PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 26th day of July, 1923 (N. 2391), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is eracted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been a Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 13th October, 1922, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction the payment of pensions, gratuities, and bonuses to men selected for discharge in consequence of the reduction of Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force subsequently to the 12th May, 1922, the time to count for pension purposes being reckoned up to 3 months after that date, viz., 11th August, 1922, or to the date of discharge in the case

of men detained beyond that date through causes not under their own control:

"And whereas in consequence of the amalgamation of the Royal Marine Artillery and Royal Marine Light Infantry, involving a further reduction in the Royal Marine Force, we have found it necessary to invite applications from Royal Marines for discharge from that force:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that men of the Royal Marine forces applying for discharge with a view to reducing the surplus ranks borne, and duly selected for discharge, shall be eligible for pensions, gratuities and bonuses subject to the general restrictions, conditions and provisions directed by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 13th October, 1922, with the exception that the service of such men shall be reckoned up to three months from the date on which the order for the discharge of surplus Marine ranks is issued, or to the date of discharge in the case of men detained beyond that date through causes not under their own control.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Special Constables Act, 1914, as amended by the Special Constables Act, 1923, power is conferred on His Majesty, by Order in Council, to make Regulations with respect to the appointment and position of Special Constables appointed under the Special Constables Act, 1831, or under section one hundred and ninety-six of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and by these Regulations to make such provisions as are mentioned in the said Special Constables Act, 1914, as so amended:

Now, therefore. His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to

order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—
1. The power to nominate and appoint special constables under the Special Constables Act, 1831, may be exercised at any time on the requisition of the Chief Officer of Police or an officer, not below the rank of Inspector, acting under his directions, notwithstanding that a tumult, riot, or felony has not taken place or is not immediately apprehended.

Provided, however, that no person shall be so appointed before he has reached the age of

20 years.

2. Any special constable so appointed shall be appointed for the preservation of the public peace, and for the protection of the inhabitants and the security of property in the police district for which, or for any part of which, the flistices making the appointment act, and no such special constable shall be authorised or required to be employed as a special constable otherwise than for such purposes as aforesaid.
3. The declaration to be made by a special constable shall be made in the following

form: solemnly and sincerely declare and affirm that I will well and truly serve Our Sovereign Lord the King in the office of special constable, without favour or affection, malice or lilwill; and that I will to the best of my power cause the peace to be kept and preserved, and prevent all offences against the persons and properties of His Majesty's subjects; and that while I continue to hold the said office I will to the best of my skill and knowledge discharge all the duties thereof

randing discharge all the duties thereof faithfully according to law.

4. A special constable shall throughout the police district for which he is appointed, and also in any adjoining police district, have all the powers, privileges and duties which any constable duly appointed has within his constablewick by virtue of the common law or of

any statute for the time being in force.

5. -(1) All special constables shall in the execution of their duty act under the direction and control of the Chief Officer of Police of the police district for which they are appointed,

except that in exceptional circumstances, where the Secretary of State so directs, they shall act under the direction and control of such other authority as the Secretary of State may designate.

(2) In any Borough where special constables have been appointed under Section 196 (1) of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, the power to call upon such special constables to act may be exercised at any time by the Chief Officer of Police or an officer, not below the rank of Inspector, acting under his directions.

6. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Police Authority may make such Regulations as may seem to them expedient for fixing the conditions of appointment, resignation and discharge of the special constables, for securing that only fit and proper persons shall be appointed special constables, for rendering the special constables efficient in the discharge of their duties, and for preventing neglect or abuse.

7.—(1) Provision may be made by the Police Authority for grants to special constables by

way of-

(a) reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses necessarily incurred in the execution of duty, or an allowance in lieu thereof, including a Subsistence, Lodging or Refreshment Allowance not exceeding the amounts specified in Regulations 70 and 71 of the

Police Regulations;

- (b) an allowance in consideration of wages lost by a special constable while required for duty, or during a period of temporary incapacitation for following his ordinary employment by infirmity of mind or body occasioned by an injury received in the execution of his duty without his own default, or by illness contracted in the execution of his duty without his own default; provided that any such payment shall not exceed the amount of the wages lost and in no case shall exceed 10s per diem; . .
- (c) any other allowance approved by the Secretary of State;

but, save as aforcsaid, no person voluntarily appointed as a special constable shall be entitled to any remuneration in respect of his services as such.

