PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed minimum rates of wages set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner specified in Section II of Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice M.T. (ii) Has received a certificate or has made an application for such certificate in accordance with the rules laid down by the Trade Board. Provided that in granting or withholding such certificate the Trade Board may take into consideration whether in view of the ratio of learners to journey workers employed in any establishment on the processes in which the Learner proposed to be certificated is to be employed, such Learner has a reasonable prospect of receiving due instruction. Provided also that any certificate may be withdrawn if the Trade Board consider that the conditions of employment are not being complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a learner on his or her first employment on one of the processes specified above without a certificate for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at his or her employment, the probation period shall be included in his or her period of learnership.

SILVER LEAF ORDER OF 1923.

(DATED 22ND MAY 1923.)

(D.I.P. No. 535.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:--

Definitions.

1. The expression "the Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries; the expression "tree" includes any bush and any stock, sucker or cutting of any tree or bush; "Inspector" means an Inspector of the Ministry; "the Local Authority" means as regards any District the Local Authority for the District under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922.

Destruction of Dead Wood.

- 2. (1) The occupier of any premises on which plum or apple trees are growing shall in each year before the 15th July destroy by fire on the premises all the dead wood of each plum or apple tree, and where such dead wood is in the trunk of any such tree and extends to the ground the occupier shall before the said date grub up and destroy by fire on the premises the whole of any such tree, including the roots.
- (2) An Inspector may at any time serve a notice on the occupier of any premises requiring him to destroy by fire on the premises within the time specified in the notice any wood of any kind whatsoever on the premises on which there are visible fruiting bodies of the fungus Stereum purpureum.

Powers of Entry.

3. An Inspector upon production, if so required, of his appointment, may for the purpose of enforcing this Order enter any premises and examine any wood or tree thereon.

Service of Notices, etc.

4. For the purpose of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business, or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there; and a notice purporting to be signed by an Inspector shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him as an Inspector.

Notification of Order.

This Order shall be published by the Local Authority in accordance with any directions given by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Offences.

- 6. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds who:
 - 1) fails to comply with the requirements of this Order, or of any notice served under this Order; or
 - (2) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector in the exercise of his powers or duties under this Order.

Revocation of Order.

- 7. The Silver Leaf Order of 1919 is hereby revoked; provided that such revocation shall
 - (i) affect the previous operation of such Order or anything duly done or suffered under such Order; or
