WHEREAS a humble Address has been presented to His Majesty by the Commons House of Parliament, pursuant to subsection (4) of Section three of the Nurses Registration Act, 1919, praying that a certain amendment to the Rules made by the General Nursing Council of England and Wales (which said amendment was approved by the Minister of Health on the 24th day of May, 1923) might be modified in the manner set forth in the said Address:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the said Nurses Registration Act, 1919, to order that the said amendment be modified in accordance with the terms of the said Address, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- (1) The amendment of Rule made by the General Nursing Council of England and Wales, and approved by the Minister of Health on the 24th day of May, 1923, shall be modified and shall have effect as follows:—
 - "After Rule 9 (1) (f) insert—
 - '(g) In the case of a nurse who was at 1st November, 1916, engaged in actual practice,

and who produces the following evidences of knowledge and experience:

'(a) A certificate of good character;

'(b) A certificate signed by a matron of a general hospital or an infirmary or by two medical men, setting out that the applicant has been in attendance upon the sick in the capacity of a nurse for a period of not less than three years prior to the 1st November, 1919; and

'(c) A certificate signed by a registered nurse and by two medical men, one of whom shall be on the staff of a general hospital, setting out that the applicant has adequate knowledge and experience of medical and surgical nursing, and is competent to attend upon the sick in the capacity of a nurse:

'Provided that the Council may require the applicant, as a condition precedent to registration to present herself for special inquiry before a medical officer or officers

appointed by the Council.'

(2) This Order may be cited as the General Nursing Council (England and Wales) Rules Modification Order, 1923, and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any of the provisions of the said Act, and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things, by any such Order in Council to make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to Ireland as may appear to Him necessary or proper in order to give effect to the provisions of the said Act; and also to make any adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to England or Scotland as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of any change effected by the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Miscellaneous Adaptations) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1923.
- 2. The modifications and adaptations set out in this Order shall have effect as from the date of this Order save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in

Council under that Act, and, subject as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland, 'to repeal or alteration by Acts of that Parliament.

- 3.—(1) Where by any enactment relating to services other than Irish services, any Order, regulation, notice or other document is required or authorized to be published in the Dublin Gazette, the enactment, in its application to Northern Ireland, shall be construed as requiring or authorizing the publication of the document in the Belfast Gazette instead of in the Dublin Gazette.
- (2) Article 7 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 1) Order, 1922, shall cease to have effect.
- 4.—(1) If under section sixty-three of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, arrangements are made by the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland (in this Article referred to as the Ministry) for the carrying out of the verification or re-verification of local standards of measure and weight in Northern Ireland by officers of the Board of Trade, and by means of comparison with standards approved by the Board of Trade, instead of by means of comparison with the Northern Ireland secondary standards, the following provisions shall, during the continuance of such arrangements but no longer, have effect, namely:—
 - (a) The provisions of articles 8, 9 and 10 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1922, so far as they relate to Northern Ireland secondary standards, shall be suspended in their operation;
 - (b) References in the Acts to the Board of Trade standards shall be construed as references to the standards approved by the Board of Trade for use in lieu of Northern Ireland secondary standards in pursuance of the arrangements made by the Ministry as aforesaid, and the provisions of the Acts relating to the verification or re-verification of local standards shall apply to Northern Ireland accordingly;
 - (c) Notwithstanding anything in the Acts, the Ministry may by Order direct that all local standards in Northern Ireland shall be verified under this Article on or before such date (not being later than six months after the coming into force of the arrangements made by the Ministry as aforesaid) as the Ministry may think fit, and that the time within which any such local standards are required to be re-verified shall be extended to the date specified in the Order.
- (2) This article shall be construed as one with Part III of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order,
- of Judicature Act (Ireland), 1877, shall, in its application to the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, have effect so as to enable any ordinary Judge of the Court of Appeal in Northern Ireland to assist in transacting the business of any Division of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland, if, by reason either of the amount of such business or of the absence of a Judge or Judges through illness it is found expedient that such ordinary Judge should so assist.

6. Section twenty of the Superannuation Act, 1834, in its application to any person appointed, whether before or after the date of this Order, to an office in a public department of the Government of Northern Ireland, who, at the time of his appointment was or is in receipt of a superannuation allowance or compensation payable out of the Consolidated

Fund or moneys provided by the Parliament of the United Kingdom, such as is mentioned in that section, shall have effect as if the expression "any office in any public department" included an office in a public department of that Government.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 28th day of June, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

'We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Pilton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wadenhoe, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Northampton and in the Diocese of Peterborough:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Pilton and Wadenhoe duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified

in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical
Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in

the said Report:

And whereas both of the said Benefices of Pilton and Wadenhoe are now full, the Reverend John Edward Newby being the

present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the said John Edward Newby has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and pro-

posed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

say:—
"1. That the said Benefice of Pilton and
the said Benefice of Wadenhoe shall be permanently united together and form Benefice with cure of souls under the style of United Benefice of Pilton with Wadenhoe,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

- "2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said John Edward Newby if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Pilton and Wadenhoe shall be the first Incumbent of the United
- "3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Pilton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of
- the United Benefice.

