CHAIN TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AS CANCELLED AND FIXED IN THE HAND-HAMMERED CHAIN TRADE FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING FIGURE.

The Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the trade of Hand-Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain Making have given notice as required by Section 4 (3) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, of the making of an Order by the Minister of Labour, dated 22nd October, 1923, and of the contents of such Order, confirming the cancellation and fixing of General Minimum Time Rates and General Minimum Piece Rates in the Hand-Hammered Chain Trade, and specifying the 1st November, 1923, as the date from which the cancellation and fixing of such minimum rates should become effective. The Minimum Rates as fixed are operative for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Figure and apply whether or not the iron is provided by the employer.



(iii) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

Control of Dogs in Prohibited Area.

4. Dogs in the Prohibited Area shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

Seizure, Detention and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.
