The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of June, 1923 (C.W. 11173/22), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Clause V of Section IX of Schedule V of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to establish, *inter alia*, a scale of Retiring Allowances for Officers of all Branches of the rank or relative rank of Lieutenant or Lieutenant-Commander if

invalided under 40 years of age, except Officers on the Supplementary List and Officers promoted from Mate and Officers formerly of Warrant rank promoted for long and zealous service:

“And whereas Your Majesty was further graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 9th day of November, 1920, to establish revised regulations governing the eligibility of Officers of the Medical, Dental, Instructor and Chaplains' Branches, who are entered subsequently to the 17th July, 1920, for retired pay on the scale laid down in Clause IV of Section IX of Schedule V of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and to make complementary provision for the Retiring Allowance of such Officers when invalided over the age of 40 years before they have completed sufficient service to render them eligible for retired pay on the ordinary scale:

“And whereas we are of opinion that Officers of these Branches who are entered on or after the 1st day of October, 1921, and who are invalided before they have completed four years' service should not be eligible for the Retiring Allowances provided in Clause V of Section IX of Schedule V of Your Order in Council of the 22nd day of January, 1920, and

in paragraph 3 of the Schedule of Your Order in Council of the 9th day of November, 1920, but that in lieu thereof such Officers if invalided for a disability which is not attributable to their Naval service should at our discretion be granted on withdrawal a gratuity at a rate not exceeding £100 for each complete year of their service:

"Provided that Instructor Lieutenants entered for temporary service should not be eligible for a gratuity both under this Order and under Your Order in Council of the 13th day of April, 1918:

"For the purpose of this Order 'service' to mean service as reckoned for the purpose of calculating service retired pay.

"This Order not to apply to Medical and Dental Officers serving under short service engagements.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction these proposals.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence therein."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS on the twentieth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, His Majesty in Council was pleased under the provisions of the Air Navigation Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), to make the Air Navigation Order, 1922 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"):

And whereas by section one of the Act it is enacted among other things that His Majesty may make such Orders in Council as appear to Him necessary for giving effect to any amendment which may be made to the Convention referred to in the Act, under Article thirty-four of the said Convention:

And whereas certain of the provisions of the said Convention have been amended by the International Commission for Air Navigation acting under Article thirty-four of the Convention:

And whereas by section three of the Act it is enacted that an Order in Council under Part One of the Act may make provision, among other things, supplementing the Convention in such manner as appears necessary or expedient, by general safety regulations:

And whereas by section seventeen of the Act it is enacted among other things that an Order in Council under the Act may be revoked or varied by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order shall be amended in manner hereafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of section one

of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (1) of Article 8 of the principal Order:—

"(1) Any person authorized by the Secretary of State shall have the right of access at all reasonable times to any aerodrome for the purpose of inspecting the aerodrome, and any person so authorized and any police constable shall have the right of access at all reasonable times to any place to which access is necessary for the purpose of carrying out his powers and duties under this Order."

2. The following Articles shall be inserted after Article 9 of the principal Order:—

"9A. Where it appears to any person authorized in writing by the Secretary of State for the purposes of this article that any aircraft is intended or likely to be flown in such circumstances that the flight would be in contravention of any of the provisions of sub-paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (1) of article 3, or sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) of article 4, or article 14 of this Order, or in such circumstances as to infringe any other provision of this Order and to be a cause of danger to persons in the aircraft or to persons or property on the ground, the person so authorized may give such directions, and take such steps by way of detention of the aircraft or otherwise in relation thereto, as appear to him to be necessary in order to prevent the flight, and, without prejudice to any provisions of this Order with respect to the obstruction of authorized persons, any person acting in contravention of any directions given under this article shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of this Order."

"9B. A person in an aircraft while flying in or over the British Islands shall not take or cause or permit to be taken any photograph of a prohibited area, or of any part thereof, or of any object therein, except with the special permission in writing of the Secretary of State, and subject to any conditions that may be attached to such permission."

"9C. A person acting as, or carried in, an aircraft for the purpose of acting as pilot, commander, navigator, engineer, or operative member of the crew thereof, shall not, while so acting or carried, be in a state of intoxication or in a state in which, by reason of his having taken or used any sedative narcotic or stimulant drug or preparation, his capacity so to act is impaired."

3. The following Article shall be substituted for Article 13 of the principal Order:—

"13.—(1) Any person required under this Order to be provided with a licence shall on demand produce his licence, and, in the case of a pilot, his pilot's log book for the inspection of any person authorized for the purpose by the Secretary of State or of any police constable.

(2) The owner, hirer and person in charge of any aircraft shall on demand produce or cause to be produced, for the inspection of any person authorized for the

purpose by the Secretary of State or of any police constable, any certificates or licences relating to the aircraft, any of the prescribed log books, and, in the case of an aircraft engaged in international navigation if it carries passengers or freight, the prescribed list of names and the prescribed bills of lading and manifest respectively."

4. The following paragraph shall be inserted at the end of Article 15 of the principal Order:—

"(2) A person shall not wilfully or negligently injure or interfere with any aerial lighthouse established or maintained with the approval of the Secretary of State or any light exhibited from any such lighthouse."

5. In Article 22 of the principal Order the words "paragraph (1) of article 4" shall be substituted for the words "paragraph (2) of article 4."

6. In proviso (b) to paragraph (1) of Article 23 of the principal Order, for the words "articles 9" there shall be substituted the words "articles 9, 9A, 9B, 9C."

7. The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph (2) of Article 27 of the principal Order:—

"(2A) In this Order references to passengers carried for hire or reward include references to persons carried in aircraft for the purposes of instruction in flying for which payment is made."

8. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 4 of Schedule II of the principal Order:—

"4. If the Secretary of State has reason to believe, on complaint or otherwise, that a passenger or goods aircraft within the British Islands is intended or is about to proceed on any flight while in a condition unfit for flight, he may give such directions and take such steps, by way of provisional detention of the aircraft or otherwise in relation thereto, as may be necessary for the purpose of causing the aircraft to be inspected by authorized representatives of the Secretary of State, and may, upon the result of such inspection, cause the aircraft to be detained until the execution of such alterations or repairs as he may consider necessary to render the aircraft fit for flight."

9. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule IV of the principal Order:—

(i) The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 14:—

"14.—(a) An aircraft wishing to land at night on an aerodrome having a ground control shall, before landing, fire a green pyrotechnical light or flash a green lamp intermittently. In addition, it shall make by international Morse code the letter group forming its call-sign.

(b) Permission to land will be given by the same call-sign from the ground, followed by a green pyrotechnical light, or flashing a green lamp intermittently."

(ii) In paragraph 15 the word "pyrotechnical" shall be substituted for the word "Very's."

(iii) The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 16:—

"16. An aircraft compelled to land at night shall before landing fire a red pyrotechnical light or make a series of short and intermittent flashes with its navigation lights."

