The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SPECIAL TEMPORARY REGULATIONS RESPECTING A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR THE SITUATION OF SECOND CLASS CLERK (MALE) IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HIS MAJESTY'S GENERAL REGISTER HOUSE, EDINBURGH.

1. The limits of age for this Examination are 19 and 30, with extension to 45 in the case of Candidates now serving in the Sasines Department; Candidates admitted under this extension will be eligible for vacancies in the Sasines Department only.

Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

2. Candidates not employed in the General Register House, Edinburgh, must be natural-born British subjects who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918. Candidates employed in the General Register House, Edinburgh, must be either British subjects who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, or natural-born British subjects and the sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military
