## A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING THE PROCLAMATION OF 11TH OCTOBER, 1923, FOR DISCONTINUING THE BRANCH MINT AT SYDNEY.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of the Coinage Act, 1870, We did, by the Sydney Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation, 1923, direct that the establishment of the Branch of Our Royal Mint at or near Sydney in New South Wales should, as from the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, be discontinued:

And whereas it has now been represented to Us that it is expedient that the establishment of the said Branch Mint should be continued:

And whereas by virtue of the said Act it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation, to revoke any Proclamation previously made under the said Act:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice of our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. The Sydney Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation, 1923, is hereby revoked, and the

said Branch Mint shall continue to be established as if the said Proclamation had never been made.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Sydney Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation (Revocation) Proclamation, 1923.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Nineteenth day of *December*, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and in the Fourteenth year of Our Reign.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of December, 1923 (N.P. (2) 1467/23), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable

in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“ And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of June, 1920, to sanction, *inter alia*, the grant of a Machinery Allowance of 1s. per diem to the rating in charge of engines at Your Majesty's Wireless Telegraph Stations abroad :

"And whereas we are of opinion that a similar allowance should be paid to ratings in charge of machinery at Wireless Telegraph Stations at home :

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant to such ratings of an allowance of one shilling per diem, with effect from 26th November, 1923.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty’s Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of December, 1923, (N. 3300/23), in the words following, viz. :—

“ Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty’s Naval or Marine Force, to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions,

as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“ And whereas we are of opinion that the rates of extra duty pay at present authorised for non-commissioned officers and men employed in appointments at the several Royal Marine Divisions, and the Depot, R.M., Deal, and at Rifle Ranges abroad require revision; also that extra pay for casual services, as prescribed for seamen and Royal Marines afloat, should be payable to Royal Marines on shore strength :

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment of the rates specified in the annexed Schedules to such members, from such dates, and subject to such conditions, as have been already prescribed by us, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury where necessary, or may in future be so prescribed.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, it is enacted that:—

(1) For the purpose of the administration of matters relating to the Air Force and to the defence of the realm by air there shall be established an Air Council consisting of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who shall be President of the Air Council, and of other members who shall be

appointed in such manner and subject to such provisions as His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct.

(2) His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make provision with respect to the proceedings of the Air Council and the manner in which the business of the Council is to be distributed among the members thereof:

And whereas it is enacted by Section 6 of the Air Navigation Act, 1920, that the purposes of the Air Council shall include all matters connected with air navigation:

And whereas His Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 14th day of July, 1922, made provision with respect to the constitution

of the Air Council and the manner of the appointment of the members thereof:

And whereas by Section 14 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, Orders in Council made under that Act may be varied and revoked by subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the said Order in Council, so far as they relate to the distribution of the business of the Air Council among the members thereof, should be varied, and that for that purpose the provisions hereinafter contained should be substituted for those contained in the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The Air Council shall consist of the following members, that is to say:—

One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State who shall be President of the Air Council.

The Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Air.

The Chief of the Air Staff.

The Air Member for Personnel.

The Air Member for Supply and Research.

The Secretary of the Air Ministry.

(2) Of the members of the Air Council (other than the President) the Chief of the Air Staff shall be appointed by His Majesty and the other members shall be appointed by the Secretary of State.

(3) There may be included in the Air Council such additional members (if any) not exceeding two, as may be appointed by the Secretary of State.

(4) The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Air Council.

All business, other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself, is to be transacted in the following principal divisions:—

(a) The Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Air to be Vice-President of the Air Council and to be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business of the Air Council, and in particular of that relating to Civil Aviation, as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(b) The Chief of the Air Staff to be the first and Senior Air Member of Council, and principal adviser of the Secretary of State in the direction of the Air Force; and in particular to be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the disposition, command, employment, organisation, communications and works services of the Air Force, as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Air Member for Personnel to be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the personnel, discipline and training of the Air Force as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(d) The Air Member for Supply and Research to be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business relating to the equipment, armament, maintenance

and transport of the Air Force, and to aeronautical research and inspection both for the Air Force and for civil purposes, as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(e) The Secretary of the Air Ministry to be responsible to the Secretary of State for such duties discharged by the Air Ministry as are not assigned to other members of the Council, for the control of expenditure, and for the co-ordination of Air Ministry business; and to be also designated Secretary of the Air Council and as such charged with the preparation of all official communications of the Council.

