PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Territories in South Africa situate within the limits of the Southern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1898, and known as Southern Rhodesia are under the protection of His Majesty the King:

And whereas British subjects have settled in large numbers in the said Territories and it is expedient, with a view to the further development and more convenient administration of the said Territories, that they should be annexed to and should henceforth form part of His Majesty's Dominions:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia (Annexation) Order in Council, 1923.
- 2. Until further provision shall be made in respect thereof, the limits of this Order are the parts of South Africa bounded by the Portuguese Possessions, by the Union of South Africa to a point opposite the mouth of the

River Shashi, by the River Shashi to its junction with the Tati and Ramaquaban rivers, thence by the Ramaquaban river to its source, thence by the watershed of the rivers Shashi and Ramaquaban until such watershed strikes the Hunters' Road (called the Pandamatenka Road) thence by that road, to the River Zambesi, and by that river to the Portuguese boundary. The said limits include an area of ten miles radius round Fort Tuli, but exclude the area of the district known as the Tati district as defined by the Charter of the 29th day of October, 1889, incorporating the British South Africa Company.

- 3. From and after the coming into operation of this Order the said Territories shall be annexed to and form part of His Majesty's Dominions, and shall be known as the Colony of Southern Rhodesia, hereinafter called the Colony.
- 4. Nothing in this Order shall affect the validity of any Order in Council affecting the said Territories, or of any Ordinance, Proclamation or Regulations passed or issued under any such Order, or of any act or thing done under any such Order, Ordinance, Proclamation or Regulations, save in so far as any provision of any such Order, Ordinance, Proclamation or

Regulations may be repugnant to the provisions of any Act of Parliament which may, by reason of the annexation hereby declared, become extended to the Colony or to any Order or Regulation made under the authority of any such Act or having in the Colony the force and effect of any such Act.

- 5. This Order shall be published forthwith in the Official Gazette of Southern Rhodesia, and shall commence and come into operation on a day to be fixed by the High Commissioner by Proclamation in the said Gazette, and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the further publication of this Order at such places and in such manner, and for such time or times, as he thinks proper for giving publicity thereto within the Colony.
- 6. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Devonshire, K.G., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 28th September, 1923, at 1 o'clock, for:—
 - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
 - (b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £45,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

- 3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st October, 1923, to Saturday, the 6th October, 1923, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

- 6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000 They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st October, 1923, to Saturday, the 6th October, 1923, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1923, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.
- 7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of One shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.
- 8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.
- 10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.
- 11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT.

STREET COLLECTIONS.

REGULATIONS, DATED SEPTEMBER 15, 1923, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE POLICE, FACTORIES, &C. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916 (6 & 7 Geo. 5, c. 31), WITH REGARD TO STREET COLLECTIONS OF MONEY OR THE SALE OF ARTICLES FOR OTHER THAN TRADE PURPOSES.

By virtue of the powers conferred upon me by Section 5 of the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, I, being the Police Authority for the Metropolitan Police District, hereby revoke the Regulations dated 2nd January, 1917*; 30th June, 1917†; and 20th December, 1920‡, with respect to the places where and the conditions under which persons may be permitted in any street or public place within the Metropolitan Police District to collect money or sell articles for the benefit of charitable or other purposes, and make the following Regulations in place thereof:

- (1) No collection of money (other than a collection taken at an open-air meeting) or sale of any article shall be made in any street or public place within the Metropolitan Police District unles the society, committee, or other body of persons responsible for such collection or sale shall have obtained from the Commissioner of Police a permit for such collection or All applications for permits shall be referred to an Advisory Committee appointed by the Commissioner and approved by the Secretary of State.
- (2) Application for a permit shall be made in writing in the form contained in the Schedule hereto not later than the first day of the month preceding that month in which it is proposed to hold the collection or sale, and every application shall be made in the name of a committee or other body consisting of not less than three persons, who shall be jointly responsible for the collection or sale.

Provided that in the Commissioner's discretion the period of notice may be reduced in any particular case or class of cases if he is satisfied that there are special reasons for this course.