- (2) Any such grants shall be paid out of the Police Fund.
- 8. Any allowance or other grant for which a special constable may be eligible under the pre-ceding paragraph of this Order may be withheld by the Chief Officer of Police in any case where he is not satisfied that the special con-stable is well-conducted and efficient in the discharge of his duties; provided that, in the case of a Borough Police Force, any such decision of the Chief Officer of Police shall be subject to the approval of the Watch Com-
- 9. A special constable may resign his office subject to his giving to the Chief Officer of Police, or such other person or authority under whose direction and control he acts, notice of such period as may have been fixed by the Police Authority or such other person or authority, as the case may be: provided that, if he has undertaken to serve as a special constable for any definite period, his resignation before the expiration of such period shall be subject to the consent of the Chief Officer of Police.
 - 10. The Chief Officer of Police, or such other

person or authority under whose direction and control he acts, may at his discretion determine the service of or suspend or dismiss any

special constable.

11.—(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, a special constable who is permanently incapacitated for following his ordinary employment by infirmity of mind or body occasioned by an injury received in the execution of his duty without his own default, or by illness which is shown to the satisfaction of the Police Authority to have been contracted in the execution of his duty without his own default, shall be entitled to a pension or gratuity; and if a special constable dies from the effect of any such injury or illness as aforesaid, his widow shall be entitled to a pension or a gratuity and -his-children shall be entitled to allowances, and such pensions, gratuities or allowances shall be at the same rates and subject to the same conditions, as nearly as may be, as similar grants to constables in a police force and to their widows and children under the Police Pensions Act, 1921.

(2) For the purpose of reckoning any such grant the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) The period of approved service shall be reckoned as 1 completed year if the period for which the special constable has held office since his last appointment is less than 3 years. If such period exceeds 3 years, the period of approved service shall be reckoned as follows:—

(b) The pay shall be reckoned as at the rate of 70s. weekly, with an addition of 1s. weekly for each completed year for which the special constable has held the office since his last appointment, subject, however, to a maximum of 90s. weekly.

(c) Any grant the amount of which is dependent, in the case of a member of a police force, on his rank, shall be assessed in the case of a special constable at the amount appropriate to the rank of constable.

(d) Section 28 of the Police Pensions Act,

1921, shall not apply.

(3) All pensions and gratuities granted to special constables or their widows and any allowances granted to their children under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the Police Fund.

12. Any expenses incurred in respect of the equipment and maintenance of the special constables and in the execution of their duties shall, if the Police Authority so directs, be paid

out of the Police Fund.

13. Any special constable appointed under the Special Constables Act, 1914, as amended by the Special Constables Act, 1923, who is summoned to serve on any Jury shall be exempted from serving on the Jury on presenting a certificate signed by the Chief Officer of Police, or an officer not below the rank of Inspector authorised by him for the purpose, stating that he is a special constable belonging to an organised force and that he is ready to undertake duty when required.

14. Any person who, for any unlawful purpose or without proper authority, puts on the dress or accourtements or takes the name, designation, or character of a special constable, shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine

not exceeding ten pounds.

- 15. For the purposes of this Order, the expression "police district" means one of the areas set forth in the first column of the Schedule hereto, and the expressions "police authority," "Chief Officer of Police," and "police fund" mean, as respects each police district, the authority, officer and fund respectively mentioned opposite the area in the second, third and fourth columns of that Schedule.
- 16. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Special Constables Act, 1831, as amended by any subsequent enactment, or as the case may require, section one hundred and ninety-six of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882. shall apply to the special constables appointed under those enactments respectively.
- 17. This Order shall apply as respects special constables appointed under the Special Constables Order, 1914, but nothing in this Order shall be construed as requiring special constables appointed before the date thereof to make a new declaration under this Order.
- 18. The Special Constables Order, 1914, is hereby revoked, but any appointment made or other act done in pursuance of that Order shall have effect as if made or done in pursuance of this Order.
- 19. This Order may be cited as the Special Constables Order, 1923.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and the place of holding any Court and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court and the consolidation of any two or more Districts and the division of any District and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in such District:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The District of the County Court of Sussex held at Rye, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Sussex held at Hastings, and from the 30th day of September, 1923, the holding of the said Court at Rye shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Hastings and the said Court held at Hastings shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

2. The District of the County Court of Berkshire held at Faringdon, except the Parishes detached therefrom by paragraph four hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Berkshire held at Wantage and from the 30th day of September, 1923, the holding of the said Court at Faringdon shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Wantage and the said Court held at Wantage shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

3. The District of the County Court of Norfolk held at Attleborough, except the Parishes detached therefrom by paragraph four hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Norfolk held at Wymondham and from the 30th day of September, 1923, the holding of the

said Court at Attleborough shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Wymondham and the said Court held at Wymondham shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

4. The Parishes set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall, save as to any cases pending upon the 30th day of September, 1923, be detached from and cease to form part of the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column of the said Schedule, and shall be transferred to, and form part of the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the third column thereof.

