**TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.**

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, have been applied to the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Trade by the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1919, and to the Button-making Trade by the Trade Boards (Button-making) Order, 1919;

And whereas the Minister of Labour on 28th day of March, 1923, published notices of his intention to make Special Orders varying the descriptions of the said Trades;

And whereas objections have been made with respect to the Draft Special Orders accompanying the said notices, and these objections have been considered by the Minister and he has not amended or withdrawn the Draft Special Orders but has directed that an Enquiry shall be held in accordance with the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918;

And whereas the Minister has appointed me, the undersigned, to hold the Enquiry and to report to him;

Now, therefore, I hereby give notice that an Enquiry under the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918, with regard to the said Draft Orders will be opened by me at 10.30 a.m., on Wednesday, June 6th, 1923, at No. 5, Old Palace Yard, London, S.W. 1, and will be held thereafter at such time and place as may be found convenient. Any objector or other person who appears to me to be affected may appear either in person or by counsel, solicitor, or agent. Any person desiring to be heard, who has not already communicated in writing with the Minister of Labour, should send to me in writing, as early as possible, and in any event so as to reach me not later than Saturday, June 2nd, a summary of the representations which he desires to make.

**TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.**

General Regulations dated 15th May, 1923, made by the Minister of Labour, under paragraph 9 of the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the conduct of an Enquiry (and of all proceedings preliminary and incidental thereto) with regard

to a Draft Special Order made by the Minister under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918.

The Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by paragraph 9 of the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and of every other power him thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following regulations for the conduct of an Enquiry (and of all proceedings preliminary and incidental thereto) with regard to a Draft Special Order made by him under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918:—

1. The Enquiry shall be opened at such time and place as may be fixed, with the approval of the Minister, by the person appointed by him to hold the Enquiry (in these regulations referred to as the Commissioner), and not less than fourteen days' notice of the time and place so fixed shall be sent by post by the Commissioner, or on his behalf, to all persons who have sent to the Minister any objection to the Draft Order which the Minister does not consider to be of a frivolous character.

Provided that the non-receipt of such notice by any such person shall not invalidate the proceedings or render necessary an adjournment of the Enquiry.

2. The Commissioner may also notify in like manner any other persons appearing to him to be affected, and shall give notice generally of the holding of the Enquiry in such manner as he may think fit.

3. The Commissioner may adjourn the Enquiry from time to time as he thinks fit, and may hold adjourned sittings at any place for the convenience of persons entitled to be heard.

4. The Commissioner may give such directions as he thinks fit as to the order in which

the persons appearing at the Enquiry shall be heard.

5. If any person who has not made objections to the Draft Order in accordance with the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918, claims to appear at the Enquiry as an objector, such person shall furnish to the Commissioner within such time as the Commissioner may direct a statement of his objection in writing in the manner provided by the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918. The Commissioner shall forward a copy of each such statement to the Minister.

6. If any person claims to be heard at the Enquiry as a person affected, such person shall furnish to the Commissioner within such time as the Commissioner may direct a summary in writing of the evidence which he desires to give at the Enquiry. The Commissioner shall forward a copy of each such summary to the Minister.

7. The Commissioner may exclude any statement or evidence which appears to him to be irrelevant to the Enquiry, or to involve unnecessary repetition of arguments already stated or of evidence already given.

8. Subject to the provisions of the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and to these regulations, all the proceedings shall be conducted in such manner as the Commissioner may direct.

NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 10th June, 1923.

\* Provided that Learners commencing at 16 and under 18 years of age shall, on attaining the age of 18 years, be entitled during the remainder of their learnership period to receive 5s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 1¼d. per hour, in addition to the General Minimum Time-Rates applicable, as set out in Column III above.

- (i) The advances to be given to Learners commencing under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance on the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.
- (ii) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I of this Part of this Schedule upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below:—

Age of entering upon Employment.	Conditions.
Under 15 years of age ... ..	The completion of not less than three years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
15 and under 16 years of age ... ..	The completion of not less than two years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
16 and under 21 years of age ... ..	The completion of two years' employment.
21 years of age and over ... ..	The completion of one year's employment.

## PART I.—Continued.

- (iii) No Female Learner shall be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable under Section I of this Part of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had.
- (iv) In determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.
- (v) For the purpose of reckoning the General Minimum Time-Rate to which a learner is entitled and of determining the date on which she ceases to be entitled to be employed as a learner, a learner shall be entitled to include all previous employment in (a) any branch of the Shirtmaking Trade as referred to in Part V of this Schedule, and (b) the making wherever carried on of overalls for male and female persons.
- (vi) If the conditions specified in Section I of Part IV are not complied with the rate applicable is that set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule.

## PART II.

## PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

- SECTION I.—(a) Workers other than Homeworkers as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule ... .. 7½d. per hour.
- (b) Homeworkers (as so defined) ... .. 7½d. „

SECTION II.—In the case of workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER of the class in question, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate appropriate to the class.

In determining whether any piece-rate satisfies the above-mentioned condition, regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, *i.e.*, workers of ordinary skill and experience, in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, learners and infirm workers.

## PART III.

## OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	... ..	48
On any day other than Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays	... ..	9

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and hours worked on Saturdays (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

## —(A)—FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:—

## (1) ON ANY DAY OTHER THAN SATURDAYS, SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—

- (a) For the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (b) For the second two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (c) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds 9½, 11½ and 13½ respectively.

