

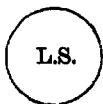

2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place (No. 13) described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister, dated 27th November, 1923 (No. 1792), defining Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Places, is hereby extended so as to include the whole of the farm buildings and all the land known as Ash Tree Farm, situated in the parish of Austerson, in the administrative county of Chester, and in the occupation of Elizabeth Dutton, Ash Tree Farm, Austerson, Cheshire.

3. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place (No. 2) described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister, dated 4th December, 1923 (No. 1873), defining Foot-and-Mouth

Disease Infected Places, is hereby extended so as to include the whole of the farm buildings and all the land known as Stapleford Hall Farm, situated in the parish of Tarvin, in the administrative county of Chester, and in the occupation of Alfred Parker, Stapleford Hall Farm, Tarvin, Cheshire.

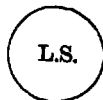
ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

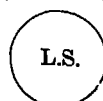