5. In this Order "Parish" shall have the same meaning as in the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899 (S.R. & O., 1899, No. 178), provided that the boundaries of every Parish mentioned in this Order shall be those constituted and limited at the date of this Order.

6. This Order may be cited as the County Court Districts (Miscellaneous No. 2) Order in Council, 1923, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1923, and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, as amended shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict., c. 52) to 1906 (6 Edw. VII, c. 15), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State, with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's Dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas Treaty arrangements exist between His Majesty and the Powers and States set forth in the accompanying schedule for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals which have been duly put in force by Order in Council:

And whereas a convention was concluded between His Majesty and the other Powers and States enumerated therein among which are those set forth in the accompanying schedule, on the fourth day of May, 1910, for the suppression of the White Slave Traffic which contains Articles in the terms following:—

" ARTICLE 1.

"Doit être puni quiconque, pour satisfaire les passions d'autrui, a embauché, entrainé, ou détourné, même avec son consentement, une femme ou fille mineure, en vue de la débauche, alors même que les divers actes qui sont les éléments constitutifs de l'infraction auraient été accomplis dans des pays différents.

" ARTICLE 2.

"Doit être aussi puni quiconque, pour satisfaire les passions d'autrui, a par fraude ou à l'aide de violences, menaces abus d'autorité, ou tout autre moyen de contrainte, embauché, entrainé, ou détourné une femme ou fille majeure, en vue de la débauche, alors même que les divers actes qui sont les éléments constitutifs de l'infraction auraient été accomplis dans des pays différents.

" ARTICLE 5.

"Les infractions prévues par les articles 1 et 2 seront, à partir du jour de l'entrée en vigueur de la présente Convention réputées être inscrites de plein droit au nombre des infractions donnant lieu à extradition d'après les Conventions déjà existantes entre les Parties contractantes.

"Dans les cas où la stipulation qui précède ne pourrait recevoir effet sans modifier la législation existante, les Parties contractantes s'engagent à prendre ou à proposer à leurs legislatures respectives les mesures nécessaires.

" ARTICLE 11.

"Si un Etat contractant désire la mise en vigueur de la présente Convention dans une ou plusieurs de ses colonies, possessions ou circonscriptions consulaires judiciaires, il notifiera son intention à cet effet par un acte qui sera déposé dans les archives du Gouvernement de la République française. Celui-ci en enverra, par la voie diplomatique, copie certifiée conforme à chacun des Etats contractants et les avisera en même temps de la date du depôt.

"Six mois après la date du dépôt de l'acte de notification, la Convention entrera en vigueur dans les colonies, possessions ou circonscriptions consulaires judiciaires visées dans l'acte de notification."

And whereas His Majesty's Ratification of this Convention on behalf of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland was deposited at Paris on the eighth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twelve:

And whereas His Majesty has acceded to the Convention in respect of the following self-governing Dominions on the dates respectively mentioned:—

Canada—August 25th, 1913 Union of South Africa—September 19th, 1913 New Zealand—October 1st, 1913 Newfoundland—October 1st, 1913

Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island)—February 18th, 1914

in respect of India on the 27th March, 1922; in respect of the following Colonies on the 4th November, 1921:—

Bahamas. Hong Kong.
Ceylon. Jamaica
Cyprus. Malta.
Fiji Straits Settlements
Kenya. Trinidad.

and in respect of the following Colonies on the 15th March, 1923:—

Barbados. St. Lucia.
British Guiana. St. Vincent.
British Honduras. Seychelles.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him, by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Acts shall apply in the case of the Powers and States in the accompanying schedule in accordance with the Treaties therein described as supplemented by the said Convention. This Order shall come into operation in Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and in the Irish Free State from and after the 18th day of August, 1923, in the above-

mentioned self-governing Dominions and Colonies in respect of which His Majesty has acceded to the Convention in accordance with Article 11 thereof, and in India, or in British possessions in respect of which His Majesty may in future accede thereto, it shall in each case come into operation on a date six months after the respective date of such accession, or from and after the said 13th day of August, whichever shall be the later date.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of Chapter 155 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

