APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of

Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for six Hackney Carriages, at Ferry Road, Barnes, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

On North side of roadway, commencing at a point opposite the side entrance to No. 1 Castelnau, extending Westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for six carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.

**TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.
CHAIN TRADE BOARD (GREAT
BRITAIN).**

PROPOSAL TO CANCEL MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR HAND-HAMMERED CHAIN MAKING FROM IRON SUPPLIED BY THE EMPLOYER, AND TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR HAND-HAMMERED CHAIN MAKING, WHETHER OR NOT THE IRON IS SUPPLIED BY THE EMPLOYER.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, respectively, the Trade Board established under that Act in Great Britain for the Hand-Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain Making Trade HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO CANCEL the General Minimum Time Rates and General Minimum Piece Rates for workers in the Hand-Hammered Chain Trade set out in the Notice C. (15) issued by the Trade Board, and dated

17th November, 1922 (which apply to workers employed in the making of hand-hammered chain from iron supplied by the employer), and to FIX General Minimum Time Rates and General Minimum Piece Rates for workers in the Hand-Hammered Chain Trade by providing that the General Minimum Time Rates and General Minimum Piece Rates set out in the Notice C. (15) shall apply in the manner and subject to the conditions specified in that Notice, to workers employed in the Hand-Hammered Chain Trade, whether or not the iron is supplied by the employer.

Under the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, in cases where the iron is provided by or at the expense of the worker, the employer is under obligation, in addition to paying the worker at not less than the Minimum Rates Fixed by the Trade Board, to re-imburse the worker for her necessary expenditure in connexion with the provision of the iron.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Cancel and to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 17th July, 1923. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Chain Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

Temporary (Reconstruction) Regulations for competitive selection for appointment to the Junior Grade of the Administrative Class (Men) in the Home Civil Service.

1. *Age.*—Candidates must have been born on or after the 1st January, 1881, and before the 2nd August, 1891.

2. *Nationality.*—Candidates must be natural-born British subjects.

3. *Military Service.*—Candidates must have served in His Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces for at least one year between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, unless retired or discharged on account of sickness or wounds after less than one year's service between those dates.

4. *Government Service.*—Candidates must have been serving on the 1st July, 1921, in a temporary administrative or clerical post in a Government Department or in the War Department, Admiralty or Air Ministry establishments or have rendered six months' approved service in such temporary post prior to that date. This service must have been rendered in a civilian capacity; and temporary service rendered prior to the service in His Majesty's Forces required under Clause 3 cannot be accepted as qualifying under this clause.

5. *Health and Character.*—Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from active employment by a physical impairment due to the war and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of ordinary administrative duties.

6. *Application.*—Candidates must make application on the appropriate form, which may be obtained from the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, 6, Burlington Gardens, London, W. 1.

7. *Qualifying Examination.*—Candidates will undergo a qualifying examination in the following subjects :—

English.
 Arithmetic,
 General Knowledge,

and those whom the Civil Service Commissioners judge to approximate to the standard of ability usually obtained from open competitive examinations for these situations will be summoned for interview by the Selection Board (Clause 8).

8. *Competition.*—Candidates who have been admitted to and have passed the quali-

fyng examination will be summoned for interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for appointment in order of merit and subject to the existence of vacancies those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications. The decision of the Selection Board will be final.

9. *Warning.*—Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application, through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. *Fee.*—Every candidate is required to pay a fee of ten shillings, payable when the application form is sent in.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that a Competition (Qualifying Examination followed by Selection Board) will be held under the foregoing Regulations. The Qualifying Examination will be held in London only, commencing on the 25th October, 1923.

No person will be admitted to the Competition from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 13th September, 1923, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

In conformity with the provisions of the Statute, 56 & 57, Victoria, Chapter 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State in Council proposes with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners at the expiration of 40 days from the date of this Gazette to make the following changes in the rules under S.97 (1) and (2) of the Government of India Act, for the probation in the United Kingdom and the further examination of Selected Candidates for the Indian Civil Service recruited by competitive examinations held in the United Kingdom or in India.

(1) At the Final Examination for one-year probationers it is proposed (a) to increase the marks for Vernacular language from 400 to 600; (b) to reduce the marks for Indian Penal Code from 400 to 200 and for Hindu and Mohammedan Law from 450 to 400 and (c) to cease prescribing in the rules a particular period of British History and to allot to that subject 600 marks.

(2) At the Intermediate Examination for two-year probationers it is proposed (a) to add as a new subject of examination "Phonetics—200 marks" and (b) to cease prescribing in the rules a particular period of British History and to allot to that subject 600 marks.

