The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal, dated the 12th October, 1923, to grant unto Bertram John Seymour Lord Coleridge, formerly one of the Justices of His Majesty's High Court of Justice, an annuity of £3,500 commencing from the 12th day of October, 1923 inclusive.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twentysecond year of the Reign of Her Most
Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled,
"An Act to extend the Act of the twentyfourth year of King George the Third,
Chapter Twenty-six, for issuing Writs during
any Recess of the House of Commons,
whether by Prorogation or Adjournment,"
and of An Act passed in the 26th year of
the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria
intituled "An Act to further limit and define
the time for proceeding to Election during
the Recess."

I do hereby give Notice that it hath been certified to me in writing under the hands of Two Members, serving in this present Parliament in the manner required by the said Act, That The Right Hon. Sir Ernest Murray Pollock, Bt., K.B.E., K.C., late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the County of Warwick, Warwick and Leamington Division, hath accepted the Office of Keeper or Master of the Rolls and Records of the Chancery of England, and has been Gazetted thereto in the London Gazette dated the 16th day of October, 1923, and has thereby vacated his Seat, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new Writ for the Electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said County at the end of Six days after the insertion of this Notice in the London Gazette.
