

THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF BERKS.

Whereas by sub-Section (4) of Section 7 of the Roads Act, 1920, it is enacted that the Minister of Transport may, by order on the application of any County Council (as defined in Section 17 of the Act), after holding a public inquiry, prohibit or restrict, subject to such exceptions or conditions as to occasional user or otherwise, as may be specified in the order, the driving of mechanically-propelled vehicles of any specified class on any specified highway within the area of the Council in any case in which it appears to him, as the result of the inquiry, to be proved that a vehicle of that class cannot be used on that highway without endangering the safety of the vehicle or the persons therein, or of other traffic using the highway, or that the highway is unsuitable for use by a vehicle of that class;

And whereas the County Council of Berks have made application to the Minister of Transport for an Order to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section prohibiting the

driving of heavy motor cars upon Windsor Bridge at a speed exceeding five miles an hour;

Notice is hereby given that C. G. Mitchell, Esquire, B.Sc., A.M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Transport, will attend at the Town Hall, Windsor, on Friday, the Third day of August, 1923, at Eleven o'clock in the Forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application;

And notice is hereby further given that any persons interested may attend such Inquiry, and be heard with reference to the said application: Provided that no person shall be entitled to be heard at the Inquiry unless he has on or before the Twentieth day of July, 1923, sent a notice in writing to the Minister of his desire to be heard at the Inquiry.