(iv) In paragraph 17 the word "pyrotechnical" shall be substituted for the word "Very's."

(v) In paragraph 19 the word "green" shall be substituted for the word "red."

(vi) The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 36:—

"36. At every licensed aerodrome if an aircraft about to land or leave finds it necessary to make a circuit or partial circuit, such circuit or partial circuit shall, except in case of distress, be left-handed (anti-clockwise)."

(vii) In paragraph 46 the words "lights shall be placed on the aerodrome" shall be substituted for the words "the signals shall be," and the words "A red light shall indicate a left-hand circuit, and a green light shall indicate a right-hand circuit (see paragraph 36 of this Schedule)" shall be omitted.

10. In paragraph (1) of Schedule VII of the principal Order the following subparagraphs shall be omitted:—

"Orkney Islands.—An area enclosed by straight lines joining the following points:—Tor Ness, Rora Head, Inga Ness, Mull Head, Old Head."

"Osea Island.—Three statute miles in all directions from the centre of Osea Island."

11. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1923, and the principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Air Navigation Orders, 1922 and 1923.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is enacted as follows:—

(1) It shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to establish consultative councils in England and Wales for giving, in accordance with the provisions of the Order, advice and assistance to the Minister in connection with such matters affecting or incidental to the health of the people as may be referred to in such Order.

(2) Every such Council shall include women as well as men, and shall consist of persons having practical experience of the matters referred to the Council:

And whereas by the Ministry of Health (Consultative Councils) Order, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) Consultative Councils were so established:

And whereas it has appeared desirable to amend the constitution of the Consultative Council established under the principal Order for giving advice and assistance in connection

with such matters as relate to National Health Insurance (Approved Societies' Work):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Consultative Council relating to National Health Insurance (Approved Societies' Work) shall consist of such number of members, not exceeding forty, as the Minister may determine, and the quorum of that Council shall be fifteen, and Articles 2 and 8 (2) of the principal Order, so far as they relate to that Council, shall be read and have effect accordingly.

2.—(1) At the expiration of one, two and three years respectively from the first appointment of the members of the council to be appointed under this Order, one-third of those members, to be selected by lot, shall go out of office, but for the purpose of this provision a member who has been re-appointed shall not be deemed to be one of the members first appointed under this Order.

(2) Subject as aforesaid the provisions of the principal Order relating to the appointment of members shall apply to members appointed under the principal Order as modified by this Order.

3. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Consultative Councils) Amendment Order, 1923.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 10th day of May, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Sywell, in the County of Northampton and in the Diocese of Peterborough, between that Benefice and a certain other Benefice, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, which said last named Benefice is situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Sywell and Saint Michael

and All Angels, Princetown, is vested in His Royal Highness Edward Albert Christian George Andrew Patrick David, Prince of Wales, Duke of Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Chester and Carrick, Baron of Renfrew, Lord of the Isles and Great Steward of Scotland (hereinafter called "His Royal Highness") as parcel of the possessions of the Duchy of Cornwall:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, is at present insufficiently endowed, and that the said Benefice of Sywell has endowments of such an amount as that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said Benefice of Sywell will still be sufficiently endowed:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Sywell which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Sywell is now full, the Reverend Charles Barrington Walters being the Rector or Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas His Royal Highness has affixed His Sign Manual to a Warrant authorizing these presents to be passed under the Seal of the Duchy of Cornwall in token of the consent of His Royal Highness:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of His Royal Highness (testified as aforesaid) and with the consent of the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Bishop of the said Diocese of Peterborough, acting as such Bishop, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of the said Diocese of Exeter, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme and sealed the same with their Episcopal Seals), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same all the tithe rent charges, glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments which shall then belong to the said Benefice of Sywell, or which may thereafter belong to the same Benefice, shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, with the annual sum or yearly charge hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £150, the same annual sum or yearly charge of £150 to be due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, and the same annual sum or yearly charge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand, and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal quarterly payments on the usual quarter days in every year.

"And that in the event of the said Benefice of Sywell being avoided by the said Charles Barrington Walters by retirement under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts and a pension under those Acts being awarded to him the said rent charge of £150 per annum shall take effect upon the cessation of such pension, and in the event of the said Benefice of Sywell being avoided by the said Charles Barrington Walters without the grant of any pension to him, under the said Resignation Acts, then the said rent charge of £150 per annum shall take effect upon such avoidance.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent charge of £150 per annum hereby proposed to be created in favour of the Benefice of which he is Incumbent as aforesaid, (that is to say) power, if and whenever any part of the said rent charge shall at any time be unpaid for 21 days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof (although there shall not have been any legal demand made thereof) to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the non-payment thereof and for the purpose of collecting receiving and recovering such endowments or any of them to use exercise and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting recovering and enforcing payment thereof and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same as may be statutorily exercised or exercisable by him under the law then in force.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Sywell shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant convey and annex to the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, any part or parts of the Rectorial endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Sywell which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Peterborough for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of £150 hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the same annual sum or yearly charge of £150 shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said Benefice of Sywell shall continue to be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of Peterborough and Exeter.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 10th day of May, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Brimpton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wasing both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Berks and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Brimpton and Wasing duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Brimpton and Wasing are now full, the Reverend Thomas Lionel Patton being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brimpton and the Reverend Henry Badham being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wasing:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Brimpton and the said Benefice of Wasing shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brimpton with Wasing,'

but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith, and if the said Benefice of Brimpton only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Wasing and the then Incumbent of Brimpton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Wasing only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Brimpton, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Brimpton if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Wasing shall have been instituted to Wasing subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Wasing before the date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Wasing following such avoidance of the Benefice of Brimpton and the then Incumbent of Brimpton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Brimpton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice, and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wasing and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated as follows that is to say (a) that we shall first appropriate out of such net proceeds a sum not exceeding £1,000 towards the cost either of such works of improvement to the house of residence belonging to the United Benefice (that is to say the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Brimpton) as to us shall seem desirable, or of the provision of a new house of residence for the United Benefice and (b) that the remainder of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice to be made after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Brimpton shall have the first and third turns

and the Patron of the said Benefice of Wasing shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-ninth day of November, 1913, His Majesty the King did constitute the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Nigeria, and did amongst other things provide for the establishment of a Legislative Council for the said

Colony, and did further reserve to Himself, His heirs and successors, His and their undoubted right, with the advice of His or their Privy Council, from time to time to make all such laws or ordinances as might appear to Him or them necessary for the peace, order, and good government of the Colony:

And whereas by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty to hold, exercise and enjoy any jurisdiction which His Majesty now has or may at any time hereafter have within a foreign country in the same and as ample a manner as if His Majesty had acquired that jurisdiction by the cession or conquest of territory:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the territories known as the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the Twenty-second day of November, 1913, known as the Nigerian Council Order in Council, 1913, provision was made for the establishment of an advisory and deliberative body to be known as the Nigerian Council:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the Tenth day of August, 1914, known as the Nigeria Order in Council, 1914, power was conferred upon the Governor and the Legislative Council of the Colony of Nigeria and the Governor of the Protectorate of Nigeria of legislating jointly for matters affecting the whole territory of Nigeria:

And whereas His Majesty has this day, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, been pleased to direct that Letters Patent be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland for the purpose of providing for the Government of the Colony of Nigeria, as in the said Letters Patent more fully appears, and the draft of the said Letters Patent has this day been approved by His Majesty in Council:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date this day and known as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922, provision has been made for the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction in the territories known as the Protectorate of Nigeria:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Nigeria (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1922.

