The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Christ Church, in the University of Oxford, on the 30th day of May, 1923, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE amending the existing Statutes of Christ Church, in the University of Oxford, duly made, under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, at a Meeting of the Governing Body, specially summoned for the purpose, on the 30th day of May, 1923, and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Addition to Statute VII.

The Governing Body may contribute at their discretion, if the funds at their disposal permit, a further annual sum, not exceeding £2,250, towards the maintenance of the Choir School, or for purposes to which the Chapter Fund is applied.
