## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 2nd November, 1923, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

## TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 5th November, 1923, to Saturday, the 10th November, 1923, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax and will, as indicated in the Notice of 5th October, 1923, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 5th November, 1923, to Saturday, the 10th November, 1923, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

By virtue of the powers in me vested by paragraphs 2 and 3 of Order in Council of 22nd March, 1911, I hereby direct that paragraph 2 of the Regulations for the Control of the Admiralty Waters at Gibraltar dated the 1st July, 1911, shall be cancelled and the following substituted therefor:—

2. To prevent chance of collisions in either entrance, the following Regulations will be observed:—

When any ship is about to enter or leave the Admiralty Enclosed Harbour the following signals will be displayed at the Dockyard Tower by direction of the Rear Admiral in Charge, and repeated at the Lighthouses at the North end of the South Mole and at the South end of the North Mole:—

By day ... A square Red flag.  
By night ... A Red light and a Green light vertical, 6 feet apart.

When these signals are displayed, no other vessel shall attempt to enter, leave, or move within Admiralty Waters until such time as the signals are hauled down.

##### *Area Affected.*

1.—(1) This Order applies to the Area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the Area is referred to as the Prohibited Area.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

##### *Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Prohibited Area.*

2.—(a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Area is prohibited, except as provided in the next following Article, provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(b) The movement of any such animal along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Area is prohibited.

(c) No such animals shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Area.

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

##### *Provisions for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.*

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in that Area subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination; Provided that where the distance from the railway station in the Area to the place of destination is greater than the distance to be covered within the Area if the movement were to take place by road, the Inspector granting the licence may specify therein any other route if he thinks it desirable, and may require the animals to be moved by float.

(iii) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

##### *Control of Dogs and Poultry in Prohibited Area.*

4.—(1) Dogs in the Prohibited Area shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served under the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

#### *Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.*

5.—(1) Any dog which is not kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with.

(2) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purpose of vivisection.

#### *Closing of Footpaths and Premises.*

6.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

#### *Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

7. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### *Offences.*

8. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Assembly of the Atlantic Fleet at Spithead on  
2nd and 3rd November, 1923.*

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The Fleet will assemble within the limits of the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth.

2. The Fleet will be anchored within the space enclosed by the following limits:—

*Northern Limit.*—A line joining Spit fort, Gilkicker fort and Stokes bay pier, and thence in a N.W. by W. direction.

*Southern Limit.*—A line joining N.E. Ryde Middle buoy, N.W. and N.E. Mining ground light-buoys off Sturbridge shoal, and Nomans fort.

*Eastern Limit.*—A line joining Spit fort, Horse sand light-buoy, and Nomans fort.

*Western Limit.*—A line joining the outer end of Lee-on-Solent pier and S.E. Ryde Middle light-buoy.

Vessels must not anchor within the above limits.

3. In order to reduce, as far as possible, the chances of collision, all owners of vessels are earnestly requested to give directions to the Masters of their ships to follow closely the instructions herein laid down, and to carry out the requests of the officers in charge of Patrol vessels who will be specially charged with the duty of keeping the anchorage clear during the arrival and departure of the Fleet.

4. The Patrol vessels will carry a red flag at the masthead to distinguish them from other vessels.

5. In the narrow fairways between the Isle of Wight and the mainland, navigation must be conducted with the greatest caution and sailing vessels and small craft must remember that large steam vessels will not always be able to give way to them.

6. Vessels are particularly cautioned against approaching close to squadrons of ships-of-war which may be under way; the fact that they are of heavy draft and manœuvring in pilotage water in close order renders it impossible for them to give way to individual vessels. Masters of sailing vessels and small boats must remember that the wash in the wake of large ships-of-war may cause sailing vessels to miss stays and become unmanageable.

7. Squadrons of the Fleet will arrive both from the eastward and westward between 1400 and 1600 on Friday, 2nd November, and will anchor in the lines shown on the plan of Spithead accompanying the Admiralty Notice to

Mariners. The Fleet will leave for the eastward between 1200 and 1400 on Saturday, 3rd November.

8. Vessels wishing to pass between the lines are to comply with the following Regulations:—

(a) Vessels proceeding to the westward are to pass between D and E lines, a space has been left in E line through which west-bound traffic can pass to the channel south of Ryde Middle shoal.

(b) Vessels proceeding to the eastward are to pass between line E and the light-buoys marking the northern edge of the prohibited area lying east-south-eastward of Sturbridge shoal, or between lines C and D.

9. A fairway has been arranged in the approach to the Swashway. The vessels occupying berths immediately east and west of the line of leading lights through the Swashway will from sunset to sunrise exhibit two fixed white lights vertically.

10. The number of vessels anchored at Spithead during the night of Friday, 2nd November, will render it difficult for ships to navigate this channel on that night.

11. The speed of steam vessels when within the columns is to be limited to 7 knots. Neglect of this rule, especially by paddle steamers, causes danger to small boats which may result in loss of life.

12. Should circumstances render it undesirable that vessels should pass between the columns, the ships-of-war at each end of the space that is closed to traffic will hoist a blue ensign where it can best be seen, which will immediately indicate that no vessel is to pass between these columns. This will be repeated by the Patrol vessel (*see* paragraph 4).

13. Masters of vessels are cautioned that from about the 28th October until the 5th November the following temporary alterations will be made in the buoyage of Spithead.

(a) The two measured mile buoys in Stokes bay will be removed.

(b) The two buoys marking the mining ground off Gilkicker point will be moved to the northward to the positions shown on the plan accompanying the Admiralty Notice to Mariners.

(c) The light-buoy marking the north-western corner of the mining ground lying eastward of Sturbridge Shoal will be moved to the south-eastward to the position shown on the plan accompanying the Admiralty Notice to Mariners.

14. The Patrol vessels, mentioned in paragraph 4, will be stationed as follows during the arrival and departure of the Fleet:—

(a) In the vicinity of the Nab tower.

(b) In the vicinity of a line joining Nomans fort and Outer Spit light-buoy.

(c) In the vicinity of a line joining N.E. Ryde Middle buoy and Browndown point.

(d) In the vicinity of a line joining S.E. Ryde Middle light-buoy and No. 2 Mother-bank buoy.

Merchant vessels must carry out instructions given by these Patrol vessels.