(5) Subject to the foregoing provisions as to the transaction of business in separate divisions the powers and duties of the Air Council may be exercised and performed by any three of their number and notwithstanding that any office, the holder of which is a member of the Air Council, is temporarily vacant, provided however, that documents may be signed on behalf of the Air Council by any two members of the Air Council.

(6) This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated the 14th day of July, 1922.

**WHEREAS** His Majesty, in pursuance of the power conferred upon Him by section thirteen of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, was pleased, by Order in Council made the twenty-seventh day of April, nineteen hundred and eighteen, and entitled the Air Force (Application of Enactments) (No. 1) Order, 1918, to order that the Military Lands Act, 1892, being one of the enactments specified in the first column of the Schedule to the said Order, should apply so as to confer on the President of the Air Council all such powers, rights and privileges in relation to the acquisition and holding of land for the use of the Air Force or for Air Force services or purposes, and in relation to the management, use and disposal in any manner of land acquired for the use of the Air Force or for Air Force services or purposes, as were under that Act at the date of the said Order vested in His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department in relation to the acquisition and holding of land for military purposes or for the service of the War Department, and in relation to the management, use and disposal of land acquired for military purposes or for the service of the War Department, and that that Act as in force at the date of the said Order should apply and have effect in relation to the President of the Air Council and the Air Force with the modifications and adaptations set out in the second column of the said Schedule:

And whereas doubts have arisen whether the provisions of the Military Lands Act, 1892, as applied by the said Order have effect subject to the amendments of those provisions contained



in the Military Lands Act, 1900, or not, and it is expedient that the said doubts should be removed:

And whereas it is provided by section fourteen of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, that Orders in Council made under that Act may be varied by subsequent Orders in Council made in like manner:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power conferred on Him by sections

thirteen and fourteen of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, and all other powers enabling Him, in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Air Force (Application of Enactments) (No. 1) Order, 1918, shall have effect as though the Schedule to that Order comprised the Schedule to this Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the Air Force (Application of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1923.

**WHEREAS** by Section 737 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that where under that Act, anything is authorised to be done by, to, or before, a British Consular Officer, and in any place outside His Majesty's Dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction there is no such Officer, such thing may be done in that place by, to, or before, such Officer as His Majesty in Council may direct:

And whereas the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, has been from time to time amended by various Acts of Parliament, which Acts are construed as one with the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and may be cited together with the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, as the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1923:

And whereas Nauru is a place outside His Majesty's Dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction, but in which there is no Consular Officer:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is expedient that the officer hereinafter named should exercise and perform in the place aforesaid the powers and duties of a British Consular Officer under the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1923:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by Section 737 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct as follows:—

(1) Anything which is, under the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1923, authorised to be

done by, to, or before, a British Consular Officer may be done in Nauru by, to, or before the Officer for the time being acting as Administrator.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Administration in Mandated Territories) No. 2 Order, 1923.

**WHEREAS** by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 14th day of May, 1914, it was provided that the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1906 (6 Edw. VII, c. 15), should apply in the case of Germany in accordance with the Treaties therein described as supplemented by the Convention concluded on the 4th day of May, 1910, for the suppression of the White Slave Traffic:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 30th day of July, 1923, it was provided that the aforesaid Acts should apply in the case of certain Powers and States set forth in the schedule accompanying the Order in accordance with the Treaties therein described as supplemented by the aforesaid Convention:

And whereas His Majesty acceded to the aforesaid Convention in respect of the Protectorate of Southern Rhodesia on the 4th day of November, 1921:

And whereas by a further Order in Council dated the 30th day of July, 1923, and known

as the Southern Rhodesia (Annexation) Order in Council, 1923, it was provided that, from and after the coming into operation of that Order, the Protectorate of Southern Rhodesia should be annexed to and form part of His Majesty's Dominions and should be known as the Colony of Southern Rhodesia, which Order came into operation on the 12th day of September, 1923:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, doth order that the said Acts shall apply in the Colony of Southern Rhodesia in the case of Germany in accordance with the Treaty concluded with that country on the 14th day of May, 1872, and in the case of the Powers and States set forth in the schedule to the Order of the 30th day of July, 1923, in accordance with the Treaties therein described, as supplemented by the Convention of the 4th May, 1910, for the suppression of the White Slave Traffic. This Order may be cited as "the Extradition (Southern Rhodesia) (White Slave Traffic) Order in Council, 1923," and shall come into operation from and after the 1st day of January, 1924.

