the hand of the said Archbishop the 25th day of November, 1922.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Radcliffe, in the County of Lancaster, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Township of Radcliffe, in the County of Lancaster, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz. :—

RADCLIFFE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of St. Thomas, Radcliffe, and in the Churchyard attached thereto. Provided that

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, and in which the bodies of not more than three persons have been buried at the date of this Order, the burial may be allowed of the body of the widow or widower of a person heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 28th May next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 28th day of May.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

FEMALE LEARNERS.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages effective for Female Learners:—

SECTION I.—A FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who—

- (a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade specified in Part IV of this Schedule by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

- (b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

If the conditions set out above are not complied with the minimum rate of wages payable to a female worker irrespective of her age and experience is that applicable to female workers other than learners.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages effective for female Learners are subject to the following provisions affecting (a) The payment of Advances and (b) the termination of the period of Learnership.

- (a) The advances to be given to learners shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the learner being entitled to her first advance as from the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

- (b) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to workers other than learners, upon the fulfilment of the following conditions :—

Age of entering upon employment.	Conditions.
14 and under 16 years of age	The completion of not less than two years' employment and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
16 years of age and over	The completion of two years' employment.

No female learner shall be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate for workers other than learners until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had.

In determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

PART II.

HOME WORKERS.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages :—

A "HOMEWORKER" is a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART III.

PROVISIONS AS TO OVERTIME RATES.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows :—

In any week	48

On Saturday	5

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be 5, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be 9.

Provided also that all time worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Overtime in respect of all time worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be calculated as follows :—

(a) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK :

- For the first two hours of overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, **TIME-AND-A-QUARTER**.
- For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays or the weekly short day substituted therefor, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, **TIME-AND-A-HALF**.
- For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the

Overtime Rate shall be twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, DOUBLE-TIME.

4. For all time worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary, Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds 9 or, in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), exceeds 5, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(b) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK :

Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of all overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to one-quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, one-half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section if the worker has been employed on Time-Work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE-TIME respectively.

SECTION III.—Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part, in the application of the Overtime Rates the following provisions shall apply :—

- (a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.
- (b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall only be payable after 50 hours have been worked.
- (c) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

PART IV.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the Minimum Rates of Wages effective under these Acts in the Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Trade apply to all Male and Female Workers (other than those specified in Section II of this Part) in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order, 1920.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages effective shall not apply to Male Workers employed as Dyers in the Feather Trade.

SECTION III.—The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows :—

1. The preparation throughout of ostrich or fancy feathers from the natural condition to the finished feather product.
2. The making of artificial flowers, fruit, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods from paper, wax, textile materials, porcelain, glass, plaster, metal composition, rubber, leather, raffia, celiphane and similar materials.
3. The preservation of natural flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses, ferns, seeds or pods.
4. The making of hats of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2, and 3 above, when made in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.
5. The making of feather garments (including neckwear and muffs), feather trimmings for dresses, feather fans or feather mountings of any description; when made in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the preparation of ostrich or fancy feathers.
6. The cleaning, dyeing or renovating of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when carried on as a main business or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.

Including :—

7. (a) Any of the following and similar operations or processes known in the trade as :—

- (i) The sorting, stringing, washing, bleaching, dyeing, beating, scraping, laying up, sewing, curling, finishing, sticking, twisting, mounting of ostrich or fancy feathers.
 - (ii) Pattern-making, dyeing, stiffening, waterproofing, waxing, cutting, stamping, shading, veining, goffing, mould making, mounting, in connection with the manufacture of artificial flowers, fruits, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods.
 - (iii) The dyeing, preserving, painting, varnishing, or decorating of natural flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses, ferns, seeds or pods.
- (b) The making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2 above by needlework processes when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in that paragraph.
- (c) The making or mounting of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above for cakes or cracker ornaments, except when made or mounted in or in association with or in conjunction with an establishment or business or branch or department or workroom which is mainly engaged in the making of crackers.
- (d) The mounting (whether singly or in festoons or garlands) or assembling of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above for the purpose of decoration when mounted or assembled in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in these operations.
- (e) The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations, in regard to any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1 to 5 above, when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in paragraphs 1 to 6 above.

But excluding :—

- 8 (a) The making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom which is mainly engaged in the manufacture of the materials specified in that paragraph, and not of the articles therein specified.
- (b) The preparation, making, or preservation of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when carried out in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the manufacture of stationers' sundries.
- (c) The stiffening or preparation of textile materials for the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above, when carried on in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the preparation of textile materials for other purposes.
- (ii) The making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2 above wholly from metal, or the mounting thereof when so made or the making or mounting of plaster flowers, fruits, or foliage, except when made or mounted :—
- (i) For funeral tokens, wreaths, or crosses.
 - (ii) In association with, or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2, from any of the materials specified therein.
 - (iii) For cake or cracker ornaments as specifically mentioned in the operations and processes included in the trade.
- (e) The making from rubber of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above or the mounting thereof when so made, where carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the manufacture of other rubber articles.
- (f) All operations covered by the following Orders :—
- (i) The Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913.
 - (ii) The Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919.
 - (iii) The Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919.
 - (iv) The Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920.

NOTE.—The employment of women, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Acts, 1918 and 1921.
