#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and the place of holding any Court and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court and the consolidation of any two or more Districts and the division of any District and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in such District:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The District of the County Court of Lancashire held at Clitheroe, except the Parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 2 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Lancashire held at Blackburn and from the 31st day of May, 1923, the holding of the said Court at Clitheroe shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exerciseable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Blackburn and the said Court held at Blackburn shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

2. The Parishes set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall, save as to any cases pending upon the 31st day of May, 1923, be detached from and cease to form part of the District of the said Court held at Clitheroe and shall be transferred to, and form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column thereof.

3. In this Order "Parish" shall have the same meaning as in the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899 (S.R. & O., 1899, No. 178), provided that the boundaries of every Parish mentioned in this Order shall be those constituted and limited at the date of this Order.

4. This Order may be cited as the County Court Districts (Clitheroe) Order in Council, 1923, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1923, and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, as amended shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

## PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect ":

And whereas by section 8 of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things, further enacted: "That when by any Order of His Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent in writing of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof duly nominated and licensed thereto and his successors shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent charges and hereditaments as shall be granted unto

At the Court at Windsor Castle, the 16th | him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid ":

And whereas the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Lord Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, hath made a Representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop

of Canterbury, as follows:—
"I, Albert Augustus, by Divine Permission, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, do in pursuance of the 26th section of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:

"That there is in my Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich in the County of Suffolk, the Vicarage and Parish Church of Coddenham with the Chapelry of Crowfield annexed, the limits and boundaries of which

are well known and defined.

"That the Chapelry of Crowfield (which is wholly situate in the County of Suffolk) contains an ancient Consecrated Church or chapel dedicated to All Saints, distant from the Parish Church of Coddenham three miles or thereabouts. That the Church at Coddenham has accommodation for 250 people and that at Crowfield for 110 people.

"That according to the Census of 1921 the population of the Parish of Coddenham, exclusive of the Chapelry of Crowfield is 675, and

that of the said Chapelry is 310.

"That there is a house of residence belonging to the said Benefice of Coddenham with Crowfield.

"That the net annual value of the said Benefice of Coddenham with Crowfield is £667 or thereabouts arising from Tithe Rent Charge, Glebe, Fees, amounts payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty, and from other sources, of which amount, £139 15s. or thereabouts, arises from Tithe Rent Charge within the Chapelry of Crowfield.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the said Act of Parliament and of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same Reign, Chapter 49, the said Chapelry of Crowfield may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Coddenham and be constituted a separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes, and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice to be called the Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield.

"The Patron of the said Benefice of Coddenham cum Crowfield is Lady de Saumarez, and the Reverend Walter Wyles is the present In-

cumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the first mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation, describing the mode in which it appears to me the separation may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes, Dues, Rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace, together with the Consents thereto in writing of Lady de Saumarez as such Patron as aforesaid, and of the said Incumbent of the said Benefice, to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as

aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

#### " SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate the Chapelry of Crowfield from the Vicarage and Parish Church of Coddenham and to constitute the same a separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes and a Benefice by the name and style of 'the Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield ' of which the said Church or Chapel in the said Chapelry shall be the Parish Church.

"The said separate Parish and Benefice shall henceforth be subject to the same Ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said Parish of Coddenham and the Incumbent of the said separate Parish and Benefice shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same.

That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge belonging to or arising out of the Chapelry of Crowfield and the Glebe lands belonging to the same and all other Endowments, profits, Ecclesiastical dues, offerings or emoluments whatsoever situate or arising within or in respect of the said Chapelry shall henceforth belong to and be attached to the separate Parish and Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield for ever and be held, received and enjoyed by the Incumbent

thereof for the time being.
"That there shall be charged upon the income of the Benefice of Coddenham an annual sum or charge amounting to £125 in favour of the Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield to be received and enjoyed by the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Crowfield for ever, such annual sum or charge to be due and payable by the Incumbent for the time Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Coddenham on the First day of October and the First day of April in every year, and that the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield shall for recovering the sum or charge so proposed to be made annually payable to him as such Incumbent have as against the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Coddenham all such remedies and powers as may by law then in force be had for the recovery of a debt.

"That Baptisms, Churchings, Marriages and Burials shall as heretofore be performed in the Church of the Benefice so to be constituted and that the fees for all such Offices performed within the limits of the said Benefice and all Ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said Benefice and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said intended Benefice or

Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield.

That two Churchwardens shall be appointed in the usual way for the said separate

Parish of Crowfield.

"That the inhabitants of the said separate Parish of Crowfield shall not be entitled to any accommodation in the said Church of Coddenham (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise and who may not be willing to relinquish the

same) nor shall the inhabitants of the said Parish of Coddenham be entitled to any accommodation in the said Church or Chapelry of Crowfield and the inhabitants of the said separate Parish of Crowfield shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Church of Coddenham but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of the said separate Parish of Crowfield and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the same.

"That the Patronage or right of Nomination

of or to the said proposed separate Benefice of Crowfield shall belong to and be vested in the Right Honourable Jane Anne, Baroness de Saumarez, O.B.E., of Shrubland Park, Coddenham, in the County of Suffolk, for ever.

