TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 31st August, 1923, at 1 o'clock, for
 - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877: The National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts. 1914-1919; and
 - (b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £45,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

- 3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd September, 1923, to Saturday, the 8th September, 1923, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1988.

- 6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd September, 1923, to Saturday, the 8th September, 1923, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1923, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.
- 7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of One shilling), which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.
- 8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

- 9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday, 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.
- 10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.
- 11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION: WILLIAM ROBERT WATCHAM BULL.

Whereas William Robert Watcham Bull, of 12, Hyde Park Terrace, Plymouth, being a person duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920:

And whereas the said William Robert Watcham Bull cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or supply raw opium, nor to carry on the business of manufacturing or selling or distributing any of the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, after consultation with the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, and by No. 10 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, I hereby give notice that I withdraw as from to-day's date from the said William Robert Watcham Bull the authorisations granted by the said Regulations to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the retailing of poisons in accordance with the provisions of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, to be in possession of and supply raw opium and to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distri-buting the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

MADE-UP TEXTILES TRADE BOARD. (GREAT BRITAIN).

DEFINITIONS, CONDITIONS AND PROVISIONS GOVERNING THE APPLICATION OF THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES EFFECTIVE IN THE TRADE UNDER THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS.

PART I.

DEFINITION OF A LEARNER.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages fixed by the Trade Board:-

A LEARNER IS A WORKER WHO:-

- (i) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning one of the following processes:-
 - (a) Machining,

(b) Cutting,
(c) Awl and Needle Stitching,
(d) Operations performed by Palm and Needle Hands (including the Roping of Tents and Coal Sacks, where carried on),

(e) Flag-Making (that is to say ALL the branches of Flag-Making included within the scope of the Trade Board, as specified in Part IV of this Notice, carried on in the establishment in which the Learner is employed, provided that these branches include the making of Heraldic and Lettered Flags and the Union Jack),

and is provided by the employer with every facility for such learning;

(ii) Has received a certificate or has made an application for such certificate in accordance with the rules laid down by the Trade Board. Provided that in granting or withholding such certificate the Trade Board may take into consideration whether,

in view of the ratio of learners to journey workers employed in any establishment on the processes in which the Learner proposed to be certificated is to be employed, such Learner has a reasonable prospect of receiving due instruction. Provided also that any certificate may be withdrawn if the Trade Board consider that the conditions of employment are not being complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Learner on his or her first employment on one of the processes specified above without a certificate for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at his or her employment, the probation period shall be included in his or her period of Learnership.

PART II.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR LEARNERS.

The maximum period of learnership on any one of the operations specified in Part I of this Notice shall be as follows:—

- (i) as respects Learners employed in any one of the processes specified in paragraph (i) (a), (b), (c) or (d) of Part I above ... ONE YEAR;
- (ii) as respects Learners employed in Flag-Making, as specified in paragraph (i) (e) of Part I above TWO YEARS.

Provided that in determining the length of learnership served all previous employment as a Learner (whether as a Learner registered with the Trade Board or not) on the work in question shall be included.

The General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, on the expiration of the learnership period or periods as provided above, to a worker who has been employed as a Learner is that for a worker other than a Learner.

PART III.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO OVERTIME RATES.

SECTION I.—Normal number of hours of work.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE TO BE as follows:—

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sunday and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates apply.

SECTION II.—Overtime Rates for Time Workers.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work shall be as follows:—

- (A) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:-
 - (1) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 - (2) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.
 - (3) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.
 - (4) For all time worked in any week in excess of 48 hours the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) above.
 - The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Where attendance on five days a week only is required.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall be payable on such days only after 9½ hours have been worked.

(B) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:

Overtime Rates for Piece-workers.

Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, IN ADDITION to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-

PART III—continued.

Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time, respectively.

PART IV.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, The Minimum Rates of Wages which are effective under those Acts in accordance with the determinations of the Made-Up Textiles Trade Board (Great Britain) apply to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order, 1920.

Specification of the Made-Up Textiles Trade.

The Made-Up Textiles Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order, 1920, is as follows:—

(1) The making from woven fabrics of any of the following articles, or the repairing thereof:—

tarpaulins; tents; marquees; rick, cart or wagon covers; nosebags; oil-skin clothing or headgear or linings therefor; flags made of more than one piece; baths, basins, buckets, beds, cots, hammocks, ground sheets or similar articles; girths and articles known in the trade as horse-clothing.

(2) The making of any of the following articles from fabrics of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above, or the repairing thereof, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of any of the articles mentioned in the said paragraph:—

rope-bound coal and coke sacks; haversacks or knapsacks; outside and inside blinds or awnings; flags made of one piece; bunting decorations;

including: -

- (A) The following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, viz., operations known in the trade as—
 - (i) the dying, oiling, tarring, chemically treating, or otherwise proofing of the fabrics mentioned in paragraph 1 and the preparation of dressings therefor;
 - (ii) cutting, sewing, finishing, stencilling or branding by hand or machine;
- (B) The following or similar operations performed by hand or machine when incidental to and carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 above:—
 - (i) the splicing or braiding of rope, cord or twine;
 - (ii) the making of fittings of leather or webbing, including the assembling of metal or other parts;
 - (iii) the sewing or attaching to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 or 2 above of:—
 - (a) rope, cord or twine;
 - (b) leather, webbing or metal fittings made thereof;
- (C) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in the said paragraphs;
- (D) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any other articles when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in any of the operations mentioned in sub-paragraph (C) above;

but excluding :-

- (i) the making of haversacks and knapsacks when made in association with or in conjunction with the making of and as part of military web equipment;
- (ii) the making of folding or deck chairs;
- (iii) the making or repairing of horse-clothing, girths and nose-bags when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of leather saddlery or harness;
- (iv) the making or repairing of rubberised articles;
- (v) the making or repairing of tarpaulins or of rope-bound coal and coke sacks in an establishment, business, branch or department in which the making of sails is the main or principal business of the establishment, business, branch or department;
- (vi) the printing by hand or machine of flags or parts thereof;

- (vii) the operations mentioned in sub-paragraph (C) above, when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to corn sacks, flour sacks, coal sacks, sugar sacks, cement bags, sand bags, nail bags, potato bags, seed bags and similar sacks or bags;
- (viii) operations performed by workers directly employed by railway companies;
- (ix) operations included in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919:
- (x) operations included in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920;
- (ix) operations included in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, but not specifically mentioned in this Order.

Note.—The employment of women, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Acts, 1918 and 1921.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AS VARIED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 27TH AUGUST, 1923.*

The Schedule to this Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which are at present effective under the Trade Boards Acts for Male and Female Workers employed in the Made-up Textile Trade as specified in Part IV. of the Trade Board's Notice M.T. (8), dated 22nd August, 1923.

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads; or

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads.
