The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge, on the 8th day of May, 1923, and sealed by the University of Cambridge Commissioners on the 15th day of December, 1923, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Sidney Sussex College in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes were duly made at a Meeting of the Governing Body of the College, specially summoned for this purpose, and held on the eighth day of May one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and having been passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the said College, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes of our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

By repealing in Chapter XIII, intituled "Of the Bursar, the annual College Officers and the Audit of Accounts" the two concluding sen-

tences of the second paragraph and substituting therefor the two following sentences:—

"The Bursar shall submit his accounts, duly audited, to a College Meeting, once a year, within sixty days after Michaelmas. The Master shall give at least four weeks' notice of this Meeting to all the Fellows."

By substituting in Chapter XIX, intituled "Of Dividends," the word "yearly" for the word "half yearly" in the opening part of the second paragraph, and also in the third paragraph of this Statute.

By substituting the sum of "two hundred and fifty pounds (£250)" for the sum of "one hundred and twenty-five pounds (£125)" in the concluding part of the second paragraph and also in the third paragraph of the same Statute.

We, the University of Cambridge Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by Section 56 of the Schedule to the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, ch. 33), do hereby consent that the herein contained amendments to Chapters XIII and XIX of the Statutes of Sidney Sussex College, be submitted to His Majesty in Council under the said Act.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND
TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 18th January, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject

to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 21st January, 1924, to Saturday, the 26th January, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 5th October, 1923, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 21st January, 1924, to Saturday, the 26th January, 1924, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th April, 1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of One shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, Sovereign of the Imperial Service Order, to all to whom these Presents shall come,
Greeting!

Whereas, by Warrants under Our Sign Manual, dated the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and the sixteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, We were graciously pleased to Make, Ordain, and Establish Statutes and Ordinances for the government of the Imperial Service Order and the Imperial Service Medal, reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating and augmenting, interpreting and dispensing with those Statutes by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the Order:

And whereas reproductions of the Badges of the said Order, known as Miniature Badges, are worn on certain occasions, and it appears to Us to be expedient that the size and pattern of such Miniature Badges should be clearly defined:

Now We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, Make, Ordain and Establish the following additional Statutes and Ordinances:—

Firstly.—It is ordained that the Miniature Badges worn by the Companions of the Imperial Service Order shall be half the size of the Badges of the Companions of the said Order.

Secondly.—It is ordained that Sealed Patterns of the said Miniature Badges shall be deposited and kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

And it is Our Will and Pleasure that these special Statutes shall be taken and received as part and parcel of the Statutes of the said Order.

Given at Our Court of *Saint James's*, this seventeenth day of *December*, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, in the Fourteenth Year of Our Reign.

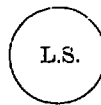

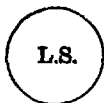
