

the same to Your Grace, together with the Consents thereto in writing of Lady de Saumarez as such Patron as aforesaid, and of the said Incumbent of the said Benefice, to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" It is proposed to separate the Chapelry of Crowfield from the Vicarage and Parish Church of Coddendam and to constitute the same a separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes and a Benefice by the name and style of ' the Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield ' of which the said Church or Chapel in the said Chapelry shall be the Parish Church.

" The said separate Parish and Benefice shall henceforth be subject to the same Ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said Parish of Coddendam and the Incumbent of the said separate Parish and Benefice shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same.

" That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge belonging to or arising out of the Chapelry of Crowfield and the Glebe lands belonging to the same and all other Endowments, profits, Ecclesiastical dues, offerings or emoluments whatsoever situate or arising within or in respect of the said Chapelry shall henceforth belong to and be attached to the separate Parish and Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield for ever and be held, received and enjoyed by the Incumbent thereof for the time being.

" That there shall be charged upon the income of the Benefice of Coddendam an annual sum or charge amounting to £125 in favour of the Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield to be received and enjoyed by the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Crowfield for ever, such annual sum or charge to be due and payable by the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Coddendam on the First day of October and the First day of April in every year, and that the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield shall for recovering the sum or charge so proposed to be made annually payable to him as such Incumbent have as against the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Coddendam all such remedies and powers as may by law then in force be had for the recovery of a debt.

" That Baptisms, Churchings, Marriages and Burials shall as heretofore be performed in the Church of the Benefice so to be constituted and that the fees for all such Offices performed within the limits of the said Benefice and all Ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said Benefice and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said intended Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield.

" That two Churchwardens shall be appointed in the usual way for the said separate Parish of Crowfield.

" That the inhabitants of the said separate Parish of Crowfield shall not be entitled to any accommodation in the said Church of Coddendam (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise and who may not be willing to relinquish the

same) nor shall the inhabitants of the said Parish of Coddendam be entitled to any accommodation in the said Church or Chapelry of Crowfield and the inhabitants of the said separate Parish of Crowfield shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Church of Coddendam but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of the said separate Parish of Crowfield and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the same.

" That the Patronage or right of Nomination of or to the said proposed separate Benefice of Crowfield shall belong to and be vested in the Right Honourable Jane Anne, Baroness de Saumarez, O.B.E., of Shrubland Park, Coddendam, in the County of Suffolk, for ever.

" CONSENTS.

" We, the Right Honourable Jane Anne, Baroness de Saumarez, O.B.E., being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Coddendam with Crowfield (in case the same were now vacant) and The Reverend Walter Wyles the Incumbent of the same Benefice, do hereby signify to Your Grace our respective Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

" In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this 14th day of October, 1922.

And whereas the said Scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his Report dated the 23rd day of November, 1922, which said Report is in the words and figures following:—

" We, the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:

" That the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, by Divine Permission Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has represented unto us amongst other things:—

" That there is in the County of Suffolk and his Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich the Vicarage of Coddendam with the Chapelry of Crowfield annexed the limits and boundaries of which are well known and defined.

" That the Chapelry of Crowfield contains an ancient consecrated church or chapel distant from the Parish church of Coddendam three miles or thereabouts.

" That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the said Act of Parliament and of the Act of 2 & 3 Victoria, Chapter 49, the said Chapelry of Crowfield may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Coddendam and be constituted a separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice to be called ' the Perpetual Curacy of Crowfield.'

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithe rent charges and other ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and pay-
