"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that the scale of Prize Money for proficiency in rifle shooting payable to Royal Marines authorized by Your Order in Council of the 20th June, 1922, should be revised to meet present requirements consequent on the adoption by the Royal Marines of new Army Range Courses:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment of Prize Money to Royal Marines for proficiency

in rifle shooting on the following scale as from the date the new courses are adopted:—

10s. for Marksman and 1d. a point for each point above the score required to qualify as Marksman in the prescribed Army Annual Range courses.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is

enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that the enhanced complexity of the fire control equipment in certain Aircraft carriers in Your Majesty's Navy justifies payment in these vessels of the higher fire control allowance of 3d. a day authorized by Your Orders in Council of 9th October, 1919, and 11th October, 1921:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize as from the 22nd June, 1923, payment in Aircraft Carriers of the higher fire control allowance of 3d. a day to a total of not more than three ratings of the branches of Your Majesty's Navy named in the Orders in Council cited.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, bearing date the 25th day of July, 1921, to sanction the institution of a scheme of entry of Surgeon Lieutenants for Short Service in the Royal Navy, and to provide that Surgeon Lieutenants so entered should receive full pay at the rate of 26s. 6d. a day:

"And whereas by Schedule V, Section X, Clause 9 of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, provision is made for the rates of full pay,

etc., of Officers of Your Majesty's Navy which were established by that Order to be subject to review on or after the 1st July, 1924:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the rate of full pay of Surgeon Lieutenants entered for short service on or after the 1st April, 1923, should be liable to variation in like manner:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the rate of full pay of such Officers being subject to review on or after the 1st July, 1924.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**WHEREAS** in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and various Orders amending the aforesaid Orders:

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Orders as amended should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Orders made under the said Acts shall have effect as if the words "and, without prejudice to any other method of enforcement, any award of the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal may by leave of the High Court or a judge thereof, or in Scotland of the Court of Session, be enforced in the same manner as a judgment or Order to the same effect" were inserted at the end—

(a) of Article 1 (xiv) of the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, as amended;

(b) of Article 1 (xxi) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, as amended:

(c) of Article 1 (xiv) of the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, as amended: and

(d) of Article 1 (xxi) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as amended.

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaties of Peace Orders (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1923, and shall be included amongst the Orders which may be cited as the Treaty of

Peace Orders, 1919 to 1923, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1923, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1923, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1923

**WHEREAS** by the British Settlements Act, 1887, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time to establish all such laws and institutions and constitute such courts and officers as may appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary for the peace, order and good government of His Majesty's subjects and others within any British settlement:

And whereas the coasts of the Ross Sea, with the islands and territories adjacent

thereto, between the 160th degree of East Longitude and the 150th degree of West Longitude, which are situated south of the 60th degree of South Latitude, are a British settlement within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for the government thereof:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the said Act, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. From and after the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette of the Dominion of New Zealand that part of His Majesty's Dominions in the Antarctic seas, which comprises all the islands and territories between the 160th degree of East Longitude and the 150th degree of West Longitude which are situated south of the 60th degree of South Latitude shall be named the Ross Dependency.

II. From and after such publication as aforesaid the Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of the Dominion of New Zealand for the time being (hereinafter called the Governor) shall be the Governor of the Ross Dependency; and all the powers and authorities which by this Order are given and granted to the Governor for the time being of the Ross Dependency are hereby vested in him.

III. In the event of the death or incapacity of the said Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of the Dominion of New Zealand or in the event of his absence from the said Dominion, the Officer for the time being Administering the government of the Dominion shall be Governor for the time being of the Ross Dependency.

IV. The said Governor is further authorised and empowered to make all such Rules and Regulations as may lawfully be made by His Majesty's authority for the peace, order and good government of the said Dependency, subject, nevertheless, to any instructions which he may from time to time receive from His Majesty or through a Secretary of State.