Provided that where one of the Powers and States set forth in the said schedule has not notified its intention that the said Convention shall come into force in any of its Colonies, Possessions or Consular Judicial Districts by a declaration to that effect deposited in the archives of the Government of the French Republic, the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended in respect of any such Colonies, Possessions or Judicial Districts until such declaration shall have been so deposited, and no longer.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before his Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 8th day of November, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in

Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Newington, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Newington is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Provost and Fellows of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton near unto Windsor (hereinafter called 'the Provost and Fellows of Eton College'):

"And whereas the Provost and Fellows of Eton College are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Newington, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Newington which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Newington:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Provost and Fellows of Eton College (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Newington now vested in them, the Provost and Fellows of Eton College as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us

from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Overstone and Sywell duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Sywell is now full the Reverend Charles Barrington Walters being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Overstone is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Overstone and the said Benefice of Sywell shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sywell cum Overstone' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and shall form part of the Rural Deanery of Rothwell First Portion but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the said two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Overstone only shall be then vacant

the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Sywell and the then Incumbent of Overstone shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice: and if the said Benefice of Sywell only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Overstone and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Overstone if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Sywell shall have been instituted to Sywell subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice: but if he shall have been instituted to Sywell before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Sywell following such avoidance of the Benefice of Overstone and the then Incumbent of Overstone shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

That after the said Union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of three successive turns of presentation for ever thereafter the Patron of the said Benefice of Overstone shall have the first turn, and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Sywell shall have the second and third turns.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Wilfrid Westoe, a coal hewer employed by the South Garesfield Colliery Company, Limited in the following circumstances:—

On October 27th, 1923, while some men were working in a seam on the South Garesfield Colliery, Co. Durham, one of them named Mason was completely buried by a heavy fall of earth and stones about five tons in weight and received severe injuries to his head. The only means of reaching the man was through a small opening and Westoe alone of the men present felt equal to attempting a rescue. He squeezed his way through the opening to the injured man and succeeded after an hour and a half's work in bringing him to safety. Westoe had to work under a continuous hail of stones, while there was great danger of another large fall, and if this had occurred there would have been no possible means of escape. Westoe ran a very grave risk in effecting the rescue and had it not been for his initiative and courage it is probable that Mason would have lost his life.

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act, or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, in force in the said District, as may be necessary or desirable.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Alteration of Regulations as to Movement of Imported Animals from Approved Landing Places.*

1. The Regulations as to movement of imported cattle contained in the Schedule to the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2), and the provisions of Part 4 of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, and the provisions of Part 5 of the Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923, are hereby altered and modified in manner prescribed by this Order.

*Premises to which Movement may be Authorised.*

2. No licence shall be granted authorising the movement of imported cattle, sheep, or goats out of an Approved Landing Place to a market, but only to premises (including a slaughterhouse) other than a market, fairground or saleyard.

*Detention of Animals.*

3.—(1) Animals moved from an Approved Landing Place to a slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(2) Animals moved from an Approved Landing Place to premises other than a slaughterhouse shall, on arriving at those premises, be detained therein, unless previously slaughtered therein, for a period of 28 days from the date

of their arrival thereat and such period shall be substituted for the period of six days specified in the Regulations and provisions hereby altered and modified. During the said period of detention the animals shall not be moved from the said premises.

*Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Railway Loading Banks.*

4.—(1) A railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals from an Approved Landing Place shall immediately before any such animal is placed in it, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant, under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

(2) A railway loading bank or loading dock used for the loading of imported animals at an Approved Landing Place for conveyance therefrom shall, when required by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be:—

(a) a one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime, containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) Nothing in this Article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912, as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

(5) If anything is omitted to be done in contravention of this Article the railway company loading the animals or owning the loading banks in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is omitted to be done, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Revocation.*

5. The Imported Animals Order of 1923 is hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

6. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.