II. This Order shall apply to the Colony and to the Protectorate of Nigeria, which are hereinafter referred to collectively as "Nigeria."

III. In this Order "His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors; "Secretary of State" means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; "Governor" means the Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of Nigeria and includes every person for the time being administering the Government of Nigeria; "the Council" means the Legislative Council established by or under the provisions of the last hereinbefore recited Letters Patent and Order in Council, which Council shall be known as "the Legislative Council of Nigeria."

IV. The Council shall consist of:—The Governor as President, 26 Official Members, 3

Elected Unofficial Members representing the municipal area of Lagos, 1 Elected Unofficial Member representing the municipal area of Calabar, and not more than 15 Nominated Unofficial Members.

V. The Official Members of the Council shall consist of the following persons:—

The members of the Executive Council.

The ten senior officers for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of Senior Resident in Nigeria, and the Officers lawfully discharging the functions of Deputy Chief Secretary to Government, of Secretary, Northern Provinces, and of Secretary, Southern Provinces.

The officers lawfully discharging the functions of General Manager of the Railway, of Director of Public Works and of Postmaster-General.

VI. The Elected Members of the Council shall be elected as follows:—

(1) Three Members by persons duly qualified as electors as hereinafter provided, who are resident within the municipal area of Lagos.

(2) One Member by persons duly qualified as electors as hereinafter provided, who are resident within the municipal area of Calabar.

VII. The Nominated Unofficial Members of the Council shall be such persons not holding office in Nigeria as the Governor may, from time to time, by instrument under the Public Seal appoint, subject to disallowance or confirmation by His Majesty, signified through a Secretary of State.

Every such Member shall vacate his seat at the end of five years from the date of the Instrument by which he is appointed or at such earlier date as may be provided by that Instrument.

Provided that if any such Member is provisionally appointed, as hereinafter provided, to fill a vacant seat in the Council, and his provisional appointment is immediately followed by his definitive appointment, the aforesaid period of five years shall be reckoned from the date of the Instrument provisionally appointing him.

Every such Member shall be eligible to be re-appointed by the Governor for a further period not exceeding five years, subject to the approval of His Majesty, signified through a Secretary of State.

VIII. Whenever upon any special occasion the Governor wishes to obtain the advice of any person within Nigeria touching any matters about to be brought before the Council, he may by an Instrument under the Public Seal of Nigeria appoint any such person to be, for such occasion, an Extraordinary Member of the Council.

IX. The Members of the Council shall take precedence as His Majesty may specially assign, and in default thereof:—

(1) First the Official Members according to their seniority in the Executive Council or, if they are not Members thereof, according to the order in which they are named in Article V. of this Order, provided that officers of the administrative service of Nigeria shall rank according to their seniority in that service.

(2) Secondly, the Elected Members and the Nominated Unofficial Members according to the length of time during which they

have been continuously Members of the Council, members elected or appointed at the same time taking precedence amongst themselves according to the alphabetical order of their names.

Provided nevertheless that any such Member re-elected or re-appointed immediately on the termination of his term of office shall take precedence according to the date from which he has been continuously a Member of the Council.

X. No Member of the Council shall sit or vote therein until he shall have taken and subscribed the following oath before the Governor, or some person authorized by the Governor to administer such oath:—

“I, A.B., do sincerely promise and swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King George, His heirs and successors, according to law.

So help me God.”

Provided that every person authorized by law to make an affirmation instead of taking an oath may make such affirmation instead of taking the said oath.

XI. Whenever any Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council shall die or shall, with the permission of the Governor, by writing under his hand addressed to the Governor, resign his seat in the Council, or shall be suspended from the exercise of his functions as a Member of the Council, or shall be declared by the Governor by an Instrument under the Public Seal to be incapable of exercising his functions as such Member, or shall be temporarily absent from Nigeria, the Governor may by an Instrument under the said Seal appoint some other person resident within Nigeria to be provisionally a Member of the Council in the place of the Member so dying, resigning, or being suspended, or declared incapable, or absent.

Every such provisional appointment may be disallowed by His Majesty through a Secretary of State, or may be revoked by the Governor by any such Instrument as aforesaid.

Every person so provisionally appointed shall be to all intents and purposes a Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council until his appointment shall be disallowed, or revoked, or superseded by the definitive appointment in his place of a Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council, or until the person in whose place he has been appointed shall be relieved from suspension, or declared by the Governor by an Instrument under the Public Seal to be capable of exercising the functions of a Member of the Council or shall have returned to Nigeria.

XII. The Governor shall, without delay, report to His Majesty for his confirmation or disallowance, signified through a Secretary of State, every provisional appointment of any person as a Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council. Every such person shall hold his place in the Council during His Majesty's pleasure, and the Governor may by an Instrument under the Public Seal revoke any such appointment.

XIII. The Governor may by an instrument under the Public Seal suspend any Official Member or any Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council from the exercise of his functions as a Member of the Council. Every such suspension shall be forthwith reported by the Governor to a Secretary of State, and shall remain in force unless and until it shall be

either removed by the Governor by an Instrument under the said Seal, or disallowed by His Majesty through a Secretary of State.

XIV. Any person (save as hereinafter excepted) who shall be registered as an elector for the election of Elected Members of the Council shall be qualified and entitled to be elected a representative of the Municipal area of Lagos or of Calabar, as provided in Article VI. of this Order.

XV. No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Council, or, having been elected, shall sit or vote in the Council, who—

(1) has been sentenced by any competent British Court, whether of Nigeria or not, for any crime punishable by death, hard labour for any period, or imprisonment for a period exceeding one year, and has not received a free pardon from His Majesty for the crime for which he has been so sentenced; or

(2) is an undischarged bankrupt, whether he has been declared a bankrupt by a Court in Nigeria or by any other British Court; or

(3) has within five years before the election received charitable relief in Nigeria from any public source; or

(4) is of unsound mind; or

(5) is in receipt of salary payable out of the public revenue of Nigeria; or

(6) is not registered as an elector.

XVI. All questions which may arise as to the right of any person to be or remain an elected Member of the Council shall be referred to and decided by the Supreme Court of Nigeria.

