HAT, CAP AND MILLINERY TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS as VARIED and made EFFECTIVE from 31st December, 1923;* together with Minimum Rates of Wages for MALE and FEMALE WORKERS which are not affected by the variation and which remain in operation.

The Schedule to this Notice sets out:—

- (a) The General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers (other than Learners) and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all Female Workers, and the Overtime Rates based thereon, as varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour specifying the 31st day of December, 1923,* as the date from which such rates should become effective, AND
- (b) The General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Learners, and Overtime Rates based thereon, and the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, and the Overtime Rates based thereon, for all classes of Male Workers set out in the Trade Board's Notice H.M. (10) dated 9th November, 1922, which are unaffected by the variation.

The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates marked §, and the Overtime Rates based thereon, are effective as from 31st December, 1923.* The General Minimum Time-Rates marked †, and the Overtime Rates based thereon, are effective as from 13th November, 1922. In all other cases, the Minimum Rates of Wages are effective as from 20th February, 1922.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 6th January, 1924.

This Notice takes the place of all Notices previously issued by the Trade Board fixing or varying minimum rates of wages.

SECTION III.—Explanation of Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

In the case of all Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER of the class in question, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate appropriate to the class.

In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the above-mentioned condition; regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, *i.e.*, workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, learners and infirm workers.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OF ALL AGES.

SECTION I.—Normal Number of hours of work.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays	9

Provided that all time worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and time worked on Saturday (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of time worked by a worker of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

Overtime Rates for ordinary days (Time-Workers).

A.—FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK :

- (1) ON ANY DAY other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—
 - (a) During the FIRST TWO HOURS OF OVERTIME, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 - (b) For OVERTIME, AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS OF OVERTIME, One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

Where attendance on five days a week only is required.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in paragraphs A (1) (a) and A (1) (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds 9½ and 11½ respectively.

Overtime Rates for Saturday (Time-Workers).

- (2) ON SATURDAY in respect of:—

(a) THAT CLASS OF WORKER WHO CUSTOMARILY ATTENDS ON SIX DAYS A WEEK:—

For all Overtime worked after the first five hours One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

NOTE.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday the Minimum Rate applicable for this class of worker is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Notice.

(b) THAT CLASS OF WORKER WHO CUSTOMARILY ATTENDS ON FIVE DAYS A WEEK:—

- (i) During the first two hours of Overtime, that is to say, during the first two hours worked on Saturday, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

PART III.—*cont.*

Overtime Rates for Sundays and Holidays: (Time-Workers).

(3) ON SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—

For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

Note.—The Overtime Rates set out in Sub-Sections (1) (2) and (3) of this Section are payable as provided above, in respect of all Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Weekly Overtime Rate.

(4) FOR ALL TIME WORKED IN ANY WEEK IN EXCESS OF 48 HOURS, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b), (2) (a), (2) (b) (ii) and (3) of this Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

Overtime Rates for Piece-Workers.

B.—FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:

All Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of all Overtime worked, IN ADDITION TO PIECE-RATES, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable:—

- (a) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-QUARTER OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE.
- (b) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-HALF OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE, OR
- (c) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE,

according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph A of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were:—

- (a) TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (b) TIME-AND-A-HALF, OR
- (c) DOUBLE-TIME, respectively.

SECTION III — Substitution of another day for Saturday as the weekly short day.

In the application of the Overtime Rates set out in this Part of this Schedule the following provisions apply:—

- (a) In the case of Workers who customarily attend on six days a week, any other day, not being Sunday, may be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the provisions of Sections I and II above shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions "Saturday" were substituted for such short day, and such short day were substituted for "Saturday," notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule.

Where attendance is regularly required on Sunday instead of Saturday.

- (b) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this Section shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Schedule as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

PART IV.

SECTION I.

DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of the application of the minimum rates of wages set out in this Notice the following definitions apply:—

- (a) A CUTTER is a Male person employed in marking-in and cutting, using electric machine, band knife, shears, or hand knife on any materials other than linings, inter-linings, peaks, bazils, or any other trimmings, and who has been so employed for not less than five years after the age of 19.
- (b) A BLOCKER is a Male person employed in pulling-on and blocking hats and caps by hand iron or steam or by hydraulic machine and in making shapes by the French gas block, and who has been so employed for not less than five years after the age of 19.

SECTION II.

- (a) A PRESS-CUTTER is a Male person employed on any process of Press-Cutting and who has been so employed for not less than three years after the age of 19.
- (b) A LINING-CUTTER is a Male person employed in cutting linings and inter-linings, or in marking-out, laying-up or hooking-up, and who has been so employed for not less than three years after the age of 19.

SECTION III.

A HOMEWORKER is a worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART IV.—*cont.*

SECTION IV.—Conditions to be complied with in employing Female Learners.

A FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who:—

(a) is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade specified in Part V of the Schedule to this Notice by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, and Certificates of learnership required.

(b) has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with conditions specified in this Section, or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

PART V.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES.

Specification of the Trade

The above Minimum Rate of Wages shall apply to all workers in England and Wales in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery), Order, 1919, that is to say:

The making from any material of men's, women's or children's headgear, or the trimming thereof;

Including:—

Warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear:

But excluding:—

- (1) The casting and making of solid metal helmets;
- (2) The making of rubberised or oilskin headgear where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of other rubberised or oilskin articles;
- (3) The making of nurses' or servants' caps, chefs' caps, hospital ward caps, or similar articles;
- (4) The making of field bonnets, sun-bonnets, boudoir caps, or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-ropes, jumpers, sports coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, under-skirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby linen or similar articles;
- (5) The making of fur hats, where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of furs or furriers' skins into garments, rugs, or similar articles;
- (6) The making of knitted headgear and the making of headgear from knitted fabrics where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabrics;
- (7) Warehousing and packing of men's, women's and children's headgear and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made or trimmed on the premises.

NOTE.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Acts, 1918 and 1921, and the Shops Acts, 1912-1921.

PART VI.

Rates to be paid clear of all deductions.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of Orders of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages set out above and specifying the dates shown in this Notice as the dates on which the respective rates become effective.

The Renfrewshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 6) and any Order amending that Order shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule hereto were included in and formed part of the Controlled Area described in the Schedule to the first mentioned Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

FIFE AND PERTHSHIRE DISTRICT
(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER
OF 1923 (No. 6).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order:—

The "Controlled Area" means the Area described in the Schedule hereto in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs.

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area, except as provided in Article 3 of this Order.

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 3 of this Order

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area.

(c) No animals shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area.

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale of fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such market or sale on any premises within a radius of five miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence into, within, or out of the Controlled Area.

3. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a farm in the Controlled Area;

(c) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;

(d) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(e) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence “Occupation Licence.”)

(f) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm in that area to any public slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area to which the Renfrewshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 6) for the time being applies. In the case of such movement the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of

the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated, and shall not be available unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the movement commences.

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Conditions of Licence.

4.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except where otherwise expressly stated and also except in the case of movement from premises outside the Controlled Area to a destination in such Area, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Infected Place, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in that Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals, while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route, and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority.

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

5. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Controlled Area if the animals are not untrucked within the Area.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

6.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hind-quarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Power to Reduce Time Limit for Slaughter of Animals.

7. Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated may, if they think fit, require the animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours from the time of their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Controlled Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents, or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

10. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

11. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Orders.

12. The Fife and Perthshire District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 3) and the Fife and Perthshire District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1923 (Nos. 4 and 5) are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.
