"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize as from the 22nd June, 1923, payment in Aircraft Carriers of the higher fire control allowance of 3d. a day to a total of not more than three ratings of the branches of Your Majesty's Navy named in the Orders in Council cited.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and various Orders amending the aforesaid Orders:

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Orders as amended should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

- 1. The Orders made under the said Acts shall have effect as if the words "and, without prejudice to any other method of enforcement, any award of the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal may by leave of the High Court or a judge thereof, or in Scotland of the Court of Session, be enforced in the same manner as a judgment or Order to the same effect." were inserted at the end-

  - (a) of Article 1 (xiv) of the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, as amended;
    (b) of Article 1 (xxi) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, as amended;
    (c) of Article 1 (xiv) of the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, as amended; and
  - (d) of Article 1 (xxi) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as amended.