XVII. Every elected Member of the Council shall vacate his seat at the expiration of five years from the date of his election, but shall be eligible for re-election if not disqualified under the provisions of this Order.

XVIII. If any Elected Member of the Council shall at any time, by writing under his hand addressed to the Governor, resign his seat in the Council, or shall become subject to any of the disqualifications specified in Article XV. of this Order, or shall take any oath or make any declaration of allegiance to any Foreign State or Power, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant.

An Elected Member of the Council may, with the permission of the Governor, be absent from the sittings of the Council or from Nigeria for a period or periods not exceeding twelve calendar months at any one time; but if any Elected Member shall for any reason be so absent for more than twelve consecutive calendar months, or shall be absent, except on the ground of illness, from the sittings of the Council for a period of two calendar months during the session of the Council, without the leave of the Governor, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant.

Whenever the seat of an Elected Member has become vacant, the Governor shall, as soon as possible, issue directions for the election of a new Member in the place of the Member whose seat has become vacant.

XIX. Every person who, having been returned as a Member of the Council, but not having been at the time of his election qualified to be elected, shall sit or vote in the Council, shall for every day on which he shall sit or vote in the Council, and every person who shall sit or vote in the Council after his seat shall

have become vacant shall for every day on which he shall sit or vote after his seat shall have become vacant, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds, to be recovered by action in the Supreme Court of Nigeria by any person who shall sue for the same.

XX. Every male person shall be entitled to be registered as an elector, and when registered to vote at the election of Elected Members of the Council, who—

(1) is a British subject, or a native of the Protectorate of Nigeria;

(2) is of the age of twenty-one years or upwards;

(3) has been ordinarily resident for the twelve months immediately preceding the date of registration in the municipal area for which the election is being held; and

(4) was during the calendar year immediately preceding in possession of a gross annual income, from all sources, of not less than one hundred pounds.

XXI. No person shall be entitled to be registered as an elector, or when registered to vote at the election of Elected Members of Council who—

(1) has been sentenced by any competent British Court, whether of Nigeria or not, for any crime punishable by death, hard labour for any period, or imprisonment for any period exceeding one year, and has not received a free pardon from His Majesty for the crime for which he has been so sentenced; or—

(2) is of unsound mind.

XXII. The Governor shall, as soon as possible after the coming into operation of this Order, establish by proclamation such regulations, not inconsistent with this Order, as he may think necessary for regulating the registration of electors, and generally in regard to the election of Members of the Council, and such regulations shall take effect and have the force of law in Nigeria immediately on the proclamation thereof. But any regulations so made may be repealed or altered by any Ordinance or Ordinances hereafter to be enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council.

XXIII. It shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, to make laws for the peace, order, and good government of the Colony of Nigeria and for that portion of the Protectorate of Nigeria known as the Southern Provinces. Such laws shall be styled "Ordinances," and the enacting words shall be "enacted by the Governor of Nigeria, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof."

The sanction of the Council shall also be required for all expenditure out of the funds and revenues of Nigeria in respect of that portion of the Protectorate of Nigeria known as the Northern Provinces.

XXIV. It shall be lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Nigeria, with the advice and consent of the Council, and the Governor of the Protectorate of Nigeria, from time to time by joint Ordinance to provide for the peace, order, and good government of Nigeria, and of all persons therein, provided as follows:—

(a) That such Ordinances shall be subject to the advice and consent of the Council only so far as the provisions thereof relate to the Colony and to the Southern Provinces of the Protectorate, and such Ordinances shall be expressed to be enacted by the Governor of

the Colony and Protectorate of Nigeria, with the advice and consent of the Council, so far as the provisions thereof relate to the Colony and to the said Provinces;

(b) That subject to the foregoing proviso the provisions of the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922, relating to the making and establishing of Ordinances by the Governor of the Protectorate for the Northern Provinces thereof, shall apply to all Ordinances made under the authority of this article in all respects as if they were made under the authority of the said Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922.

XXV. If any Ordinance passed under the provisions of either of the two preceding Articles shall be in any respect repugnant to the provisions of any Letters Patent or of this Order or of any other Order made by His Majesty in Council, such Ordinance shall be read subject to such Letters Patent or Order, and shall to the extent of such repugnancy be absolutely void.

Nothing in this Order contained shall be construed to diminish or affect the powers of making Ordinances conferred upon the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, and upon the Governor of the Protectorate, or to confer any power upon the Council of making any Ordinance affecting the Northern Provinces of the Protectorate, save as provided in the preceding Article, or upon the Governor of the Protectorate of making any Ordinance affecting the Colony and Southern Provinces of the Protectorate.

XXVI. The Governor shall transmit to the Chief Justice of Nigeria, to be enrolled in the Supreme Court, a transcript, authenticated under the Public Seal and by his own signature, of every Ordinance made by the Governor under the provisions of the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922, and of every Ordinance passed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, and of every Bill reserved by him for the signature of His Majesty's pleasure. He shall also from time to time transmit to the Chief Justice, to be enrolled in the said Court, a certificate, under his hand and seal, of the effect of every Order or other direction which he may have received from His Majesty for confirming or disallowing the provisions of any such Ordinance or Bill which certificate shall in like manner be enrolled in the said Court, and there remain on record to the intent that the Judges of the said Court may, without further or other proof, take cognizance of all Ordinances made and promulgated for the peace, order, and good government of the Colony and the Protectorate, or any part thereof: Provided always that the Judges of the said Court have not, and shall not have, any right or authority to prevent or delay the enrolment of any such Ordinance or Bill, and that the validity thereof does not and shall not depend upon such enrolment.

XXVII. The Governor, if present, or, in the absence of the Governor, such Member of the Council as the Governor shall from time to time appoint, or in default thereof or in the absence of such Member, the Member present who stands first in order of precedence, shall preside at the meetings of the Council.

XXVIII. Every Member of the Council may, upon due notice being given, propose any Ordinance or resolution which does not im-

pose any tax or dispose of or charge any part of the public revenue.

XXIX. No Member of the Council may propose any Ordinance, vote or resolution the object or effect of which is to impose any tax or to dispose of or charge any part of the public revenue, unless such Ordinance, vote, or resolution shall have been proposed by the direction or with the express sanction of the Governor.

XXX. The Council shall not be disqualified for the transaction of business by reason of any vacancy or vacancies among the Members, but no business except that of adjournment shall be transacted unless there shall be present at least ten Members besides the Governor or other presiding Member.

XXXI. Subject to the provisions of this Order the Governor and the Council shall, in the transaction of the business of the Council, and the passing of, assenting to, and enrolment of Bills or Ordinances, conform as nearly as may be to the directions contained in any Instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet which may herewith or hereafter be addressed to the Governor in that behalf; but no Ordinance enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, shall be invalid by reason that in the enactment thereof any such Instructions were not duly observed.

