# BUTTON-MAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OTHER THAN HOME-WORKERS.

This Notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers, other than Homeworkers, as varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 3rd January, 1924, together with the Minimum Rates for Male Workers (as set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice V. (8) dated 21st July, 1922) which are not affected by the variation and which remain in operation.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:-

- (1) The Minimum Rates for Male Workers as from 1st August, 1922 (except in the case of Minimum Rates marked † and the Overtime Rates based thereon which became effective as from 17th October, 1921);
- (2) The Minimum Rates for Female Workers as from 7th January, 1924.\*
- \* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 13th January, 1924.

# PART III—continued.

Section II.—Overtime Rates.

OVERTIME RATES calculated on the Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner specified below, shall apply in substitution for the minimum rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all time worked in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade declared by the Trade Board as set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule, that is to say:

- (a) Male and Female Workers Employed on Time-Work:-
  - For all time worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, 1.e., DOUBLE TIME.

Provided that the said Overtime Rate shall not apply—

- (i) In respect of time worked on Good Friday in the case of workers who are given Easter Tuesday as a holiday in lieu of Good Friday; or
  (ii) In respect of time worked on Easter Tuesday in the case of workers who
- are given Good Friday as a holiday in lieu of Easter Tuesday.
- (2) For all time worked in excess of five hours on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time-rate applicable, i.e., Time-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraph (1) of sub-section (a) of this section.

(3) For all time worked in excess of 48 hours in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time-rate applicable, i.e., Time-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraph (1) of sub-section (a) of this section.

(b) Female Workers Employed on Piece-Work:-

Female Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive, in respect of all time worked in excess of 48 hours in any week, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, at least 71d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, A SUM CALCULATED AT THE RATE OF 1d. PER HOUR.

SECTION III.—Attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday.

Where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday the minimum rates for Overtime shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of the Trade Board relating to "Overtime" the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

# PART IV.

Section I.—Applicability of Rates.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers (other than Home-Workers) in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, and as set out below.

Section II —Definition of Trade to which Trade Boards Acts apply.

The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

The manufacture of buttons, button-moulds, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding the shanks), from any material by the process of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrelling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing, sewing, crocheting or the covering of button moulds;

Including-

- (a) The manufacture of studs, links, or parts thereof, from any material other than. metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;
- (b) The manufacture of shanks for buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;

(c) The carding of any of the above articles, wherever carried on;

(d) All despatching, packing, warehousing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

But Excluding-

- (e) The manufacture of wooden button moulds;
- (f) The covering of button moulds where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel.

### PART V.

Section I.—Rates to be paid clear of all deductions.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

### PART V-continued.

Section II.—Rates without prejudice to workers earning higher rates.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

#### PART I.

# GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES FOR THE CARDING BY FEMALE HOME-WORKERS OF LINEN BUTTONS AND METAL TROUSER BUTTONS.

General Minimum Piece-Rates for Carding Linen and Metal Trouser Buttons.

Column I. To apply to workers who collect the work from and deliver the work to the factory, workshop or warehouse, and do not receive it through a middlewoman or a middleman.

Column II. To apply to all workers not included under Column I.

The General Minimum Piece-Rates set out above apply to the actual workers and not to the Middlewoman or Middleman. The cotton for sewing the buttons must be provided by the employer.

# PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE HOME-WORKERS.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for certain classes of Female Home-workers.

For all Female Home-Workers, other than those employed

on carding linen buttons and metal trouser buttons 73d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Home-Workers employed on PIECE-WORK, except those to whom the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part I. apply. EACH PIECE-RATE PAID MUST BE SUCH AS WOULD YIELD in the circumstances of the case NOT LESS THAN 72d. PER HOUR to an ORDINARY WORKER, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the classes of work in question.

#### PART III.

Definition of "Home-worker."

For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Home-worker" means a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

# PART IV.

SECTION I .- Applicability of Rates.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Home-Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, and as set out below.

SECTION II.—Definition of Trade to which Trade Boards Acts apply.

The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:-

The manufacture of buttons, button-moulds, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding the shanks), from any material by the process of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrelling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing, sewing, crotcheting or the covering of button moulds;

#### Including-

- (a) The manufacture of studs, links, or parts thereof, from any material other than metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;
- (b) The manufacture of shanks for buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;
- (c) The carding of any of the above articles, wherever carried on;
- (d) All despatching, packing, warehousing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

#### But Excluding—

(e) The manufacture of wooden button moulds;

(f) The covering of button moulds where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel.

