## CONDUCTORS AND DRIVERS TO ENFORCE BYELAWS.

28. Every Conductor and Driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Byelaws and prevent the breach thereof.


## Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

29. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled tc claim its return.

## PENALTY.

30. Any person infringing any of the foregoing Byelaws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings, and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten Shillings, in addition to the first-mentioned penalty for every day during which such offence continues. 31. These Byelaws shall come into force on the first day of March, 1924.