V. The Governor is authorised to make and execute, on His Majesty's behalf, grants and dispositions of any Lands which may lawfully be granted or disposed of by His Majesty within the said Dependency, in conformity with such Rules and Regulations as may from time to time be in force in the Dependency.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in

Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 28th day of June, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Heythrop, in the County of Oxford and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Heythrop is vested for an estate in fee simple free from incumbrances in certain trustees upon trust for Robert Bingham Brassey, of Cottesbrooke Hall, in the County of Northampton, Captain late 17th Lancers, absolutely, and the said Robert Bingham Brassey is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Robert Bingham Brassey is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Heythrop should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, now Bishop of Oxford, and his successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Heythrop, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Heythrop:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Robert Bingham Brassey, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order

of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Heythrop shall be transferred to the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 31st day of May, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Chesterton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wendlebury, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Oxford and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Chesterton and Wendlebury duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:



" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Chesterton and Wendlebury are now full, the Reverend Charles Lister Bradley being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Chesterton and the Reverend Henry William Gresswell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wendlebury:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Chesterton and the said Benefice of Wendlebury shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Chesterton with Wendlebury' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Wendlebury only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Chesterton and the then Incumbent of Wendlebury shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Chesterton only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Wendlebury; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Wendlebury if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Chesterton shall have been instituted to Chesterton subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Chesterton before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Chesterton following such avoidance of the Benefice of Wendlebury and the then Incumbent of Wendlebury shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Chesterton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows,

that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Wendlebury having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Chesterton having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 31st day of May, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Sparkford and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Weston Bampfylde, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Sparkford and Weston Bampfylde duly made their report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Sparkford and Weston Bampfylde are now full, the Reverend Trevor Griffiths being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sparkford; and the Reverend Martin Fawcener Harper being the present Incumbent of Weston Bampfylde:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Sparkford and the said Benefice of Weston Bampfylde shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sparkford with Weston Bampfylde,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two

Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lincoln has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

" And whereas the said Benefices of Chaldon Herring, Winfrith Newburgh and Wool are all now full, the Reverend John Francis Jones being the present Incumbent of the Benefices of Chaldon Herring and Winfrith Newburgh, and the Reverend Jasper George Litchfield Anderson being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Wool:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, as such Bishop and also as the Patron of the said Benefices of Chaldon Herring, Winfrith Newburgh and Wool (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh, that is to say, the eastern portion of the said Parish of Winfrith Newburgh including the hamlet of East Burton, the cottages known as Hunnybun's Cottage and Pounts Barn but excluding Hyford Cottage, West Burton, and Newburgh Farm (all of which portion is more particularly set out and delineated upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink) shall be severed from the remaining portion of the same Parish of Winfrith Newburgh and for the purpose of the union of such severed portion with the Benefice and Parish of Wool as hereinafter recommended and for the purpose of the union of the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh with the Benefice of Chaldon Herring as hereinafter recommended such severed portion of the Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh shall be deemed to be a separate Benefice and Parish.

That upon the union of the severed portion of the said Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh and the said benefice of Wool (referred to in Clause 4 of this Scheme), all of the Tithe Rent Charges, Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh or which may hereafter belong to such Benefice shall be charged with and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Wool with East Burton with the annual sum or yearly rentcharge herein-after mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100 the same annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100 to be as from the date of such union due and payable to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Wool with East Burton and the same annual

sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Wool with East Burton or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year; and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Wool with East Burton and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in respect of the rentcharges to which that section applies.

" Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh or of the United Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh with Chaldon Herring shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex to the said United Benefice of Wool with East Burton any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh or of the said United Benefice of Winfrith Newburgh with Chaldon Herring (as the case may be) which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of £100 hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the said annual sum or yearly charge of £100 shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 10th day of December, 1842, and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of March, 1843, certain parts of the Parish of Halifax, in the said County of York, and at that time in the Diocese of Ripon, but now in the said Diocese of Wakefield, were assigned as Chapelry Districts to five consecrated Churches situate in the said Parish of Halifax, and one of such Chapelry Districts was named 'The Chapelry District of Saint George, Sowerby':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 15th day of April, 1848, and published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of the following month, part of the said Parish of Halifax was constituted a separate

District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named 'The District of Saint Mary, Sowerby':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 26th day of August, 1881, and published in the London Gazette on the 6th day of the following month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Divine, situate at Thorpe, within the original limits of the said Parish of Halifax, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Divine, Thorpe':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 21st day of March, 1890, and published in the London Gazette on the 25th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Peter, Sowerby, situate within the original limits of the said Parish of Halifax, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Sowerby':

"And whereas the said Chapelry District of Saint George, Sowerby, the said District of Saint Mary, Sowerby, the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Divine, Thorpe, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Sowerby, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us, to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint George, Sowerby, the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Sowerby, the said New Parish of Saint John the Divine, Thorpe, and the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Sowerby, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Sowerby; and (thirdly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint George, Sowerby, of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Sowerby, and of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Sowerby, which are described in the Third Schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and are thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Divine, Thorpe.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

*" The First Schedule.*

" The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Peter, Sowerby, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint George, Sowerby, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

" 1. missioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Grassendale, of the said New Parish of Garston, and of the said New Parish of Allerton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto, annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Souls, Springwood, Liverpool.'

"And whereas a piece of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as a site for a permanent Church for such District and there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Emmanuel, Wyld Green, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Russell, Bishop of Birmingham (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Boldmere, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Emmanuel, Wyld Green, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Emmanuel, Wyld Green':

**WHEREAS** the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, has under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, Arthur Cayley, by Divine Permission Bishop of Gloucester, do, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the County of Gloucester and Our Diocese of Gloucester the Perpetual Curacy of Elmore, the Parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about 274. The net annual value of the Benefice arising from investment of the proceeds of sale of Glebe Lands, Queen Anne's Bounty grants and fees and other sources is £250 or thereabouts. The Parish Church of St. John, Elmore, contains 220 sittings.

"2. There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage of Hardwicke, which is annexed to the Vicarage of Standish, the united Parishes whereof contain an estimated present population of about 1,072. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe Rent Charge, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, Queen Anne's Bounty, Dividends from investments representing proceeds of sale of glebe lands and other sources is £480 or thereabouts. The Parish Church of St. Nicholas, Hardwicke, contains 300 sittings.

"3. There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage of Minsterworth, the Parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about 335. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Ecclesiastical Commissioners, Queen Anne's Bounty, fees, grants and other sources is £299 or thereabouts. The Parish Church of St. Peter, Minsterworth, contains 250 sittings.

"4. That part of the said Parish of Hardwicke, which is known as Farleys End Tithing extends up to the Parish Church of Elmore. The Parish Church of Hardwicke is about four miles distant from the Parish Church of Elmore. The Parish Church of Minsterworth is about a mile and a half distant from the Parish Church of Elmore, but between them runs the river Severn, which is of considerable width,

and only passable by boat, this being hazardous at certain tides. The said Parish of Minsterworth lies on both sides of the river Severn, the principal part being on the further side from the Parish of Elmore.

"5. It appears to us that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the portion of the said Vicarage of Hardwicke known as Farleys End Tithing, together with certain scattered areas of small extent, all of which are delineated and coloured blue on the Plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation, and certain small areas of the said Vicarage of Minsterworth lying on the same side of the river Severn as Elmore, and delineated and coloured green on the said plan, may advantageously be separated from the said respective Vicarages and annexed to the said Parish of Elmore, to which they are contiguous. If the said annexations are made the ecclesiastical boundary of the said Parish of Elmore will coincide with the civil boundary thereof as altered by the Local Government Board by an Order of the Board dated 17th December, 1883.