#### PART V.

SECTION I.—Rates to be paid clear of deductions.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—Rates without prejudice to workers earning higher rates.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

- 2. The whole of the farm buildings and premises, and also the field known as the Long. Field, of Twirlow Farm, in the occupation of Arthur Thomas Smith, in the parish of Sandon.
- 3. The whole of the farm buildings and premises, and also the fields known as Stack-yard Field, Bantry Field and College Meadow, of Old Lea Farm, in the occupation of Frederick William James, in the parish of High Offley.
- 4. The whole of the farm buildings and premises, and also the fields known as the Yew Tree Field and Milking Bank of Waste Farm, in the occupation of Thomas Cooper, in the parish of Audley.
- 5. The whole of the farm buildings and premises, and also the pastures known as Grouts Field and the Ines, of New Hayes-Farm, in the occupation of Joseph Matthews, in the parish of Swynnerton.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 7TH JANUARY, 1924.)

FORFARSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1924.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

# Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order:-

The Controlled Area means the Area described in the Schedule hereto in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area.

- "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs.
- "Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in force in the Controlled Area.

- 2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area, except as provided in Article 3 of this Order.
- (b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 3 of this Order—
  - (i) into the Controlled Area; or
  - (ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area.
- (c) No animals shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area.
- (d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale of fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such market or sale on any premises within a radius of five miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.
- (e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.
- (f) The landing of animals at the approved Landing Place at the Port of Dundee is hereby prohibited, except for animals intended for slaughter. Such animals shall be moved from the Landing Place only to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area, or in one of the Controlled Areas specified in Article 3 (f) of this Order.

Movement of Animals by Licence into, within or out of the Controlled Area.

- 3. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—
  - (a) From premises outside the Controlled area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area.
  - (b) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a farm in the Controlled Area.
  - (c) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area.
  - (d) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in such Area.
- (e) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")
  - (f) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm in that area to any public slaughterhouse in the Controlled Areas to which the Renfrewshire and District (Foot and Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 6) and the Fife and Perthshire District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 6) for the time

being apply. In the case of such movement the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated, and shall not be available unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the movement commences.

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movemen of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

# Conditions of Licence.

- 4.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except where otherwise expressly stated and also except in the case of movement from premises outside the Controlled Area to a destination in such Area, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination is situate.
- (b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Infected Place, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in that Area.
- (c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted.
- (d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement.
- (e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement.
- (f) Animals, while being moved with a licence under this Order, shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route, and without avoidable delay, to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals.
- (g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority.
- (h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

5. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Controlled Area if the animals are not untrucked within the Area.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

6.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered.

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hind-quarter, and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Power to Reduce Time Limit for Slaughter of Animals.

7. Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated may, if they think fit, require the animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours from the time of their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

- 8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Controlled Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents, or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.
- (2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.
- (3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

# Control of Dogs and Poultry.

- 9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.
- (2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

10. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

## Offences.

11. Any contravention of this Order, or of any notice served thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

### Short Title ...

12. This Order may be cited as the Forfarshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1924.

ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 1 of the year 1924.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

PART I.
CLOSING OF PORTS.

Former Notice.—No. 1 of 1923; hereby cancelled.

- (1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5). Part II., of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.
- (2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must approach the port with the greatest caution and implicitly obey all orders or signals given them by the Examination vessel or signal station.

(3) At some ports or localities at home or abroad, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing movable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.

# PART II.

#### Examination Service.

- (4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter ports or localities at home or abroad.
- (5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of

examining ships which desire to enter the port and of allotting positions in which they shalf anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the port. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.

(6) As the institution of the Examination Service will probably be unknown to vessels desiring to enter the port, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound-rocket.

In approaching by night any British port in the United Kingdom or abroad, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lanterns, two red and two white, are kept available for use

(7) By day the distinguishing flag of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border).

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.

Usually the Examination Steamers will flythe blue ensign, but in certain circumstancesthey may fly the white ensign.

By night the steamer will carry:—

- (a) Three red vertical lights if the port is: closed.
- (b) Three white vertical lights if the portis open.