- (3) No collection or sale shall be made except upon the day and between the hours stated in the permit, and no permit of a continuous character will be granted unless the Commissioner is satisfied that there are special reasons for such grant.
- (4) The Commissioner may in granting a permit limit a collection or sale to such streets or public places or such parts thereof as he may think fit.
- (5) No person may assist or take part in any collection or sale without the written authority of the committee or body of persons to whom a permit has been granted. Every person so authorised shall produce such written authority forthwith for inspection by any Police Officer on demand.
- (6) No collection or sale shall be made in any part of the carriage-way of any street

without special permission from the Commissioner; nor shall any collection or sale be made on the footway or in any public place to the obstruction or annoyance of any person in such street or public place.

- (7) All persons acting as collectors or vendors shall, unless special exception is granted by the Commissioner, occupy a stationary position at some place on the footway. Not more than two persons shall act as collectors or vendors at the same place, and no person shall collect money or sell articles within 30 yards of the place where any other person or persons are collecting or selling.
- (8) No person under the age of 18 years shall act or be permitted to act as a collector or vendor.
- (9) No collector or vendor shall use a table for the purpose of any collection or sale so as to cause or be likely to cause obstruction. No table used shall exceed 30 inches in length and 20 inches in width.
- (10) No collector or vendor shall use a box or other receptacle at the end of a pole intended to reach upper windows or the roofs of conveyances.
- (11) No collector or vendor shall be accompanied by any animal.
- (12) No collector or vendor shall importune any person to the annoyance of such person.
- (13) Every collector or vendor shall carry and present to all contributors or purchasers for the reception of money contributions a box or other receptacle numbered and securely closed and sealed in such a way as to prevent the same being opened or the money extracted without such seal being broken, and into this box or other receptacle all money received shall be immediately placed. All such boxes or receptacles shall be numbered consecutively. Every collector or vendor shall deliver his boxes or other receptacles with the seals unbroken to one of the persons responsible for the proper application of the money received.
- (14) A collector or vendor shall not carry any collecting box, receptacle or tray which does not bear displayed prominently thereon the name of the fund for which the collection or sale is being made with the date of the collection, nor any box or other receptacle which is not duly numbered.
- (15) No payment or reward shall be made or given to any collector or vendor. No payment or reward shall be made or given either directly or indirectly to any other person connected with the promotion or conduct of a collection or sale for or in respect of services in connection therewith except such payments as may be shown in the application made in the form in the Schedule hereto before the permit for the collection or sale is granted.
- (16) Within one month after the date of any collection or sale the society, committee or other body of persons responsible therefor shall forward to the Commissioner for the information of the Advisory Committee a statement in the form contained in the Schedule hereto with vouchers certified by two officials of the society and audited by its auditor or other responsible person not connected with the fund, showing in detail the amount received and the expenses incurred in connection with such collection or sale, and shall if required by

the Commissioner satisfy him as to the due and proper application of the proceeds of the collection or sale. The society, committee or other body shall also, within the same period, at their own expense and after audit, publish in such newspaper or newspapers as the Commissioner may direct a short statement showing the name of the society, etc., responsible for the collection or sale, the name of the charity or fund which is to benefit, the date of the collection or sale and the amount collected, the amount of the expenses and the amount distributed to the charity or fund.

Any person who acts in contravention of any of the foregoing Regulations will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding forty shillings, or in the case of a second or subsequent offence not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing Regulations do not apply to the selling of articles in any street or public place when the articles are sold in the ordinary course of trade and for the purpose of earning a livelihood and no representation is made by or on behalf of the seller that any part of the proceeds of sale will be devoted to any charitable purpose.

I hereby confirm the foregoing Regulations and direct that the same shall come into operation 14 days after their publication in the London Gazette.

ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE NET SECTION OF THE TRADE.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:-

- (i) The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for the Classes of Male Workers specified in Section I of Part I of the Schedule (together with the Overtime Rates based thereon) and the Overtime Rates for the Class of Female Workers specified in Part II of the Schedule, as from 24th September, 1923.*
- (ii) The Overtime Rates for the Class of Male Workers specified in Part II of the Schedule, as from 1st March, 1923.