"6. The Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke and the Vicarage of Minsterworth are in our Patronage, and as the Person entitled to present thereto, we consent to these proposals. The Perpetual Curacy of Elmore is in the Patronage of Lieutenant-Colonel Christopher Dering Guise, the Reverend Canon the Honourable Charles Augustus Sinclair, M.A., and the Venerable Charles Henry Ridsdale, M.A., Archdeacon of Gloucester.

"7. The Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke is at present vacant. The Reverend Charles Oldfield Bartlett, M.A., is the present Incumbent of the Vicarage of Minsterworth. The Reverend Percy Elton Prince is the present Incumbent of the Perpetual Curacy of Elmore.

"8. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Pluralities Act we the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke and of the said Vicarage of Minsterworth so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Perpetual Curacy of Elmore and the mode in which it appears to us the alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes, Rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

### "SCHEME.

"That the portions of the Vicarage of Hardwicke delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured blue shall be separated from the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Perpetual Curacy of Elmore.



"That the portions of the Vicarage of Minsterworth delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured green shall be separated from the said Vicarage of Minsterworth and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Perpetual Curacy of Elmore.

"That the Incumbent of the said Perpetual Curacy of Elmore to which the said portions of the said Parishes of Standish with Hardwicke and Minsterworth shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of Souls therein.

"That the Parishioners of the said portions of the said Parishes of Standish with Hardwicke and Minsterworth shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said Parish of Elmore but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Hardwicke or the Parish Church of Minsterworth as the case may be excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing the legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Hardwicke or the said Parish Church of Minsterworth and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials shall be solemnized and performed for the inhabitants of the said portions of the said Parishes of Hardwicke and Minsterworth in the said Parish Church of Elmore.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"That all fees, Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments, arising from the said portion so to be separated from the United Benefice of Itchen Stoke with Abbotstone and Ovington shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Swarraton with Northington.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

"That all the Tithe Rent Charge arising from the aforesaid portion of and belonging to the United Benefice of Itchen Stoke with Abbotstone and Ovington in that part of the Parish of Itchen Stoke so to be separated therefrom and annexed to Swarraton with Northington as set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be transferred to the Parish of Swarraton with Northington and shall belong to and be payable to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Swarraton with Northington.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF SHORTHAND TYPIST IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. No candidate will be eligible who has not rendered one full year's approved service prior to the first day of the examination in British Government Departments; or in the War Department Establishments or in National Factories, Stores, Bonds, Depots, etc., where the services were remunerated direct from public funds; or as an enrolled member of a clerical section of Queen Mary's Army

Auxiliary Corps, the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Women's Royal Air Force, or the Voluntary Aid Detachments General Service. She must have served for the year either as established Typist or as temporary Shorthand Typist or partly in each capacity.

Candidates appointed by the Civil Service Commissioners as Typists in the Trinity House, the Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, and the Metropolitan Police Office, on the result of a general competition for situations as Typist in the Civil Service, will be regarded as established Typists for the purpose of these regulations although not serving under the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. Candidates must be not less than 19 years of age on the first day of the examination; and candidates who have only temporary service or service in the Trinity House, Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, or the Metropolitan Police Office, or service of two or more of these kinds, must not be more than 40 years of age on the first day of the examination.

No exception on any grounds will be made to this rule.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) that they are unmarried or widows;
- (b) that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of a person serving in a civil situation to which she was admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

- (1) English Composition.
- (2) Précis Writing.
- (3) Shorthand.

5. No candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in Shorthand and in the aggregate number of marks obtained in the examination as a whole.

6. Vacancies will be allotted to established Typists and temporary Shorthand Typists in proportion to the number of candidates forthcoming from each class, provided that appointment will be offered only to those candidates reaching one prescribed standard of qualification. If either class fails to furnish a number of qualified candidates up to the due proportion the deficiency will be made up by appointment from the other class.

7. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will consult, so far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

8. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been

spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 12s. 6d. will be required from every candidate attending the examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations in London, Edinburgh, Bristol and Manchester, commencing on the 4th December, 1923.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 11th October, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
