MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Roard and are effective under the Trade Boards Acts and takes the place of the Notice H.B. (10) issued by the Trade Board and dated 17th June, 1922.

The Minimum Rates set out in the Schedule below are effective under Orders of the

Minister of Labour as follows:-

- (1) The Minimum Rates set out in Parts I—V inclusive of the Schedule below as from 6th August, 1923* (except the rates marked †).
- **(2)** The Minimum Rates marked + set out in Parts I and III of the Schedule below as from 19th June, 1922.
- The General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates set out in Parts VI and VII of the Schedule below as from 28th March, 1922.
- * Note: Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 12th August, 1923.

FOR ALL FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN ONE OR MORE OF THE CCCUPATIONS SPECIFIED IN SECTION II OF PART III OF THIS SCHEDULE:—

81d. per hour.

SECTION III.—Applicability of Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

In the case of all Female Workers employed on Piece-work in one or more of the occupations specified in Sections I or II of Part III of this Schedule each Piece-Rate must be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, as set out in Sections I and II respectively of this Part of this Schedule, to an ORDINARY Worker, i.e., a female worker of ordinary skill and experience in those occupations.

Note.—In the case of all Female Workers employed on Piece-work (other than the classes of workers specified in Sections I and II of this Part) each Piece-rate must be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Section III of Part III of this Schedule.

PART V.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (EXCEPT THE CLASSES OF WORKERS SPECIFIED IN PART X OF THIS SCHEDULE AND EXCEPT WORKERS EMPLOYED IN HAND-LOOM WEAVING OTHER THAN DAMASK SEATING HAND-LOOM WEAVING).

SECTION I.—Declared Normal Number of Hours of Work.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE IN ANY WEEK TO BE 48.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II-Overtime Rates.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in respect of hours worked by Workers of the classes specified in Parts I, II, III and IV of this Schedule in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be:—

Overtime Rates for Time-Workers.

A.—WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK.

- (1) For the first four hours of Overtime in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (2) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

Work on Sundays and Holidays.

Provided that for all time worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.

Overtime Rates for Piece-Workers.

B.—WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK.

Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime a Piece-Rate which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, at least the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or General Minimum Time-Rate, as the case may be, with the addition of:—

- (1) As respects each of the first four hours of Overtime in any week, a sum equivalent to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or General Minimum Time-Rate, as the case may be;
- (2) As respects each hour in excess of four hours of Overtime in any week, a sum equivalent to One-Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or General Minimum Time-Rate, as the case may be;
- (3) As respects each hour of employment on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, a sum equivalent to the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or General Minimum Time-Rate, as the case may be.

PART VI.

PART VII.

OVERTIME RATES FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED IN HAND-LOOM WEAVING (OTHER THAN DAMASK SEATING HAND-LOOM WEAVERS AND HOME WORKERS).

Overtime Rates for Hand-Loom Weavers.

HAND-LOOM WEAVERS (OTHER THAN HOME WORKERS) employed on Piecework to which the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part VI of this Schedule are applicable shall receive, in respect of hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in Section I of Part V of this Schedule, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, IN ADDITION TO payment at not less than the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rates:—

- (i) As respects each of the first four hours of Overtime in any week, 2d. per hour;
- (ii) As respects each hour in excess of four hours of Overtime in any week, 4d. per hour.
- (iii) As respects each hour of employment on Sundays or on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, 8d. per hour.

PART VIII.

Definition of Home-Worker.

For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Home-worker" means a worker who works in his or her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer

PART IX.

SECTION I.—Applicability of Rates.

The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all workers in Great Britain of the classes specified above in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hair, Bass and Fibre) Order, 1919; that is to say:—

Definition of trade to which the Trade Boards Acts apply.

The drafting, dressing or mixing of bass, whisk or similar fibres or horse hair or other hairs and the curling or weaving of hair or fibre, or of mixed hair and fibre, and all preparatory, finishing, warehousing or packing operations incidental to or appertaining to all or any of the above processes, but excluding any of the above operations or processes where they are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of brushes or brooms, and excluding also the dressing of animal skins.

Section II —Rates not applicable to workers weaving hair machine belting.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule the Minimum Rates of Wages fixed by the Trade Board do not apply to Male or Female workers employed in the weaving of hair machine belting or in any preparatory, finishing, warehousing or packing operation incidental to or appertaining to such weaving.

SECTION III.—Rates to be paid clear of all deductions.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments. or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section IV .- Rates without prejudice to workers earning higher rates.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates

PART X.

The General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates fixed for Male and Female Workers as set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice H.B. (10), dated 17th June, 1922, are cancelled as from 6th August, 1923, in their application to all Male and Female Workers employed in the weaving of hair machine belting and in all preparatory, finishing, warehousing or packing operations incidental to or appertaining to such weaving.

Note —The employment of female workers, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Education Acts, 1918 and 1921, and the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920

HAMPSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 3).

The Mmister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms

- 1 In this Order:—
- "The Prohibited Areas" mean the Areas in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited.
- "The Controlled Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled.

The Prohibited Areas and the Controlled Area are described in Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within such Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area.

- " Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs.
- "Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in Prohibited Areas.

- 2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of a Prohibited Area, except as provided in the next following article;
- (b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within a Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;
- (c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in a Prohibited Area;
- (d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of a Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in a Prohibited Area.

Provision for movement of Animals into Prohibited Areas for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to which this Order applies, to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in a Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:—
- (i) A Licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This Licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Controlled Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within a Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Arca.

- 4—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area;
- (b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Articles 3 or 5 of this Order:—
 - (i) Into the Controlled Area; or
 - (ii) Along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;
- (c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area:
- (d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;
- (e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

- 5—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:—
 - (a) From premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;
 - (b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;
 - (c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughter-house in such Area;
 - (d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence."
- (2) No licence shall be granted under this Order for the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Conditions of Licences.

6.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Areas to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence snall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

- (b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in a Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;
- (c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;
- (d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;
- (e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;
- (f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals.
- (g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;
- (h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Areas or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through any or all of the Areas to which the Order applies if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked

- 8. (a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;
- (b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—
- Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter "M" six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs —Letter "M" painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in a Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has

- been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.
- (2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.
- (3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry

- 10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in a Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.
- (2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order

11. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Orders
