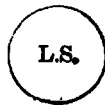

COUNTY BOROUGH OF SALFORD.

THE TRAMWAYS ACT, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on the fifth day of December, 1923, the Town Council of Salford, in pursuance of Section 46 of "The Tramways Act, 1870," duly made the following Byelaws, viz.:—

BYELAWS

WITH RESPECT TO TRAMWAYS AND MOTOR OMNIBUSES.

We, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Salford, in Council assembled this fifth day of December, 1923, do hereby by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on us by the Tramways Act, 1870, the Salford Corporation Act, 1920, and every other power enabling us in that behalf, make, order and ordain the following Byelaws and Regulations, namely:—

REPEAL OF FORMER BYELAWS AND REGULATIONS.

1. From and after the date of these Byelaws coming into force, the Byelaws and Regulations made by the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses on the 13th day of January, 1905, with respect to the Tramways shall be repealed, but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

INTERPRETATIONS.

2. Throughout these Byelaws the following expressions shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, namely:—

"Corporation" means the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Salford, and shall include any lessees or persons for the time being working the Tramways and Motor Omnibus systems hereinafter referred to.

"Tramways Undertaking" means the Tramway and the Motor Omnibus Systems now or hereafter worked by the Corporation whether situate in the County Borough of Salford, the Borough of Eccles, the Urban Districts of Prestwich, Swinton and Pendlebury, or Whitefield, or in any other district.

"Car" means any carriage, car and motor omnibus owned or used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers in connection with the Tramways Undertaking.

"Premises" means any station shelter, waiting room or other place or premises used in connection with the Tramways Undertaking.

"Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car.

"Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

APPLICATION OF BYELAWS.

3. The Byelaws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all cars of the Corporation and to all premises, places and things with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Byelaws.

PAYMENT OF FARES.

4. Each passenger shall either on demand or before leaving the car (whichever first happens) pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for his journey, and accept a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

TICKETS.

5. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any duly authorised officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable from person to person and (except special tickets for transfer to another carriage) shall only be available on the carriage and for the journey for which they are issued, but this Byelaw shall not apply to prevent any passenger who holds a return ticket from using the same in accordance with the terms of its issue.

DEFACING OF TICKETS.

6. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface any ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof, illegible, or knowingly or wilfully use or attempt to use any ticket which shall have been in any respect materially altered or defaced.

WORKMEN'S TICKETS.

7. No person, not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer (within the true meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation) shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

ENTERING AND LEAVING CARS.

8. Except at a terminus and when so directed by the Conductor at other stopping places appointed by the Corporation every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform and not otherwise.

All persons desiring to board a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.

ENTERING OR LEAVING A CAR WHEN IN MOTION.

9. No person shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, or leave any car in motion.

UNAUTHORISED TRAVELLING.

10. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railing, guards or buffers of any car, and any person so travelling standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

11. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any car.

12. No person shall improperly hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except on the lower deck of the car with the consent of the Conductor.

13. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such car when warned by the Conductor not to do so.

FIREARMS, &c.

14. No person shall travel in or on any car or enter any premises with firearms or any explosive substance, or with any article, instrument, tool or implement, or any material or substance which may, in the opinion of the Conductor or other authorised officer of the Corporation, be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, provided that nothing contained in this Byelaw shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

Dogs.

15. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any car or premises after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor or other authorised officer of the Corporation. Any dog or other animal taken into or found on any car or premises shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the car or premises immediately upon request by the Conductor or other authorised officer of the Corporation, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by, or under the direction of, the Conductor or such authorised officer.

LUGGAGE.

16. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the Conductor, and shall not exceed 28 lbs. in weight. In no case shall any luggage be put upon or occupy any part of a seat, or be of a size, bulk, form, description or character likely to annoy, hinder or inconvenience any other passenger, or damage any car, or obstruct any Driver, Conductor or other officer or servant of the Corporation.

SMOKING.

17. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars or cigarettes inside any car or premises except in a compartment specially set apart for the purpose.

OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE OR CONDUCT.

18. No person shall swear or use obscene, abusive or offensive language or conduct him-

self offensively whilst in or upon any car or premises, or spit or commit any nuisance in or from or against any car or premises, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind; or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car or premises.

OBJECTIONABLE PERSONS AND OFFENSIVE CLOTHING.

19. No person who is in a state of intoxication, and no person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person who, in the opinion of the Conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall be allowed to enter or remain in or upon such car, and any such persons may be prevented from entering the car, and if found in or upon any car shall, on the request of the Conductor, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car, under the provisions of this Byelaw, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

INFECTIOUS OR CONTAGIOUS DISEASE.

20. No person afflicted with any dangerous, infectious or contagious disorder or disease shall board, enter or travel on any car, or enter or remain on any premises, or attempt so to do, and no Driver or Conductor or other authorised officer of the Corporation shall suffer or permit any such person so to do.

No clothing or other article likely to spread any infectious or contagious disease or disorder shall be brought into or placed by any person on any car or premises, and any such person, clothing, or other article found in or upon any car or premises shall be removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor.

DAMAGING CARS.

21. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice or any advertisement in or on any car or premises, or mark, break or scratch any window, or place his feet upon or lie upon the seat of or otherwise wilfully damage any car or premises.

Any person acting in contravention of this Byelaw shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws, for the amount of any damage so done.

INTERFERENCE WITH THE DUTIES OF THE CONDUCTOR OR DRIVER.

22. No person shall wilfully obstruct, or impede, any Conductor, Driver or other servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or premises.

No person other than the Conductor or the Driver, or other responsible official, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any other part of a car or its equipment, or ring or cause to be rung any of the signal bells in any car, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any car, or signal a car to start by ringing the bell or otherwise.

PASSENGERS TO WAIT IN QUEUES.

23. On occasions when six or more persons being intending passengers by any cars are waiting to enter such cars or any of them at any stopping place or terminus at which the Corporation have erected barriers or posts for the purpose of regulating the formation of queues by intending passengers, they shall form up in a line or queue behind, within, or between such barriers or posts as the case may be, and no such intending passenger nor any other person shall take or endeavour to take any position in such line or queue when formed except in proper order behind the last person in such line or queue or shall enter or endeavour to enter any such car otherwise than in the order in which he was entitled to take up his position as aforesaid.

SPECIAL CARS.

24. No male person shall unless duly authorised by the Corporation mount or attempt to mount upon any car which is run and reserved by the Corporation for female persons only, and on which a notice to that effect is conspicuously exhibited.

In any case in which a car is run and reserved for any special purpose, which shall be indicated by a notice conspicuously exhibited upon such car, no person other than the person or persons for whose conveyance the same car is reserved shall mount or attempt to mount upon such car.

SHELTERS AND WAITING ROOMS.

25. No persons other than intending passengers and servants of the Corporation shall enter any shelter or waiting room provided for the accommodation of intending passengers and servants of the Corporation.

DISABLED CARS.

26. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged or injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall have the right to complete their journey by the next available car. No person shall, except with the leave of the Conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

BYELAWS TO BE EXHIBITED ON CARS, &c.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use and upon all premises a printed copy of these Byelaws.

CONDUCTORS AND DRIVERS TO ENFORCE
BYELAWS.

28. Every Conductor and Driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Byelaws and prevent the breach thereof.

POWER TO REMOVE PASSENGERS COMMITTING
OFFENCE.

29. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

PENALTY.

30. Any person infringing any of the foregoing Byelaws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings, and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten Shillings, in addition to the first-mentioned penalty for every day during which such offence continues.

31. These Byelaws shall come into force on the first day of March, 1924.