XXXII. The Sessions of the Council shall be held at such times and places as the Governor shall from time to time by proclamation appoint. There shall be at least one Session of the Council in every year, and there shall not be an interval of twelve months between the last sitting of one Session and the first sitting of the next following Session. The first Session shall be held within six months from the coming into operation of this Order.

XXXIII. The Governor may at any time, by proclamation, prorogue the Council.

XXXIV. All questions proposed for debate in the Council shall be decided by the majority of votes, and the President shall have an original vote in common with the other Members of the Council, and also a casting vote if upon any question the votes shall be equal.

XXXV. The Governor may, with the advice of the Council, from time to time make, alter, revoke, or renew such Standing Rules and Orders as may be necessary to ensure punctuality of attendance of the Members of the said Council, and to prevent meetings of the said Council being holden without convenient notice to the several Members thereof, and to maintain order and method in the despatch of business and in the conduct of debates in the said Council, and to secure due deliberation in the passing of Ordinances, and to provide that before the passing of any Ordinance intended to affect the interests of private persons due notice of the provisions thereof is given to all persons concerned therein.

All such Rules and Orders, not being repugnant to any Letters Patent for the time being in force in the Colony, or to any Order of His Majesty in Council or to any Instructions which the Governor may receive from His Majesty, shall at all times be followed and observed and shall be binding upon the said Council unless the same or any of them shall be disallowed by His Majesty.

And until any such Rules and Orders shall be made, and subject to any Rules and Orders to be so made, the Standing Rules and Orders

of the Legislative Council of the Colony of Nigeria shall remain in force and apply, so far as the same are applicable thereto, to the Council established by this Order.

XXXVI. It shall be competent to any Member of the Council to propose any question relating to the affairs of Nigeria for debate therein, and if seconded by any other Member, such question shall be debated and disposed of in accordance with the Standing Rules and Orders: Provided always that every Ordinance, vote, resolution, or question, the object or effect of which may be to dispose of or charge any part of the public revenue, shall be proposed by the Governor, unless the proposal of the same shall have been directed or expressly sanctioned by him. Provided further that any resolution or question which any Member may propose to bring forward for debate shall be notified to the Governor at least ten days before the meeting of the Council.

XXXVII. Minutes shall be regularly kept of all the proceedings of the Council, and at each meeting of the Council the Minutes of the last preceding meeting shall be confirmed or amended, as the case may require, before proceeding to the despatch of any other business. The Governor shall transmit to His Majesty through a Secretary of State, as soon as possible after every meeting, a full and exact copy of the Minutes thereof.

XXXVIII. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Nigeria Gazette, and shall be published in the said Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within Nigeria.

XXXIX. From the date of the coming into operation of this Order the above recited Orders in Council, dated the Twenty-second day of November, 1913, and the Tenth day of August, 1914, shall be revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and thereupon the Nigerian Council shall cease to exist.

XL. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Devonshire, K.G., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the territories known as the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the Twenty-second day of November, 1913, and known as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1913, provision was made for the administration of the Government of the Territories therein defined and described as the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas by a further Order in Council bearing date the Tenth day of May, 1917, and known as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1917, the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1913, has been amended:

And whereas it is expedient to make further and other provision for the peace, order and good government of the Protectorate of Nigeria:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922.

II. This Order shall apply to the territories of Africa which are bounded on the south by the Atlantic Ocean, on the west, north, and north-east by the line of the frontier between the British and French territories, and on the east by the territories known as the Cameroons:

Provided always that such parts of the territories so bounded as are within that portion of His Majesty's Dominions which is known as the Colony of Nigeria shall not be included within the limits of this Order. The territories within the limits of this Order shall be known and described as the Protectorate of Nigeria.

III. In this Order, unless the subject or context otherwise requires,—

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors.

"Secretary of State" means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

"Treaty" includes any treaty, convention, agreement, or arrangement made by or on behalf of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, or of His Majesty, with any civilised Power, or with any Native tribe, people, chief, or king, and any regulation appended to any such treaty, convention, agreement or arrangement.

"Governor" means the Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Colony of Nigeria, and includes every person for the time being administering the Government of the said Colony.

"Colony" means the Colony of Nigeria.

"Nigeria" used without qualification means the Colony and Protectorate of Nigeria.

IV. The Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Colony of Nigeria (hereinafter called the Governor) shall be the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Protectorate of Nigeria, and he is hereby authorized, empowered and commanded to exercise on His Majesty's behalf all such powers and jurisdiction as His Majesty at any time before or after the passing of this Order had or may have within the said territories, and to that

end to take or cause to be taken all such measures and to do or cause to be done all such matters and things therein as are lawful and as in the interest of His Majesty's service he may think expedient, subject to such instructions as he may from time to time receive from His Majesty or through a Secretary of State.

V. The Protectorate shall be divided into two or more portions, each under the immediate administration of a Lieutenant-Governor appointed by His Majesty. Provided that every Lieutenant-Governor shall be under the control and authority of the Governor and subject to such instructions as he may from time to time receive from him.

And provided further that it shall be within the discretion of the Governor, subject always to the approval of a Secretary of State, to transfer a Lieutenant-Governor from the administration of one portion of the Protectorate to another portion, and to vary the limits of the area administered by a Lieutenant-Governor.

VI. Every person appointed to fill the Office of Governor shall, with all due solemnity, before entering on any of the duties of his Office, cause the Commission appointing him to be read and published at the seat of Government, in the presence of the Chief Justice or some other Judge of the Supreme Court, and of such Members of the Executive Council of the Colony and Protectorate as can conveniently attend, which being done, he shall then and there take before them the Oath of Allegiance in the form provided by an Act passed in the Session holden in the Thirty-first and Thirty-second years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the Law relating to Promissory Oaths"; and likewise the usual Oath for the due execution of the Office of Governor and for the due and impartial administration of Justice, which Oaths the said Chief Justice or Judge, or, if they be unavoidably absent, the senior Member of the Executive Council then present, is hereby required to administer.

VII. The Executive Council of the Colony of Nigeria shall be and be deemed to be the Executive Council of the Protectorate.

VIII. On and after a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Nigeria Gazette, there shall be a Legislative Council constituted in such manner and consisting of the Governor and such persons as are directed by His Majesty by an Order in His Privy Council bearing even date herewith and known as the Nigeria (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1922, or by any Order in Council amending or substituted for the same, or by any Instructions under His Sign Manual and Signet or through a Secretary of State.

IX. The persons who shall from time to time compose the said Legislative Council shall have full power and authority, subject always to any conditions, provisos and limitations prescribed by the said Order in Council, or by any other Order in Council, or by any Instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, to establish such Ordinances, and to constitute such Courts and Officers, and to make such provisions and regulations for the proceedings in such Courts, and for the administration of justice, as may be necessary for the peace, order, and good Government of that portion of the Protectorate of Nigeria known as the Southern Provinces:

Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation issued with His Majesty's approval signified through a Secretary of State to add to or otherwise vary the territories defined as the Southern Provinces for the purposes of this Order.