And provided that where one of the Powers and States set forth in the accompanying schedule has not notified its intention that the said Convention shall come into force in any of its Colonies, Possessions or Consular Judicial Districts by a declaration to that effect deposited in the archives of the Government of the French Republic, the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended in respect of any such Colonies, Possessions or Judicial Districts until such declaration shall have been so deposited, and no longer.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 14th day of July, 1921, and entitled the Eastern African Court of Appeal Order in Council, 1921 (heremafter called the Principal Order), a Court, called His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa (in this Order reterred to as the Court of Appeal), was constituted for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's Courts in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, the Uganda Protectorate, the Nyasaland Protectorate, the Zanzibar Protectorate and the Tanganyika Territory

And whereas by a Decree, shortly entitled the Zanzibar Courts Decree, 1923, His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar has enacted the following provisions relating to appeals to the Court of Appeal from His Highness the Sultan's Court for Zanzibar (therein and hereinafter referred to as "The Zanzibar Court")—

"19 (1) Subject to the other provisions of this Decree or of any other law for the time being in force an appeal shall lie to the Court of Appeal

(a) from the decrees or from any part of the decrees or from the orders of the Zanzibar Court passed or made in the exercise of its original civil jurisdiction and

(b) from any finding, order or centence other than an order of acquittal recorded or passed by the Zanzibar Court in the exercise of its original criminal jurisdiction or in the exercise of its appellate jurisdiction in an appeal from an acquittal

(2) Save as aforesaid there shall be no appeal from any decree, order, finding or sentence passed or made by the Zanzibar Court on appeal from a Subordinate Court

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to George Livermore, a trainee at the Enham Village Centre for Disabled Ex-Service Men, in the following circumstances:-

Livermore served in the Royal Air Force during the war and was discharged in 1919 with a disability pension on account of a gun-shot wound in the foot. He was undergoing a course of training in French polishing at the Enham Village Centre, Andover, and on March 7th, 1923, was, together with other disabled men, in a room where some beeswax mixed with turpentine was being heated on a stove. This caught fire, and Livermore, realising the danger, seized a walking stick and with the crooked end lifted the blazing bucket and made for the door. His clothing was alight, but notwithstanding serious burns he gallantly made his way to the doorway, when he was compelled to drop the bucket. When the fire occurred some of the men in the room managed to escape through the windows but all the men were in various degrees disabled and some were unable to escape. As it was, some of the men were slightly burnt, while Livermore himself sustained severe injuries causing him intense suffering. He had to lose part of his left arm while his right hand and arm were severely There is no doubt that Livermore realised the danger to his comrades if the building caught fire and without hesitation risked his life on their behalf.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR FEMALE WORKERS. Effective as from 13th August, 1923.*

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 19th August, 1923.

SECTION I.								
Normal number of hours of work.								

In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

47 In any week On Saturday ... ٠.. ••• ...

Provided that all time worked on Sundays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

Overtime Rates.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of time worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piece-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:-

- (a) For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double-Time.
- (b) For all time worked in excess of four-and-a-half hours on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.
 - (c) For all time worked in excess of 47 hours in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-Quarter for the first two hours and Time-and-a-Half thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

PART IV.

SECTION I.

Applicability of Rates.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919.

SECTION II.

Definition of Trade to which Trade Boards Acts apply.

The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:-

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or handbags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles. busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles;

- (a) The operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning or assembling, where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;
- (b) The operations of carding, boxing, packeting, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

BUT EXCLUDING: -

- (a) The operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;
- (b) The making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;
- (c) The making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;
- (d) The making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;
- (e) The making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;
- (f) The minting of coinage of the realm;
- (g) The process of hand-embossing.

PART V.

SECTION I.

Rates to be paid clear of deductions.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from any wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.

Rates without prejudice to payment of higher wages.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

The Schedule to this Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which are at present effective under the Trade Boards Acts for MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS employed in Scotland in all Branches of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade, as specified in Part IV of the Trade Board's Notice W.D.S. (16).

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING TRADE BOARD (SCOTLAND).

DEFINITIONS, CONDITIONS AND PROVISIONS GOVERNING THE APPLICATION OF THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES EFFECTIVE IN THE TRADE UNDER THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS.

PART I.

DEFINITIONS.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE APPLICATION OF THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED BY THE TRADE BOARD:—

SECTION I.

Definition of Retail Branch of the Trade.

