BOOT AND FLOOR POLISH TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

**PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE
AND FEMALE WORKERS.**

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated, respectively, 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Boot and Floor Polish Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Floor Polish) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, THAT THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work, Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates at present effective for Male and Female Workers, and set out in the Trade Board's Notice B.P. (2), dated 16th March, 1922, the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

PART II.

SECTION I.

In the application of the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I. of this Notice, the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period whose usual working week, as agreed between the employer and the workers, consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, " a week " means a week of the number of hours usually worked by the class in question as so agreed:
- (b) In all other cases, " a week " means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.

For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment, the weekly rates set out in Sections I and II of Part I of this Notice must be divided:

- (a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) above, by the number of hours constituting the usual working week as agreed between the employer and the workers;
- (b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.

Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II must be made for ALL hours of employment (not merely for those constituting " a week," as described in Section I), except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of Part IV of this Schedule.

In the case of all workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER, that is, a worker of ordinary skill and experience, not less than the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate.

PART IV.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Parts I and III of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part IV of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice B.P. (2), dated 16th March, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the before-mentioned Notice B.P. (2) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART V.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Floor Polish) Order, 1920, and in Part V of the Trade Board's Notice B.P. (2), dated 16th March, 1922.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 24th July, 1923. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Boot and Floor Polish Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

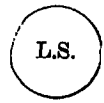

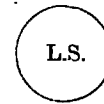