(3) At the Final Examination for two-year probationers it is proposed (a) to increase the marks for Vernacular from 400 to 600; (b) to reduce the marks for Indian Penal Code from 400 to 200; (c) to remove "Hindu and Mohammedan Law 400 marks" from the list of compulsory subjects and to include it among the optional subjects, and (d) to cease prescribing in the rules a particular period of European History and to allot to that subject 600 marks.

(4) For probationers assigned to Bombay it is proposed to prescribe Sanskrit as an alternative to Persian in the list of optional classical languages.

It is intended that the amended regulations shall apply to all candidates to be selected on the results of the competitions held in 1923 in India and in London. The changes will not, however, affect those candidates selected in 1922 who are now on probation in this country.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 13TH JULY 1923.)

NOTTS AND DERBY SWINE - FEVER INFECTED AREA ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area to which this Order Applies.

1. This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, referred to in this Order as "the Infected Area."

Restriction on Movement of Swine into, out of, or within Infected Area.

2.—(1) The movement of swine into or out of the Infected Area, or along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Infected Area, is prohibited except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority in accordance with this Order: Provided that this Order shall not affect or prevent the movement of swine through the Infected Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(2) No swine shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Infected Area.

Markets, etc., of Swine in Infected Area to be restricted to Fat Swine only.

3. No market, sale, or exhibition of swine shall be held in any market, fairground, sale-

yard or place of exhibition in the Infected Area, unless it is restricted to fat swine intended for immediate slaughter, and then only in accordance with the following conditions, namely:—

(a) A licence shall be obtained from the Local Authority authorising the holding of the market, sale or exhibition.

(b) All swine exposed at such market, sale or exhibition shall be removed therefrom direct to a slaughterhouse, and shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority specifying the slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.

Licences for Movement of Swine into Infected Area.

4. Where the movement required is governed by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, the licence necessary under that Order shall be sufficient authority for the movement of swine into the Infected Area. Where the movement is not affected by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, a licence for the movement of swine into the Infected Area may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the swine are to be moved. The licence, which may be granted for movement for any purposes, shall be in the Form C with the necessary adaptation. No declaration is required to be produced to obtain the licence.

Licences for Movement of Swine within or out of the Infected Area.

5.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority for the following movements of swine from premises within the Infected Area to premises in or outside the Infected Area, viz.:—

From premises in the Infected Area (other than a market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition)—

(a) to a licensed market, sale or exhibition in the Infected Area (licence Form C); or

(b) to a slaughterhouse in or outside the Infected Area (licence Form C); or

(c) to private premises in or outside the Infected Area (licence Form A, or, if for breeding purposes, Form C); or

(d) to a vessel direct for shipment or to any premises for detention until shipment (licence Form C).

From a licensed Market, sale or exhibition in the Infected Area,—

to a slaughterhouse either within or outside the Infected Area (licence Form C).

(2) Before a licence (Form A) or (Form C) is granted under paragraphs (c) and (d) of this Article the owner of the swine, or his authorised agent shall sign and produce or send to the Inspector a declaration in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order. The Inspector shall retain the declaration, and before granting the licence shall satisfy himself as far as practicable as to the correctness of the statements contained therein. No declaration is required before granting a licence for movement of swine to a licensed market, sale or exhibition, or to a slaughterhouse.

Conditions of Movement.

Detention and Isolation at Destination for 28 days of Swine moved with Licence (Form A.)

Marking of Swine moved to a slaughterhouse.

6.—(1) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) shall not, for a period of 28 days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if the swine are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in the next following paragraph of this Article, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C). Swine while detained during the said period of 28 days shall be kept separate from all other swine. This Article does not prohibit the movement of the carcase of a pig slaughtered on the premises during the said period of 28 days.

(2) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse, they shall, before the movement to the slaughterhouse commences, be marked by and at the expense of the owner, by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long, and on arrival at the slaughterhouse the swine shall be detained there until slaughtered.

(3) Swine while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other swine.

Provisions as to Licences.

