STAFFORD.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Stafford (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), being the Urban District Council for the said Borough, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Stafford Corporation Act, 1876, and the Stafford Corporation Act, 1880, as amended by certain Provisional Orders made by the Local Government Board and duly confirmed by Parliament, so as:—

(1) To enable the Corporation to borrow for the purposes of their water undertaking further sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of £30,000;

(2) To extend the Corporation's water limits so as to include the parishes or places of Creswell and Brocton, in the Rural District of Stafford, and Coppenhall, Dunston and Acton Trussell with Bednall, in the Rural District of Cannock; and

(3) For the several purposes of the Application, or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes, to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts, or of any other Local Act or Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Notice is hereby given, that H. R. Hooper, Esq., M.I.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the said Ministry, will attend at the Borough Hall, Stafford, on Wednesday, the fourteenth day of November, 1923, at quarter-past eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

**ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS,

**THE MID-LANCASHIRE ELECTRICITY DISTRICT
ORDER, 1923.**

Notice is hereby given, that the Electricity Commissioners have submitted to the Minister of Transport for confirmation under Section 7 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1919, an Order made by them constituting the Mid-Lancashire Electricity District and establishing the Mid-Lancashire Electricity Advisory Board.
