The landing of animals at the approved Landing Place at the Port of Heysham is hereby prohibited, except for animals intended for slaughter. Such animals shall be moved only to a slaughterhouse within an Infected Area to which the Great Britain (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 5) applies under the conditions prescribed in that Order.
