*Contraction of Limits of Foot-and-Mouth  
Disease: Infected Place.*

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister, dated 15th December, 1923 (No. 2031), defining a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, is hereby contracted so as to comprise only the two pasture fields known as Kelly's and Barn Meadow, all the buildings, farmyard, and stockyard on the premises known as Parkley Farm, situated in the parish of Iscoyd, in the administrative county of Flint, and in the occupation of Thomas Cooke Goodwin, Parkley Farm, Iscoyd, Whitechurch, Flintshire.