THE RETAIL BRANCH of the trade is that branch of the trade specified in Part IV of this Notice, in which it is the usual practice for the employer to supply the garment direct to the wearer.

SECTION II.

Definition of Learner and conditions to be complied with.

A FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who:-

(a) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning one of the branches of trade as carried on by the employer or the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of the trade referred to in Part IV of this Notice; and

Certificates of Learnership required.

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of Learnership.

SECTION III.

Definition of Homeworker.

The expression "Homeworker" means a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART II.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE LEARNERS.

SECTION I.

With respect to Female Learners in the Retail Branch of the Trade (as defined in Section I of Part I of this Notice):

Advances

(a) The advances to be given to Learners shall become due on the completion of each 12 months of employment in the Retail Branch of the trade.

Completion of Learnership.

(b) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to Workers other than Learners on the completion of four years of employment in the Retail Branch of the trade.

SECTION II.

With respect to Female Learners in the Wholesale Manufacturing and all other branches of the trade except the Retail Branch:—

Advances.

(a) The advances to be given to Learners shall become due on the completion of each six months of employment, after the age of 14 years, in the Wholesale Manufacturing or any other branch of the trade except the Retail Branch.

PART II.—continued.

Completion of Learnership.

(b) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner, and be entitled to the General Minimum Time-Rates applicable to Workers other than Learners upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her, as set out below:—

Age of Entering upon Employment.

Conditions.

- Under 15 years of age The completion of not less than three years of employment and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
- 15 and under 16 years of age ... The completion of not less than two years of employment and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
- 16 years of age and over The completion of two years of emplyment.
 - (c) No Female Learner shall be entitled to the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to Workers other than Learners until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that, in determining the age of entry and the length of employment all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

SECTION III.

Certification of Learners.

An application for a Learner's Certificate must be made to the Trade Board in respect of every Worker whom it is desired to employ at the special lower rates fixed for Learners. Unless a Learner's Certificate has been obtained, or application has been made which has been acknowledged and is still under consideration, and the other conditions of Learnership laid down in Section II of Part I of this Notice are complied with, the minimum rate payable is that for Workers other than Learners.

PART III.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO OVERTIME RATES FOR ALL WORKERS.

SECTION 1.

Normal Number of Hours of Work.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be 4, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be 8½.

Provided also that all time worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply

SECTION II.

Overtime Rates.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of all time worked by a worker, Whether Engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

- (1) For the First Two Hours of Overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter.
- (2) For Overtime AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double-Time.
- (4) For all time worked in any week in excess of 46 hours, the Overtime Rate shall be TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds 8½, or in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor) exceeds 4, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 46.

PART III—continued.

Provided-

- (a) That where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.
- (b) That where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required after 50 hours have been worked.
- (c) That where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

PART IV.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

SECTION I.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the minimum rates of wages which are effective in the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade (Scotland) apply to all workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade as specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 29th March, 1920 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), and as set out below:

SECTION II.

Specification of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade.

The trade as specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows:-

Those branches of the Women's Clothing Trade that are engaged in the making of Non-Tailored Garments, namely, the making from textile or knitted fabrics of (a) non-tailored wearing apparel (other than handkerchiefs) worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex, or (b) boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex;

INCLUDING

- (1) All operations and processes of cutting, making, or finishing by hand or machine of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports-coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing-gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, underskirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, babylinen, or similar non-tailored articles;
- (2) The making of field bonnets, sun bonnets, boudoir caps or infants' millinery, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph (1) above;
- (3) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned
 - (b) The cleaning of any of the above-mentioned articles, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of such garments;
- (4) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of such articles, other than hand embroidery or hand-drawn-thread work on articles made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton;
- (5) The following processes if done by machine:—thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;
- (6) Laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making, altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned articles;

BUT EXCLUDING: -

- (a) The making of knitted articles; the making of underclothing, socks and stockings, from knitted fabrics; and the making from knitted fabrics of articles mentioned in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabrics;
- (b) The making of gloves, spats, gaiters, boots, shoes and slippers;
- (c) The making of headgear, other than the articles mentioned in paragraph (2) above;
- (d) The branches of trade covered by the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919;
- (e) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

PART IV.—continued.

- (f) The making of women's collars and cuffs and of nurses' stiff washing belts where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of men's or boys' shirts or collars:
- (g) Warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises;

And excluding also any processes or operations included in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920.

NOTE.—The employment of women, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education (Scotland) Act, 1918.