 "4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presenta-tion shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Pilton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Wadenhoe having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after

the union and every alternate turn thereafter.
"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together

with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stat d transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical

Commissioners :

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Peterborough has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a

City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice ') of Brassington, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Brassington is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Margaret Holgate Newington, the Wife of Campbell Newington, of Oakover, Ticehurst, in the County of Sussex, Gentleman:

"And whereas the said Margaret Holgate Newington is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Brassington now vested in her as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwell

for the time being:

"And whereas the right Reverend Edwyn, now Bishop of Southwell, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Brassington which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Brassington:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Margaret Holgate Newington (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Brassington, now vested in her, the said Margaret Holgate Newington as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 28th day of June, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of East Ham, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of East Ham is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of East Ham, which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate Disttrict any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance

with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter III:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of East Ham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint George, East Ham '.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint George, East Ham, being:—

" All that part of the Parish of East Ham, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Alban, Upton Park, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Upton Park, from the said Parish of East Ham at the junction of Barking Road with the road called Kimberley Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Kimberley Avenue for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Rancliffe Road, and extending thence first south eastward and then eastward along the middle of Rancliffe Road for a distance of 133 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Basil Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Basil Avenue for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Pulleyns Avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Pulleyns Avenue for a distance of 64 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sandford Road, and extending thence first southward, then south eastward and then south westward along the middle of Sandford Road for a distance of 381 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Lonsdale Avenue, and extending thence in a straight line due south for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Northern Outfall Sewer, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the Northern Outfall Sewer for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Boundary Road across the said sewer, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of East Ham from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow.'

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the Parish of East Ham, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Castleford, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Castleford is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Castleford which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and such Church is named 'The Church of Saint Paul, Glass Houghton'

- "And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £250 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or New Parish so soon as a Minister or Incumbent shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:
- "And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £250 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:
- "And whereas by virtue of a certain Deed of Agreement bearing date on or about the 16th day of December, 1901, prior to the consecration of the said Church of Saint Paul, Glass Houghton, and made or purporting to be made under the provisions of the Acts of the 8th and 9th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 70, and of the 11th and 12th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, the Patronage or right of nominating or presenting the first and all succeeding Ministers to serve the said Church became, on the consecration of such Church, vested in the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrymple, Archbishop of York, and his successors, Archbishops of York, for ever:
- "And whereas the said Patronage of or right of presentation to the said Church of Saint Paul, Glass Houghton, is now vested in the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, and his successors, and will continue to be so vested in him and them together with the right of Patronage of and presentation to the District or New Parish which is thereinafter recommended to be constituted:
- "Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Castleford which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of Saint Paul, Glass Houghton.'
- "And we further recommend and propose that the said Church of Saint Paul, Glass Houghton, shall, as from the day last mentioned be, and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Glass Houghton.
- "And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other

measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

- "The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.
- "The New Parish of Saint Paul, Glass Houghton, being:—
- "All that part of the Parish of Castleford, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the Civil Parish of Glass Houghton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Castleford, out of which it is intended that the District or New Parish recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the negistrar of the said Diocese of York.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 7TH JULY 1923.)

YORKSHIRE (EAST RIDING) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DÎSEASE) ORDÉR OF 1923 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order:

'The Prohibited Area "means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

"The Controlled Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby

controlled;

The Prohibited Area and the Controlled Area are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part; is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

" Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and

"Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Area.

- 2. (a) No animals shall be moved into or out of the Prohibited Area, except as provided in the next following article;
- (b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;
- (c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Prohibited Area;
- (d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Area.

- Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.
- 3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to which this Order applies to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in the Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:-
 - (i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;
 - (ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Controlled Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

- 4. (a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area.
- (b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Articles 3 or 5 of this Order:-
 - (i) into the Controlled Area; or
 - (ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;
- (c) No animal shall be permitted by the. owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;
- (d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter. A licence A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;
- (e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such

Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

- 5. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:-
 - (a) From premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;
 - (b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or sale in such Area;
 - (c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;
 - (d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Conditions of Licences.

- 6. (a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate;
- (b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in the Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in the latter Area.
- (c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;
- (d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;
- (e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;
- (f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept sparate as far as practicable from all other animals;
- (g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;
- (h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Area or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Area, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

- 8. (a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;
- (b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.
