The following Addresses were presented to Their Majesties on the 12th instant on the occasion of Their visit to Ilford and Becontree:—

ILFORD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

We, the Chairman and Members of the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Ilford, humbly beg to offer Your Majesty, in the names of the inhabitants of this loyal Parliamentary Borough, an expression of our devotion to Your Royal House and our whole-hearted and respectful welcome on the auspicious occasion of Your Majesty's presence here to-day.

As loyal and devoted subjects we are well aware of the deep interest Your Majesty displays in all matters concerning the welfare of the community, and it is in consequence of Your Majesty's particular interest in the housing accommodation which is being provided on such an extensive scale in this eastern district of Greater London that we, the citizens of this Parliamentary Borough, have the honour, privilege, and happiness of welcoming Your Majesty this day.

The town of Ilford, as Your Majesty is aware, has on a previous occasion been

honoured by Your presence when, as Prince of Wales, you declared open the Hainault Playing Fields. On that occasion the population of this district was approximately 60,000. It is now estimated at 100,000, and is still rapidly increasing by reason principally of the provision of new housing estates within its confines.

Within the area of this township, not only the London County Council at Becontree, but the Corporation of the City of London, have recently established large housing estates, and, in addition the Council of this town have completed four building estates, comprising three hundred and fifty-six houses in different parts of their district.

It is particularly gratifying that Your Majesty is accompanied to-day by Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen, who so fully shares Your Majesty's deep solicitude for all that tends to provide the high ideal of home life, with its resultant happiness and contentment amongst all classes of Your Majesty's subjects.

We devoutly pray that Your Majesties, secure in the affection of Your people, may long be spared to preside over the destinies of this great Empire, in whose prosperity and happiness every loyal subject of Your Majesties evinces such justifiable pride.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:

On behalf of the Queen and myself I thank you very sincerely for your loyal and dutiful Address, and for the enthusiastic welcome which you have given Us. We recall with pleasure Our visit to Ilford fourteen years ago for the purpose of opening the Fairlop Oak Playing Fields, and we are gratified to observe the advance made by the Urban District Council since that time in all branches of the

work of local government.

The Queen and I are very glad to have the opportunity of visiting the London County Council's estate at Becontree, which, I understand, is the largest housing estate hitherto developed by municipal enterprise. The London County Council have for many years shown their zeal and activity in the work of housing; and in these days the large scheme at Becontree is a most welcome contribution to the public need. The liberal planning of the estate, with its gardens and open spaces, is proof of the progress made in recent years towards a solution of the housing problem.

I note with satisfaction that your Council have not been behindhand in carrying out their obligations for the housing of the workers in their own district, and that four building estates have already been completed

by your Council themselves.

I shall watch with interest the future of your town, confident that the same care will be devoted towards its development as has been shown in the measures taken for improving the social conditions of the people in your district.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- Commissioners 1. The Lords Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd June, 1923, at 1 o'clock, for:

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th June, 1923, Saturday, the 30th June, 1923, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1923, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

CARGOES EX ENEMY VESSELS SEIZED BY PORTUGAL.

With reference to the notifications published in the London Gazette on the 1st December, 1922, and previous dates, a translation is now appended of a Portuguese decree published on the 29th ultimo relative to the cancellation of guarantees given in respect of cargoes ex enemy vessels in Portugal.

Translation.

Law No. 1433 (29th May, 1923). In the Name of the Nation, the Congress of the Republic decrees and I promulgate the following Law:-

Article 1.—As soon as three years have elapsed after the date of the 2nd April, 1921, provided there are no claims by third parties, the guarantees which were given to the Customs in conformity with the Orders issued by the Procuradoria of the Republic for the delivery of goods forming part of the cargoes of ex-German ships may be considered as cancelled, without any necessity for renewal, and the respective interested parties in consequence released from their corresponding responsibilities.

Article 2.—Legislation to the contrary is revoked.

Let the Ministers of Justice and Finance print, publish and enforce it.

30 AND 32, WEST STREET, POOLE. New Certificate.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that the Managers of the Dorset Home Industrial School for Girls, 30 and 32, West Street, Poole, having applied for permission to receive boys under eight years of age into the School, and for the name of the School to be altered, he has issued a new Certificate, revoking the Certificate granted on the 5th March, 1918, and certifying that the premises 30 and 32, West Street, Poole, now known as the Dorset Children's Home, are fit for the reception of girls and boys sent to an Industrial School, in pursuance of the provisions of the Children Act, 1908, or of any other Act, provided that only boys under eight years of age are admitted, and that all such boys are removed

before attaining the age of ten years.

The Certificate, which bears date the 12th June, 1923, provides that the number of girls or boys resident in the School at any one time, whether sent thereto in pursuance of the said provisions or not, shall not exceed seventy-five.