The Governor shall have a negative voice in the making and passing of all such Ordinances.

X. It shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by Ordinance, to provide for the administration of justice, the raising of revenue, and generally for the peace, order and good government of the Northern Provinces of the Protectorate, and of all persons therein, including the prohibition and punishment of acts tending to disturb the public peace.

XI. All Laws, Ordinances, Proclamations, byelaws and regulations of whatsoever nature in force at the date of the commencement of this Order within the Protectorate, or any of them, shall continue in force until repealed or revoked by or in pursuance of any Law or Ordinance passed by the Legislative Council or by the Governor, as the case may be.

XII. All Ordinances whether passed by the Legislative Council or by the Governor as aforesaid shall be subject to the following conditions or provisos:—

(1) Nothing in any such Ordinance or Ordinances contained shall take away or affect any rights secured to any natives in the Protectorate by any treaties or agreements made on behalf or with the sanction of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, or of His Majesty, and all such treaties and agreements shall be and remain operative and in force, and all pledges and undertakings therein contained shall remain mutually binding on all parties to the same.

(2) In the making of Ordinances any native laws by which the civil relations of any native chiefs, tribes, or populations under His Majesty's protection are now regulated shall be respected, except so far as the same may be incompatible with the due exercise of His Majesty's power and jurisdiction, or clearly injurious to the welfare of the said natives.

(3) Every suit, action, complaint, matter, or thing which shall be depending in any Court within the Protectorate at the commencement of this Order shall and may be proceeded with in such Court in like manner as if this Order had not been passed.

If any Ordinance to which the provisions of this Article apply shall be in any respect repugnant to the provisions of this Order or of any other Order made by His Majesty in Council, such Ordinance shall be read subject to such Order and shall to the extent of such repugnancy be absolutely void.

XIII. The right is hereby reserved to His Majesty to disallow any such Ordinances as aforesaid. Such disallowance shall be signified to the Governor through a Secretary of State, and shall take effect from the time when the same shall be promulgated by the Governor.

The right is also hereby reserved to His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to make all such Laws or Ordinances as may appear to Him necessary for the peace, order, and good government of the Protectorate or any part thereof as fully as if this Order had not been made.

XIV. When a Bill passed by the Legislative

Council is presented to the Governor for his assent, he shall, according to his discretion, but subject to any instruction addressed to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet or through a Secretary of State, declare that he assents thereto, or refuses his assent to the same, or that he reserves the same for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure.

No law shall take effect until either the Governor shall have assented thereto in His Majesty's name and on His behalf, and shall have signed the same in token of such assent, or until His Majesty shall have given His assent thereto through a Secretary of State.

Every Bill assented to or Ordinance enacted by the Governor shall be published in the Nigeria Gazette, and, unless it be otherwise provided in such Bill or Ordinance, shall take effect and come into operation as law, on the date of such publication.

A Bill reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure shall take effect so soon as He shall have given His assent to the same through one of His Principal Secretaries of State, and the Governor shall have signified such assent by message to the Legislative Council or by Proclamation: Provided that no such message shall be issued after two years from the day on which the Bill was presented to the Governor for his assent.

XV. In the making and establishing of all such Bills or Ordinances the Governor and the Legislative Council or the Governor, as the case may be, shall conform to and observe all rules, regulations and directions in that behalf contained in any Order in Council or in any Instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet.

XVI. Whenever and so often as the Governor is absent from the seat of Government, or is absent in the Colony, or on a passage between any places in Nigeria, or is in any of the territories adjacent to or near to Nigeria in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, he may continue to exercise and shall be deemed to be capable of exercising all and every the powers vested in him by this Order in Council or by any Instructions from His Majesty; and may by an instrument under the Public Seal appoint any person or persons to be his Deputy or Deputies within any part or parts of the Protectorate during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities by this Order in Council or otherwise vested in the Governor as shall in and by such instrument be specified and limited, but no others. Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided nevertheless that by the appointment of a Deputy or Deputies as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time hereafter think proper to direct.

XVII. Whenever the Office of Governor is vacant, or if the Governor is absent from the Protectorate, or becomes incapable, or is from any cause prevented from acting in the duties of his Office, then such person as may be appointed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, or if there be no such person so

appointed, or if such person be absent from Nigeria or unable to act, then the senior Member of the Executive Council present for the time being in Nigeria shall, during His Majesty's pleasure, administer the government of the Protectorate, first taking the Oaths hereinbefore directed to be taken by the Governor, and in the manner herein prescribed, which being done, the acting Governor is hereby authorized, empowered, and commanded to do and execute, during His Majesty's pleasure, all things that belong to the Office of Governor according to the tenour of this Order and according to His Majesty's Instructions and the laws of the Protectorate; provided that the Governor, whenever and so often as he is in the Colony, or on a passage between any places in Nigeria, or is in any of the territories adjacent to or near to Nigeria in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, shall not be considered to be absent from the Protectorate within the meaning of this Order in Council.

XVIII. Whenever one of the offices of Lieutenant-Governor becomes vacant, or if a Lieutenant-Governor is administering the Government of the Colony and Protectorate or is absent from Nigeria or otherwise becomes incapable of or is from any cause prevented from performing the duties of his office, the Governor may by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Protectorate appoint another officer to act provisionally as Lieutenant-Governor. Such officer shall cease to act as Lieutenant-Governor as soon as either His Majesty shall have appointed another officer to the office, or the substantive holder of the office shall again be capable of performing the duties of the office, or the Governor shall appoint another officer to act provisionally as Lieutenant-Governor.

XIX. The Governor may constitute and appoint all such Judges, Commissioners, Justices of the Peace and other necessary officers as may be lawfully constituted and appointed by His Majesty, all of whom, unless otherwise provided by law, shall hold their offices during His Majesty's pleasure.

XX. The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, dismiss any public officer not appointed by virtue of a Warrant from His Majesty whose pensionable emoluments do not exceed two hundred and twenty pounds a year, provided that in every such case the grounds of intended dismissal are definitely stated in writing, and communicated to the officer, in order that he may have full opportunity of exculpating himself, and that the matter is investigated by the Governor with the aid of the head for the time being of the department in which the officer is serving.

The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any office within the Protectorate, whether appointed by virtue of any Commission or Warrant from His Majesty or in His Majesty's name, or by any other mode of appointment. Such suspension shall continue and have effect only until His Majesty's pleasure therein shall be signified to the Governor. If the suspension is confirmed by a Secretary of State, the Governor shall forthwith cause the officer to be so informed, and thereupon his office shall become vacant. In proceeding to any such suspension, the

Governor is strictly to observe the directions in that behalf given to him by any Instructions from His Majesty or signified through a Secretary of State.