## (2) ON SATURDAY in respect of:—

- (a) That class of worker who customarily attends on SIX DAYS a week:—

For all Overtime worked after the first five hours of work:—

- (i) For the first four hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (ii) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(NOTE.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday, the Minimum Rate applicable to the class of workers specified in this sub-paragraph is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of the Schedule.)

- (b) That class of worker who customarily attends on FIVE DAYS a week:—

- (i) For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday), One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (ii) For the second two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (iii) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

PART III—*Continued.*

- (3) ON SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—  
For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

NOTE.—The Overtime Rates set out in paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this Sub-section are payable as provided above in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

- (4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b) and (c), (2) (a) and (b) (ii) and (iii), and (3) of this Sub-Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Weekly Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

## (B)—FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:—

- (1) ALL FEMALE WORKERS (other than Learners) employed on Piece-Work, shall receive in respect of each Hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or to the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE-TIME respectively.
- (2) FEMALE LEARNERS, employed on Piece-Work, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE-TIME respectively.

SECTION III.—In the application of the Overtime Rates set out in this Part of this Schedule the following provisions apply:—

- (a) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provision the word "Sunday" were substituted for "Saturday" and the word "Saturday" for "Sunday."
- (b) Any other day (subject to the proviso contained in this Sub-section) may, notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in any case in which such substitution is made, the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provision such short day were substituted for "Saturday" and "Saturday" for such short day.

Provided that the short day substituted for Saturday shall not be a Sunday, except in the case of workers coming within Sub-Section (a) of this Section.

## PART IV.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice:

A FEMALE LEARNER is a Worker who:—

- (a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and
- (b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certificate or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of Learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner, on her first employment, in the branch or branches of the trade as referred to in Part V of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but the probation period shall be included in her period of Learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—A HOMEWORKER is a Worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

## PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all FEMALE WORKERS in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

(1) The making from textile fabrics of shirts, collars, cuffs, pyjamas, aprons, chefs' caps, hospital ward caps, and other washable clothing worn by male persons;

(2) the making of women's collars and cuffs and of nurses' washing belts where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of the before-mentioned articles;

(3) the making of neckties worn by male persons, and of neckties worn by female persons where made in association with or in conjunction with the making of neckties worn by male persons;

including:—

Laundrying, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing, and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of any of the above-mentioned articles;

but excluding:—

(1) the making of articles which are knitted or are made from knitted fabrics;

(2) the making of handkerchiefs, mufflers, gloves, socks, stockings, spats, gaiters, bonnets, hats or caps (other than chefs' caps and hospital ward caps);

(3) the making of boys' washing suits;

(4) the making of washable clothing to be worn by children without distinction of sex;

(5) the making of any articles the making of which is included in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919.

## PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other Provident Fund.

*Note.*—The employment of Female Workers, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Acts, 1918 and 1921.

Signed by order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board for Female Workers, as set out above, and specifying the 4th day of June, 1923, as the date from which such Minimum Rates should become effective.

**REGULATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT AS  
 TECHNICAL ASSISTANT ON THE  
 SCIENTIFIC STAFF OF THE FISHERY  
 BOARD FOR SCOTLAND.**

*N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. Application for appointment must be made to the Secretary of the Board at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Board. When any vacancy which is not to be filled by promotion within the existing staff occurs, the Board will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the Press, and the last day fixed for the receipt of applications will be stated in such advertisement.

2.—(a) Candidates must be between 18 and 24 years of age on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications. If that date were the

eighteenth anniversary of a candidate's birth he would be within the limits of age: if it were the twenty-fourth anniversary he would be beyond them. A candidate who has served in His Majesty's Forces between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, may deduct from his actual age any period of such service between 4th August, 1914, and 31st December, 1919.

(b) No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

3. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects, provided that exception to the latter condition may be made in the case of a candidate who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

In the selection of candidates preference will be given to ex-Service men.

4. Candidates must have gained the Higher Leaving Certificate of the Scottish Education Department or have passed an examination of equivalent standard.

5. The completed application forms will be scrutinised by the Fishery Board, who will take account of the nature of the subjects studied by the candidates in their school course and of any subsequent experience in science or technology, especially in natural history, chemistry, physics and mathematics. Those candidates who, in the opinion of the Fishery Board, satisfy the conditions of these regulations and are otherwise suitable will be interviewed by a Selection Board consisting of representatives of the Fishery Board and a representative of the Civil Service Commission.

6. The Selection Board, who will have before them the candidates' record of experience and education, will prepare a list in order of merit of those candidates whom they consider suitable for appointment.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

7. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they fulfil all the conditions laid down in these regulations and are eligible in respect of health and character. Candidates appointed will be on probation for two years; if during that period a probationer is found not to be suitable or satisfactory the appointment will be terminated. If the service is approved at the termination of the probationary period, a certificate of qualification for the establishment of the probationer will be issued by the Civil Service Commissioners, subject to such further enquiry as they may think fit. Pension rights under the Superannuation Acts will then accrue as from the date of the original appointment.

8. A fee of 10s. will be payable by each candidate admitted to interview by the Selection Board. A further fee of 12s. 6d. (being the balance of the fee of £1 2s. 6d. prescribed for this situation) will be payable on the issue of the certificate of qualification.
