The following Address was presented to The KING on Tuesday, the 17th instant, on the occasion of the re-opening of Westminster Hall:—

His Majesty's Office of Works.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY.

The restoration of this noble and unique roof, which has extended over a period of eight years, constitutes another landmark in the life of Westminster Hall, so intimately associated with the history of this country for more than 8 centuries.

The present roof was erected by King Richard II. in the years 1394-1399. It is unsurpassed as an example of mediæval carpentry, and is the finest open timber framed roof in the world. Repairs were undertaken in 1663, in 1747-8, and again in 1821 and 1850. The present scheme of preservation has aimed at retaining as much as possible of the original timber, and this has been accomplished by the insertion of a braced steel frame practically invisible from the floor of the Hall. Slightly less than 10 per cent. of new oak has been used for the essential repairs of decayed beams and posts. We feel confident that we have been successful in giving the roof a long new lease of life, while completely preserving its character.

Your Majesties were pleased to visit the Hall during the progress of the work, when the methods employed and the difficulties encountered were fully explained.

The restoration work has been designed and carried out by Sir Frank Baines, the Director of Works of Your Majesty's Office of Works, after the scheme had been examined and recom-

mended by the Ancient Monuments Board for England.

The gracious visit of Your Majesties on this occasion is a welcome token of the interest you have been pleased to take in the work, and at the same time adds one more notable event to the history of this Hall.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

It is with the utmost pleasure that the Queen and I have come here to-day to celebrate the re-opening of Westminster Hall on the completion of the restoration of its noble world-famed roof, erected five centuries ago.

Westminster Hall appeals in a special manner to the mind and imagination of the whole English-speaking race. For centuries it has witnessed the growth of the Constitution, and has been, as it were, a link between the Crown and the People. In far-off days it was the great hall of the King's Palace, and more recently the seat of the highest Law Courts of the Kingdom. So during the eight years that it was closed we seemed temporarily to have lost a priceless treasure of our national life.

The Queen and I were greatly interested some months ago to see the repairs in progress, and thus were able to realise how the serious dangers and defects had been made good with the least possible interference with either the design or material of the original roof.

In common with all lovers of ancient and historic buildings, I wish to express my warm thanks and congratulations to the Ancient Monuments Board, the Director of Works and his Staff, and to all the workmen engaged upon the restoration, for their skill and untiring, devoted labours, which have co-operated towards so successful an achievement. Much of their work is hidden from the public eye: nevertheless to them be the credit for having given, I sincerely trust, centuries of new life to this masterpiece of British Architecture.

- 5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

- 6 The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th July, 1923, to Saturday, the 4th August, 1923, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1923, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

YORKSHIRE (EAST RIDING) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries. by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area Affected.

- 1.—(1) This Order applies to the area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the Area referred to as the Prohibited Area.
- (2) If any farm (except any detached partis partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Prohibited Area.

- 2.—(a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Area is prohibited, except as provided in the next following article, provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.
- (b) The movement of any such animal along or across any road or other highway, or by water within the Prohibited Area is prohibited
- (c) No such animal shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Area.
- (d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse

- in any borough or urban district in that Area, subject to the following conditions:—
 - (i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.
 - (ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.
 - (iii) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

- 4.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority
- (2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.
- (3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

- 5.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.
- (2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

6. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7. Any contravention of this Order, or of any notice served thereunder, is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation of Previous Order.

8 The Yorkshire (East Riding) (Foot-and Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 3) is hereby revoked, but any notice served under that Order shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

10. This Order may be cited as the Yorkshire (East Riding) (Foot and Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 4).