*Note.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 30th September, 1923.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE AND OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN THE NET SECTION OF THE TRADE AS CHARGE HANDS OR AS NET RIGGERS.

[Note.—'The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Part of this Schedule take the place of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate set out in Section II, A, (ii) of Part I of the Trade Board's Notice R (32) and the Overtime Rates based thereon.]

SECTION I.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate.

In cases where workers of the above-mentioned classes are employed on Piece-Work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. $0\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour to an *Ordinary Worker*. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of male workers of 21 years of age and over who have had not less than six months' experience in the trade.

OVERTIME RATES.

SECTION II.

Overtime Rates calculated in the manner described in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R (32), dated 22nd February, 1923, apply in substitution for the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate set out in Section I of this Part to male workers employed on piece-work in the Net Section of the Trade as Charge Hands or as Net Riggers in respect of all time worked by such workers in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part III of their Notice R (32) to be the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED FOR FEMALE WORKERS) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK IN HAND-MACHINE BRAIDING.

[Note.—The Overtime Rates set out in this Part of this Schedule take the place of the Overtime Rates set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R (33), dated 22nd February. 1923. These Overtime Rates are effective, as respects MALE WORKERS of the above-mentioned class, as from 1st March, 1923.]

SECTION I.

PART II—continued.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the trade to be as follows:—

Provided that all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime for Male and Female Piece-Workers employed on work to which the General Minimum Piece-Rates specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R (33), dated 22nd February, 1923, are applicable, to apply in substitution for the said General Minimum Piece-Rates in respect of all hours worked in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows:—

(i) For the first two hours of overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate with the addition of 3d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 13d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
 (ii) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sunday and

(ii) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for all overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate with the addition of 6d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 3½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.

(iii) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece Rate with the addition of 1s. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 7d. per hour in the case

of Female Workers.

(iv) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate with the addition of 3d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and of 13d. per hour in the case of Female Workers, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-sections (ii) and (iii) of this Section.

SECTION III.

Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule:—
(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable

on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable in the

ance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required after 50 hours have been worked.

(c) In the case of workers who customarily attend on six days a week, any other day

not being Sunday may, by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker, be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions such short day were substituted for "Saturday" and "Saturday" substituted for such short day.

Note —The employment of Female Workers, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Acts.

PART III.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed on piece-work in the Rope, Twine and Net Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net Order, 1919 (as amended by the Trade Boards (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920), and as set out in Section II of Part V of the Trade Board's Notice R (32), dated 22nd February, 1923.

PART IV.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH SEPTEMBER, 1923.)

LANCASHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms. .

- 1 In this Order:-
- "The Prohibited Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;
- "The Controlled Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled.

The Prohibited Area and the Controlled Area are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

- "Animals "means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs:
- "Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Area

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of the Prohibited Area, except as provided in the next following article;

- (b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;
- (c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Prohibited Area;
- (d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Area;
- (e) The landing of animals at the approved landing place at the port of Fleetwood is hereby prohibited.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3 Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to which this Order applies to a slaughter-house in any borough or urban district in the Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:—
- (i) A Licence authorising the movement must be obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;
 - (ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Controlled Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination: provided that where the distance from the railway station in the Area to the place of destination is greater than the distance to be covered within the Area if the movement were to take place by road, the Inspector granting the licence may specify therein any other route if he thinks it desirable, and may require the animals to be moved by float.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

- 4.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area;
- (b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Articles 3 or 5 of this Order:—
 - (i) Into the Controlled Area; or
 (ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;
- (c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area:
- (d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area; except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;
- (e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

- Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.
- 5. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:—
 - (a) From premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughter-house in the Controlled Area;
 - (b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;
 - (c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;
 - (d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Conditions of Licence.

- 6.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate;
- (b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in the Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;
- (c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such Licence was granted;
- (d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;
- . (e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;
- (f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;
- (g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Area or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Area, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

- 8.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;
- (b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

- 9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;
- (2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;
- (3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

- 10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or peultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;
- (2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

11. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Control of Dogs in Foot-and-Mouth Disease Prohibited Areas.