XXI. When any crime or offence has been committed within the Protectorate, or for which the offender may be tried therein, the Governor may, as he shall see occasion, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime or offence, who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender, or of any one of such offenders if more than one; and, further, may grant to any offender convicted in any Court, or before any Judge, Justice, Magistrate, or other officer within the Protectorate, a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence, for such period as the Governor thinks fit, and may remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures due or accrued to His Majesty.

XXII. The Seal now or hereafter in use as the Public Seal of the Colony of Nigeria shall be and be deemed to be also the Public Seal of the Protectorate of Nigeria, and shall be used for sealing all things whatsoever that shall pass the said Seal.

XXIII. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Nigeria Gazette, and shall be published in such Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Protectorate of Nigeria.

XXIV. The above-recited Orders in Council of the Twenty-second day of November, 1913, and the Tenth day of May, 1917, shall from the commencement of this Order be revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

XXV. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Devonshire, K.G., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE approved by Convocation on Tuesday, June 26, 1923.

Whereas it is expedient to amend *Statt. Tit. XIX § 19, cl. 13 (iv)* of the Statutes of the University of Oxford, by the addition of a further sub-clause (c) enabling Christ Church to reckon as an additional deduction as from

January 1, 1922, a sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred pounds when in any one year such a sum has been contributed by the Governing Body of Christ Church to the Chapter Fund in addition to the sum of fifteen thousand five hundred pounds assigned by the Statutes of Christ Church to the Chapter Fund, the University, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of every other power enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows.

In *Statt. Tit. XIX § 19, cl. 13 (iv)* (p. 356, ed. 1922), the following new sub-clause shall be added:—

"(c) As from January 1, 1922, a sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred pounds when in any one year such a sum has been contributed by the Governing Body of Christ Church to the Chapter Fund in addition to the said sum of fifteen thousand five hundred pounds."

FOREIGN ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Animals from the Channel Islands Prohibited.

1. Unless and until the Minister otherwise orders, it shall not be lawful to land any animal brought from the Channel Islands, and the First Schedule (Prohibited Countries and Parts of Countries) to the Foreign Animals Order of 1910 shall be read and have effect as if those Islands were included in the list of

Prohibited Countries and Parts of Countries mentioned in that Schedule.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

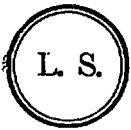
Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty three.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOREIGN ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1923.

EXPORTATION AND TRANSIT OF
HORSES, ASSES AND MULES
(AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Amendment of Article 5 of the Exportation and Transit of Horses, Asses and Mules Order of 1921.

1. Paragraph (1) of Article 5 of the Exportation and Transit of Horses, Asses and Mules Order of 1921, hereinafter referred to as the "Order of 1921," is hereby revoked, and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

"(1) Each horse, ass or mule shall be carried athwartships either in a separate stall or in a portable box. Each stall and the movable fittings thereof shall be numbered for purposes of identification: Provided that small ponies, asses, small mules, mares with foal at foot, and young unbroken

horses may be carried together in pens of suitable size formed either by removing the division boards between a number of stalls and by fastening a sufficient number of boards to the front of the stanchions under the breast rail to keep the animals in the pen, or by being constructed in some other equally suitable and effective manner."

2. Paragraph (26) of Article 5 of the Order of 1921 is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

"Unloading of Horses on the Continent on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Public Holidays.

"(26) Horses, asses or mules shall not be embarked in a vessel at a port in Great Britain if they cannot be discharged within a reasonable time after their arrival at the Continental port."

Carriage by Railway of Mixed Consignments.

3. Article 15 of the Order of 1921 shall be read and have effect as if the following additional provision were inserted therein:—

"(10) Small ponies, when carried in the same railway truck or other railway vehicle with horses, shall be separated therefrom by a suitable partition."

Amendment of Specifications for Fittings.

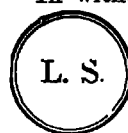
4. In the Order of 1921, the Schedule (*Specifications for certain fittings on vessels carrying horses, asses and mules*) shall be read and have effect as if, in the section headed "*Dimensions of Stalls*," the words "The space from foot platform to deck above horse's head shall be at least 7 ft. to the under side of the deck beam" were deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

"The space from foot platform to the deck above horse's head shall be at least 7 ft. in the clear, and the space from foot platform to the under side of the deck beam shall be at least 6 ft. 6 in. These requirements shall also apply in the case of portable boxes carried under deck cover."

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the EXPORTATION AND TRANSIT OF HORSES, ASSES AND MULES (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1923, and shall be read as one with the Order of 1921.

YORKSHIRE (EAST RIDING) (FOOT-
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
1923 (No 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries,
by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested
in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,
1894 to 1922, and of every other power
enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as
follows:—

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order:—

“The Prohibited Area” means the Area
in which the movement of animals is
hereby prohibited;

“The Controlled Area” means the Area
in which the movement of animals is
hereby controlled;

The Prohibited Area and the Controlled
Area are described in the Schedule hereto.
If any farm (excluding any detached part)
is partly within and partly outside the
Prohibited Area the whole shall be deemed
to be within that Area. Subject to this
provision, if any farm (excluding any de-
tached part) is partly within and partly
outside the Controlled Area the whole shall
be deemed to be within the Controlled
Area;

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats
and pigs;

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used
habitually and solely for the purpose of
slaughtering animals, but does not include
a slaughterhouse which forms part of a
farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Area.

2. (a) No animals shall be moved into or
out of the Prohibited Area, except as pro-
vided in the next following article;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or
across any road or other highway, or by
water, within the Prohibited Area, or be per-
mitted by the owner or person in charge
thereof to stray upon any such road or high-
way;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of ani-
mals shall be held in the Prohibited Area;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse
shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area
or be brought into contact with animals in
the Prohibited Area.

*Provision for Movement of Animals into
Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.*

3. Animals may be moved from premises
outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled
Area to which this Order applies to a
slaughterhouse in any borough or urban dis-
trict in the Prohibited Area, subject to the
following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement
must be obtained from the Local Authority
of the destination before the movement
commences. This licence must accompany
the animals throughout the whole move-
ment;

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a

station outside the Controlled Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

4. (a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area.

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Articles 3 or 5 of this Order:—

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

5. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Conditions of Licences.

6. (a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in the Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Area or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Area, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

8. (a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner

as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

11. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Order.

13. The Yorkshire (East Riding) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 is hereby revoked, but any notice served under that Order shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

15. This Order may be cited as the YORKSHIRE (EAST RIDING) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 2).

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of South Molton (hereinafter called "the Corporation," and whose address is the Town Hall, South Molton) have applied to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for all or some of the following, amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the Corporation to generate, store, supply, sell and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, throughout the borough of South Molton, in the county of Devon (hereinafter called "the area of supply").

