#### ADWICK-LE-STREET ELECTRICITY.

1. **T**HE Urban District Council of Adwick-le-street (hereinafter referred to as the Council) whose address is at the Council Offices, Adwick-le-Street, near Doncaster, in the County of York, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners, under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for a Special Order for the following objects.

(a) To authorise the Council to generate and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the above Acts within the Urban District of Adwick-le-Street (hereinafter referred to as the area of supply) and

(b) To authorise the Council to exercise within the area of supply the powers usually conferred on distributors of electrical energy.

2. The names of the streets and parts of streets in which electrical lines are to be laid down within a specified time are as follows:

Ridge Balk Lane running from the Roman Ridge to the Great North Road, crossing the Great North Road. Tenter Balk Lane from the Great North Road to Red House Lane.

3. The streets not repairable by the local authority which the Council propose to take special powers by the Order to break up are as follows:

Alexandra Road, Cemetery Road, Creighton Street, Grove Street, John Street, Planet Road, Princess Road, Recreation Road, Victoria Road, Villa Road, Woodlands Road, Beech Road, Birch Avenue, Briar Road, Brooklands, Chapel Street, East View, French Street, Hawthorne Crescent, Markham Avenue, Newsome Street, New Street, Park Avenue, Paxton Avenue, Queen's Road, Ridgill Avenue, Trafalgar Street, Treherne Street, Victoria Street, Central Avenue, The Crescent, East Avenue, Great North Road, Harold Avenue, Marson Avenue, The Park, Quarry Lane, The Ridge, West Avenue, Coppice Road, Market Street, South Street and Ridge Road.