1. A dog in any Area which is for the time being a Prohibited Area under an Order referred to in the Schedule hereto shall at all times, except while it is in a dwelling-house, be kept under control by being:—

- (i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or
- (ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or
- (iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

Seizure, Detention and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

- 2.—(1) Any dog which is not kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with.
- (2) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

Offences.

3. If any dog is not kept under control as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an

Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animal shall be moved into such premises.

SHROPSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 2.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area Affected.

- 1.—(1) This Order applies to the area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the Area is referred to as the Controlled Area;
- (2) If any premises (except any detached part) are partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

- 2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area.
- (b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 3 of this Order:—
 - (i) into the Controlled Area; or
 - (ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;
- (c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;
- (d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area; except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;
- (e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

- Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.
- 3.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—
 - (a) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area:
 - (b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area:
 - (c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;
 - (d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence."

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Conditions of Licences.

- 4.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate;
- (b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease infected place, or movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a destination in that Area;
- (c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;
- (d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;
- (e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;
- (f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;
- (g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority.
- (h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved there-

with on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

5. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by Railway through the Controlled Area, if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

- 6.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;
- (b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

- 7.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Controlled Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;
- (2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;
- (3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

- 8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;
- (2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

10. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Order.

11. The Shropshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923, is hereby revoked, but any notice served under that Order shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order:

"The Controlled Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled.

The Controlled Area is described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly out-

side the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

- "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;
- "Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

- 2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area.
- (b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 3 of this Order:—
 - (i) into the Controlled Area: or
 - (ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;
- (c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;
- (d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area; except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;
- (e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

- 3. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:—
 - (a) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;
 - (b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;
 - (c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;
 - (d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Conditions of Licence.

4.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an

- Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the shoughterhouse is situate;
- (b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, or movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a destination in that Area;
- (c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such Licence was granted;
- (d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;
- (e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;
- (f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far, as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;
- (g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;
- (h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

5. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Controlled Area, if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

- 6.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;
- (b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forchead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

7.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority:

- (2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;
- (3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry,

- 8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;
- (2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

10. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Order.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, I hereby give notice, that the Caerphilly Urban District Council have made Bye-laws with regard to the Omnibus Service undertaken by them under the Caerphilly Urban District Council Act, 1917, and

that a frue copy of such Bye-laws is given hereunder:—

CAERPHILLY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Bye-laws made by the Urban District Council of Caerphilly with respect to the Motor Omnibus Service.

INTERPRETATION.

- 1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Council" means the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Caerphilly; the word "Omnibus" means any Motor Omnibus provided by the Council for the conveyance of Passengers; the word "passenger" means every person being conveyed by an Omnibus; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Council having charge of or helping in the charge of an Omnibus; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Council driving or helping to drive an Omnibus.
- 2. The Bye-laws and regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all Omnibuses of the Council, and to all places with respect to which the Council have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE OR CONDUCT.

3. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any omnibus, omnibus station, waiting-room, shelter, barrier, or any premises used in connection with the omnibuses; or spit or commit any nuisance on, upon, from or against any omnibus, omnibus station, waiting-room, or premises as aforesaid, or in any way wilfully interfere with the

comfort of any passenger.

No passenger or any other person shall, while travelling in or upon any omnibus, or whilst upon any omnibus station, waiting-room or premises as aforesaid, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon any omnibus, omnibus station, waiting-room or premises as aforesaid any wastepaper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or any other objectionable matter in or upon any omnibus, omnibus station, waiting-room or premises as aforesaid.

OBJECTIONABLE PERSONS.

4. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, and no person who from any other cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger shall enter or mount upon any omnibus, and any such person found in or upon any omnibus shall leave the omnibus on being requested by the conductor to do so, and on his refusal he may be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the conductor.

"Infectious or contagious disease" means any of the following diseases:—Small Pox, Cholera, Diphtheria, Membraneous Croup, Erysipelas, the disease known as Scarletena or Scarlet Fever; and the fevers known by any of the following names; Typhus, Typhoid. Enteric, relapsing continued or puerperal.