2. The names of the streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified by the Order are as follows:—

Broad Street, South Street, Mill Street, Barnstaple Street, West Street, North Road, North Street, Parsonage Lane, New Road, East Street, King Street, Queen Street, East Street, north side of Cooks Cross.

3. To authorize the Corporation to open and break up the following streets which are not repairable by the local authority, namely:—

Broad Street, South Street (except Cooks Cross), Barnstaple Street, West Street, King Street, East Street and Factory Hill, East Street to Railway Station, and branch to Borners Bridge, Alswere New Road, Exeter Road, Georgenympton Road, Newnham Road, Barnstaple Old Road, Chittlehampton Road, Barnstaple New Road (North Road), Coombemartin Road, Roadway on Hacche Bridge over the Great Western Railway, Roadway on Aller Cross Bridge over the Great Western Railway.

4. To authorize the Corporation on the piece of land hereinafter described to erect, construct, maintain, alter, enlarge, renew, work and use a station or stations, together with all such buildings, engines, batteries, dynamos, accumulators and other plant, machinery, apparatus, works and conveniences as may be necessary or suitable for the generation, storage, transformation, distribution and supply of electricity for the purposes aforesaid or other purposes of the undertaking:—

A piece or parcel of land containing one fifth of an acre or thereabouts and called "Kitchen Park," which piece or parcel of

land abuts on Parsonage Lane, South Molton, and is part of the field or enclosure numbered 1003 on the 1/2500 Ordnance Survey Map of the borough of South Molton (Edition of 1904), Sheet No. xxii 5.

5. To exclude from incorporation some or all of the provisions contained in the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, or to incorporate the same with such modifications and exceptions as may be indicated in the Order, and to extend them to the undertaking to be authorized by the Order.

6. To authorize the Corporation to open, break up and interfere with all streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove, either above or underground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the area of supply, and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

7. To empower the Corporation to supply electrical energy for purposes incidental to the working or lighting of any railway situate partly within and partly without the area of supply and to fit up show rooms and offices and give exhibitions and demonstrations of the uses of electricity.

8. To authorize the Corporation to take, collect and recover rents, rates and charges for the supply of electricity for lighting, heating, power or other purposes, and for the use of any machines, lamps, meters, fittings or apparatus connected therewith, and to prescribe and limit the price to be charged therefor.

9. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, and the enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

NOTICE is hereby given, that at a Special and Monthly Meeting of the Council of the City of Birmingham, held pursuant to a Resolution of the Council fixing the same, and to Notice by the Lord Mayor, on Tuesday, the fifth day of June, 1923, at two o'clock in the afternoon, in the Council Chamber, at the Council House, the following Bye-laws and Regulations were made by the Council as the Local Authority for the City, and as the Promoters under the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to tramways, motor omnibuses and railless trolley vehicles within the City, under the powers conferred on them by the said Act, the Birmingham Corporation Act, 1903, the Birmingham Corporation Act, 1914, and the Birmingham Corporation Act, 1922:

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT
TO TRAMWAYS, MOTOR OMNIBUSES AND RAIL-
LESS TROLLEY VEHICLES.*Interpretation.*

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Birmingham; the expression "Tramways Undertaking" means the tramway, omnibus and railless trolley vehicle systems worked by the Corporation situate within the City of Birmingham; the word "Car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways and any motor omnibus or railless trolley vehicle or other vehicle owned and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of, a car; and the word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive the car.

The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform and not otherwise except at a terminus or other special place appointed by the Corporation.

Persons desiring to board a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.

Smoking.

3. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any car, except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

Objectionable Persons.

4. No person who is in a state of intoxication or is affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, or who from any other cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on a car shall mount or enter upon any car, and any such person may be prevented from mounting or entering any car, and if found in or upon any car may be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor.

Offensive Language or Conduct, etc.

5. No person shall spit or swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively or sing or play upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or waste paper or other refuse in or upon any car, tramway station, waiting room, premises or buildings used in connection with the Tramways Undertaking, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or premises as aforesaid, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Damaging Cars.

6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Offensive Clothing.

7. No person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation soil or injure the seats, lining or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any other passenger, and no person who in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall enter or remain in or upon any car. Any such person may be prevented from mounting or entering such car, and if found in or upon any car shall, on the request of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned or tendered to him, and upon his refusing to do so he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Payment of Fares.

8. Each passenger shall upon demand and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not before leaving the car pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally payable for his journey and accept a ticket therefor.

Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

Any passenger paying for a stage less than the whole journey run by the car shall be deemed to have completed his journey at the end of the stage paid for; if the passenger remains on the car he shall pay the fare legally payable for the remainder of his journey as a new passenger.

Tickets.

9. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required to do so either deliver up his ticket or in default thereof pay the fare legally de-

mandable. No passenger shall alter, cut, tear or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible. Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available for the car on which they are issued, except as provided by Regulation 14.

Luggage.

10. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not elsewhere.

Travelling on Steps, etc.

11. No person not being an officer or duly authorised servant of the Corporation shall travel or ride on the steps, platform, outside rails, buffers or guards of any car, or stand on the platform or on the upper deck of any car, or sit on the outside rail on the upper deck or on any part of any car not intended for passengers, and any person so travelling, riding, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor or other duly authorised servant of the Corporation.

No Person to Hold or Hang on a Car.

12. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers except on the lower deck of the carriage with the consent of the conductor.

Entering Full Cars.

13. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to carry the conductor may place a chain across the entrance to such car, and no person shall remove such chain or enter or board any such car. Any person in a car remaining unseated after the licensed seating accommodation of the car is filled shall leave the car immediately upon the request of the conductor.

Disabled Cars.

14. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same; and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares.

Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

15. No person, other than the conductor or driver, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, platform chains, or any part of a car or its equipments, or signal a car to start. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Entering or Leaving a Car when in Motion.

16. No person shall enter, board or leave or attempt to enter, board or leave any car in motion.

Dogs.

17. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any car except by permission of the conductor. Any dog or other

animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms, etc.

18. No person shall place upon or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or any article, instrument or implement, or any utensil or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any car or the clothing of any passengers.

Obstructing Officers in Exercise of Duty.

19. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway of the Corporation.

Impeding Traffic.

20. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on any of the tramways of the Corporation.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

21. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Bye-laws, shall in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-Laws.

22. Every inspector, conductor or driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof.

Penalty.

23. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Copy of Bye-Laws to be hung on Cars.

24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

25. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of September, 1923.

From and after the said day of September, 1923, the Bye-laws and Regulations relating to Tramways which were made on the 2nd day of March, 1909, by the Corporation as the Local Authority with respect to Tramways within the City of Birmingham or as the promoters of the Birmingham Corporation Tramways, which Bye-laws and Regulations were respectively certified by the Board of Trade on the 8th day of May, 1909, shall be severally repealed.

And this Notice is given in pursuance of Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and of Part II of Schedule C to that Act.