7.—(a) Licences may be granted under this Order only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences;

(b) A movement licence shall not be granted by an Inspector if, in his opinion, it is undesirable to grant it, or for any movement of swine which is prohibited by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922;

(c) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(d) Licences must be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement by the owner or person in charge;

(e) Licences (other than licences—Form C—specifically marked “for Breeding purposes”) shall only be available for eight days including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement. Licences (Form C) specifically marked “for Breeding purposes” shall be available for 28 days, inclusive of the date thereof. If required for the purpose of service, the swine referred to therein may be moved under the authority of the licence to the same premises either on one or two occasions within the said period of 28 days, and back to the original premises

from which it was moved. The swine shall, on return to the original premises, be detained thereon for a period of 28 days from the date of return; provided that where movement on two occasions takes place under the licence the said period of 28 days' detention shall commence on the date of return after the second movement;

(f) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the swine moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or Constable, and such person shall if required by such officer give his name and address.

Forms.

8. The Licences (Forms A and C) required for use under this Order shall be in the forms set forth in the Second Schedule to the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, with the necessary adaptations. The declaration (Form B) shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Terms.

9. "Slaughterhouse" includes bacon factory; other terms used in this Order have the same meaning as in the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

10. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

11. Any contraventions of this Order or of the conditions of any licence issued thereunder, or the making of any false statement in any declaration required thereunder, shall

be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the NOTTS AND DERBY SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA ORDER OF 1923.

SHEEP SCAB (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Regulations of Local Authority as to Sheep brought into, or moved within, their District; as to Compulsory Dipping of Sheep; or as to keeping of Registers by Sheep Dealers.

1. Article 12 of the Sheep Scab Order of 1920 is hereby revoked, and the following Article is substituted therefor:—

“ 12.—(1) A Local Authority may, with the view of preventing the introduction or the spreading of sheep scab, make Regulations—

(a) for requiring the owner or person in charge of sheep which have been moved from the District of any other Local Authority or from Ireland or the Isle of Man to a place of destination in their District (other than a market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition or a place of temporary detention at which the sheep do not remain for more than seven days after arrival in the District) to notify forthwith the arrival of the sheep to an Inspector of the Local Authority, and to dip the sheep twice in manner prescribed by the Regulations with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the two dippings;

(b) for regulating the subsequent movement of sheep which have been moved from the District of any other Local Authority or from Ireland or the Isle of Man to a place of destination in their District (including a market, fairground, saleyard, place of exhibition, or place of temporary detention at which the sheep do not remain for more than seven days after arrival in the District), and for requiring the owner of such sheep or the occupier of any premises to which sheep have been so subsequently moved to notify forthwith the arrival of the sheep to an Inspector of the Local Authority;

(c) for regulating the movement of sheep from any part of the District to any other part of the District;

(d) for prohibiting the movement of sheep to any premises in the District (including a market, fairground, saleyard, place of exhibition, or place of temporary detention at which sheep do not remain for more than seven days after arrival thereat), unless the sheep have within such period as may be prescribed by the Regulations been dipped twice in an efficient sheep dip with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the two dippings and have since such second dipping been kept separate from sheep not so dipped, and are accompanied by such certificate or declaration as to the sheep having been so dipped as may be prescribed by the Regulations.

Regulations under this paragraph may be applied to sheep moved from Ireland or the Isle of Man, or from any District of a Local Authority, and also to sheep within the District.

(e) for prescribing, regulating, and securing the periodical treatment of all sheep in the District, or in any part thereof, by effective dipping in an efficient sheep-dip;

(f) for requiring every sheep dealer to keep a register open to inspection by any Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, or by a police constable, with such particulars of his purchases and sales of sheep as may be prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) A Local Authority may, in any regulations made by them under this Article, insert provisions for the exemption from any dipping required by such Regulations of sheep which in the opinion of the Local Authority it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of such Regulations on account of their being intended for immediate slaughter, or for exhibition, or of any other special circumstances. Any such exemption shall be subject to such conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise as may be inserted in the exemption.

(3) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to the Minister for confirmation and been confirmed by him. Drafts of the proposed Regulations should be submitted before the Regulations are made by the Local Authority. For the purpose of confirmation the Regulations as made by the Local Authority, or two certified copies thereof, should be sent to the Minister.

(4) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

(5) If the Minister with respect to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under this Order, is satisfied after consultation with the Local Authority that the revocation thereof is necessary or expedient, the Minister may by notice to the Local Authority direct the revocation thereof and the same shall thereupon cease to operate as directed in the notice."

Revocation.

2. The Sheep Scab (Amendment) Order of 1921 is hereby revoked.

Continuance of Existing Regulations.

3. Regulations made by any Local Authority under the Order and Article hereby revoked shall, subject to confirmation by the Minister, if this has not been obtained, operate as if this Order had not been made.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP SCAB (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1923.