## " CONSENTS.

"We, the Right Honourable Jane Anne, Baroness de Saumarez, O.B.E., being Patron or person entitled to present to Benefice of Coddenham with Crowfield (in case the same were now vacant) and The Reverend Walter Wyles the Incumbent of the same Benefice, do hereby signify to Your Grace our respective Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this 14th day of October, 1922.

the Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithe rent charges and other ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and pay-

ments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the Consents in writing of the Right Honourable Jane, Baroness de Saumarez, O.B.E., being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Coddenham with Crowfield (in case the same were now vacant) and of the Reverend Walter Wyles the Incumbent of the same Benefice has been transmitted to us for

our consideration.
"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents above re-

ferred to are hereunto annexed.

And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said Scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

"And we recommend that there shall be charged upon the income of the Benefice of Coddenham an annual sum or charge amounting to One hundred and twenty five pounds in favour of the Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield to be received and enjoyed by the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Crowfield for ever, such annual sum or charge to be due and payable by the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Coddenham on the first day of October and the first day of April in every year, and that the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield shall for recovering the sum or charge so proposed to be made annually payable to him as such Incumbent have as against the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Coddenham all such remedies and powers as may by law then in force be had for the recovery of a debt.

## PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the Branches of Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for FEMALE WORKERS at present effective and set out in the Schedule to the Notice Q (22), issued by the Trade Board and dated 21st December, 1922, the proposed Minimum Rates being as set out in the Schedule below.

This Notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

2.—Part II (Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area) of the principal Order is also hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, which shall be also a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

3. The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the principal Order are hereby fixed to be the thirty-first day of July and the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep into the Area.

- 4.—(1) Sheep shall not be moved from premises outside the Area described in the Schedule to this Order to a place of destination in that Area (other than a market, fairground or saleyard), unless they are accompanied by a certificate granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the sheep are moved, to the effect:-

- (2) Sheep moved to a market, fairground or saleyard in the Area from premises outside the Area and moved thence to a place of destination in the Area shall as soon as practicable after their arrival at such place of destination be dipped twice, with an interval of not less than ten and not more than fourteen days between the dippings by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Minister for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, unless the sheep are accompanied by a certificate granted in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article.
- (3) This Article shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

#### Area Affected.

- 1.—(1) This Order applies to the Area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the Area is referred to as the Prohibited Area.
- (2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Prohibited Area.

- 2. (a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Area is prohibited, except as provided in the next following Article; provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.
- (b) The movement of any such animal along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Area is prohibited.

- (c) No such animals shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Area.
- (d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughter-house in any borough or urban district in that Area subject to the following conditions:—
  - (i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.
  - (ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.
  - (iii) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

## Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

- 4.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.
- (2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

## Control of Dogs and Poultry.

- 5.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.
- (2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

6. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

## Offences.

7. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

THE TRAMWAYS ACT, 1870.

BYE-LAWS WITH RESPECT TO THE SCARBOROUGH TRAMWAYS.

OTICE is hereby given, that on the 9th day of April, 1923, the Town Council of Scarborough, in pursuance of Section 46 of "The Tramways Act, 1870," duly made the following Bye-laws with respect to the Scarborough Tramways, viz.:—

#### BYE-LAWS

Made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Scarborough, as the Local Authority for the Borough of Scarborough, under Section 46 of "The Tramways Act, 1870."

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Scarborough, acting by the Council as the Local Authority of the said Borough, under "The Tramways Act, 1870," at a meeting of the said Council held on the 9th day of April, 1923, do hereby with respect to the tramways laid down within the said Borough, and in pursuance of the power for that purpose contained in the said Act, make the Bye-laws hereinafter contained, as to the following matters:—

The stopping of carriages using the tram-

The traffic on the road in which the tramway is laid.

#### Definitions.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws the term "Car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the Borough of Scarborough, and the terms "Driver" and "Conductor" shall respectively mean the driver, the conductor, or other person having charge of a car, the term "Company" shall mean the Scarborough Tramways Company or their successors in title, and the term "Person" shall include any body of persons, whether corporate or unincorporate.

Cars to be Stopped at Certain Places for Setting Down or Taking Up Passengers.

2. Every driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same, for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers in the course of its journey, when required so to do by any passenger desirous of leaving the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, at any of the places which the Local Authority may from time to time, by resolution of the Council, and with the approval of the Minister of Transport, prescribe, which places shall be indicated by the Company in such manner as may from time to time be approved by the Local Authority.

#### Provision in Case a Block Occurs.

3. If at any time a block occurs in the ordinary traffic in any street, the driver of any car in such street (whether at an authorised stopping place or not) shall either stop running or move in such direction as may be necessary to relieve such block in the traffic.

## Bye-laws to be Carried and Affixed in Offices, &c.

4. The Company shall affix inside each car a copy of these Bye-laws, and the conductor shall, on request of any passenger, permit the same to be perused by such passenger; and the Company shall affix, and keep affixed, in each of their offices and waiting-rooms within the Borough of Scarborough a printed copy of the same for the use of the public.

#### Penalties.

5. The Company, or any driver, conductor, or other person, offending against any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings for each offence, and not exceeding, for any continuing offence, Ten Shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Bye-laws to Come into Operation.

6. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of July, 1923.
