Description and Limits of Infected Places.

1. The buildings and fields known as Cassop Farm, in the occupation of Henry Bell, in the parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington, in the administrative county of Durham.

2. The buildings and fields known as Muscar House and White House Buildings, in the occupation of Thomas Nelson, in the parish of Houghton-le-Skerne, in the administrative county of Durham.

3. All the buildings and land known as Park-head, in the occupation of William Dawson, in the parish of Pollards Land, in the administrative county of Durham.

4. The premises, buildings and fields known as Moor House Farm, in the occupation of E. Strickland and Sons, in the parish of Preston-upon-Tees, in the administrative county of Durham.
