the Learner is employed, provided that these branches include the making of Heraldic and Lettered Flags and the Union Jack),

and is provided by the employer with every facility for such learning.

AND

- (ii) Has received a certificate or has made en application for such certificate in accordance with the rules laid down by the Trade Board. Provided that in granting or with-holding such certificate the Trade Board may take into consideration whether in view of the ratio of learners to journey workers employed in any establishment on the processes in which the Learner proposed to be certificated is to be employed, such Learner has a reasonable prospect of receiving due instruction. Provided also that any certificate may be withdrawn if the Trade Board consider that the conditions of employment are not being complied with.
 - Provided that an employer may employ a learner on his or her first employment on one of the processes specified above without a certificate for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at his or her employment, the probation period shall be included in his or her period of learnership.

PART V.

APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Made Up Textiles) Order, 1920, and set out in Section II of Part V of the Trade Board's Notice M.T. (5) dated 7th July, 1922.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th day of May, 1923. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Made-Up Textiles Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