The above lights will be carried in addition: to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

- (8) Masters are warned that, when approaching a British port where the Examination Service is in force, they must have the signal letters of their vessel ready to hoist immediately the Examination Steamer makes the signal: "What ship is that?"
- (9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any port when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that it is forbidden, except for the purpose of avoiding accident, to do any of the following things, without permission from the Examining Officer:—

To lower any boat.

To communicate with the shore or with: other ships.

To move the ship.

To work cables.

To allow any person or thing to leave the ship.

- (10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the port should be approached with caution.
- (11) When the Examination Service is in force merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night; the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.
- (12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

#### PART III.

#### MINE-SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

H.M. Vessels engaged in mine-sweeping operations or exercises are hampered to a considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which they are engaged, these vessels will show the signals hereinafter mentioned. For the public safety all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, should endeavour to keep out of the way of vessels flying these signals and not approach them inside the distances mentioned herein, specially remembering that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair or group sweeping together.

- 1. SIGNALS THAT WILL BE SHOWN BY DAY.
- (a) By vessels working singly:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at the yard-arm or where it can best be seen on that side on which it is dangerous to pass. (If a ball is shown at each yard-arm it is dangerous to pass either side.)

Vessels showing this signal should not be approached nearer than 900 yards (822<sup>m</sup>9) (b) By vessels working in pairs or groups:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at the yard-arm or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous to pass.

Vessels should not pass within a distance of 400 yards (365<sup>m</sup>8) astern of a pair or group of sweepers, or when more than one pair or group are working in company within a distance of 400 yards (365<sup>m</sup>8) astern of the rear pair or group. They should on no account attempt to pass between pairs or groups working in company.

2. Signals that will be Shown by Night.

As for day, except that all round green lights will be used in a similar manner to and in place of the black balls.

That part of the North Sea to the eastward of long.  $4^{\circ}\,00'$  E. and between lat.  $53^{\circ}\,00'$  N. and lat.  $56^{\circ}\,30'$  N.

The foregoing caution has been rendered necessary owing to danger of sunken mines on the bottom. Attention is drawn to the cautionary note on the charts on this subject.

# II. GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING MINES.

1. Mariners are warned that a certain number of mines have sunk without exploding. It is possible that some of these mines lying on the bottom may still be dangerous. Surface vessels navigating these areas should therefore, whenever possible, have a clear depth of at least six feet (1<sup>m</sup>8) between their keels and the bottom when in the vicinity of shoal water or in the approaches to ports and harbours which were subjected to mining operations during the war.

2. In removing prohibition upon vessels trawling, it is pointed out that a risk, although of a diminishing character, still exists.

The attention of all vessels trawling is drawn to the immunity which may be secured by the use of a suitable protective device to prevent mines entering the trawl.

As can be readily understood, it is not possible to predict for how long a period sunken unexploded mines remain dangerous, and consequently no unnecessary risk should be taken.

3. Mariners are notified that a small percentage of drifting mines are known to exist in a waterlogged condition, a fraction of which may be dangerous This type of mine is hard to see, and special precautions are therefore necessary to ensure that a good lookout is kept. The striking of low floating flotsam should be avoided.

4. A serious accident has occurred to a vessel at anchor from the explosion of a drifting mine which came into contact with an obstruction on the hull.

When vessels have to anchor in areas where drifting mines may be found it is necessary that all obstructions should as far as possible be removed and gangways triced up before

dark in order to minimise risk.

5. In regard to the great importance of the destruction of mines with a view to preven-tion of loss of life and shipping, attention of Masters is called to the necessity for strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter II., "Admiralty Instructions for British Merchant "June 1919, and especially Section xiii., which includes the following :-

"Whenever practicable, vessels should attempt to sink or destroy mines by gun or rifle fire, but no mine is to be sunk in any fairway where the depth of water at low water spring tides is less than 7 fathoms (12<sup>m</sup>8), except when a mine is drifting towards a vessel at anchor, and no vessel is to approach within 200 yards (182m9) of a mine whilst attempting to sink or destroy it.

"The attention of Masters is drawn to the great desirability of taki, g every opportunity of sinking drifting mines, as their co-operation will help to free the seas of them within a reasonable period."

The Admiralty award for sinking or destroying a mine is only applicable to the territorial waters of the United Kingdom and Irish Free State.

Before hoisting the mine flag or reporting a mine which has been left afloat, every care should be taken to confirm that the object actually is a mine, in order to prevent unnecessary confusion; the mine flag is a square flag white over blue diagonal.