Dogs.

5. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any omnibus. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus in contravention of this bye-law shall be removed by the person in charge of any such dog or other animal, from the omnibus immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

DAMAGE TO OMNIBUS.

6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on any omnibus, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any omnibus. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws be liable to pay the amount of the damage so done.

SMOKING.

7. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette in or upon any omnibus, except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

PAYMENT OF FARES.

8. Each passenger shall pay to the conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, whether the same shall or shall not be demanded.

Upon payment of the fare the conductors shall give and the passenger shall receive and accept a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid. Such ticket shall be only available by the omnibus on which it is issued, and by the passenger to whom it is given, or in respect of whom it is issued.

A passenger travelling beyond the destination to which his ticket is available shall pay to the conductor the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by him beyond the destination to which he has paid the fare.

TICKETS.

9. Each passenger shall show his ticket if any, when required to do so, to the conductor, inspector or any duly authorised servant of the Council, and shall also when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket in such a condition that the number can be read and any other material portion thereof identified, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

OFFENSIVE CLOTHING.

10. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor or inspector, of an omnibus soil, injure, or damage the seats. linings, curtains, or cushions of the omnibus. or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person, who in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorised officer might for any other reason be offensive to any other passenger, shall enter or remain in or upon any omnibus, and any such person may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any omnibus.

No such person shall enter in or upon any omnibus after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any omnibus he shall on the request of the Conductor, leave such omnibus upon the fare, if previously paid being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised

officer.

Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

INTERFERENCE WITH DRIVER OR CONDUCTOR

11. No person other than the driver or Conductor or other servant of the Council acting in the performance of his duties shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the brakes, switches, lights or any part of the omnibus or its equipment, and, except in case of emergency or accident, no person other than the Conductor or other servant of the Council acting in the performance of his duty shall signal the omnibus to start or to stop.

LUGGAGE.

12. No person shall bring on to any omnibus any luggage other than his own personal luggage, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight.

The Conductor may decline to take, and may prevent any person from taking, upon any omnibus any personal or other luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the Conductor, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the omnibus.

FULL NUMBER OF PASSENGERS.

13. When an omnibus contains the full licensed number of passengers a conspicuous notice to that effect shall be placed on the omnibus.

When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such omnibus when required by the Conductor not to do so.

DISABLED OMNIBUSES.

14. If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the omnibus, and if such passengers have paid their fare shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available omnibus on any section. No person shall, except with the permission of the Conductor or Inspector, mount or enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.

OMNIBUSES PROCEEDING TO GARAGE.

15. No person shall travel upon any omnibus which is proceeding to a shed or garage and is not on its usual route, unless permitted to do so by the Conductor or Inspector, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare on such route.

TRAVELLING ON STEPS, ETC.

16. (a) No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Council shall stand on the steps or platform of any omnibus, or stand on the upper deck or sit on the railing guards or buffers of any omnibus, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor or other officer of the Council.

(b) No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any

omnibus.

(c) No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any omnibus, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the Conductor or other officer of the Council.

FIREARMS, ETC.

17. No person shall place in or upon any omnibus or travel in or upon any omnibus with loaded firearms or any article, implement or instrument or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any omnibuses or the clothing of any passenger.

ENTERING CARS.

18. When an omnibus stops, no persons shall board the omnibus until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

Entering or Leaving Omnibuses in Motion.

19. No person shall enter, mount or leave or attempt to enter, mount or leave any omnibus in motion.

Breaches of Bye-Laws.

20. Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any omnibus any breach of these Byelaws and regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be removed immediately from the omnibus by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to its return.

OBSTRUCTION.

21. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Inspector, Conductor, Driver, or other official or servant of the Council, acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any omnibus or the omnibus service

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-Laws.

22. Every Inspector, Conductor, and Driver of an Omnibus shall to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and prevent any breach thereof.

PENALTY.

23. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

ByE-Laws to be kept in Omnibuses.

24. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

OPERATION.

25. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the twentieth day of November, 1923.
