MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS *OTHER THAN* APPRENTICES IN THE CIGAR SECTION OF THE TRADE.

This notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers *other than* apprentices in the Cigar Section of the Trade, which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by Orders of the Minister of Labour, and which are at present effective under the Trade Boards Acts.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows :—

1. The General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I of the Schedule below in their application to workers who have not completed the first twelve months of employment as Learners to Hand or Mould Cigar Making and who were previously excluded from the operation of the Minimum Rates under the provision, *now cancelled*, set out in Part V of the Schedule below, and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 14th January, 1924*.

2. The General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I of the Schedule below in their application to workers other than the Learners to Hand or Mould Cigar Making referred to in the preceding paragraph as from the 19th July, 1920, and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from the 16th May, 1921.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 20th January, 1924.

Provided that learners in the manufacture of cigarettes by hand of the age of 16 years and over, who enter the Hand Cigarette Making Branch of the trade for the first time, and who are employed on time work may be employed for a period of three months at a General Minimum Time-Rate 20 per cent. below the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

SECTION II.

- (a) The above General Minimum Time-Rates are for a week of 48 hours, and, except as set out below, are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.
- (b) Provided that in the case of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, where the number of hours customarily worked per week in the establishment agreed between the employer and worker is less than 48 ;
- the weekly wage payable and applicable shall be not less than that set out above.
 - the weekly wage payable and applicable shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment is less than the number customarily worked in the establishment ;
 - the weekly wage payable and applicable shall be subject to a proportionate increase according as the number of hours of employment up to 48 (not being hours to which Overtime Rates are applicable as set out in Part II below) is greater than the number customarily worked in the establishment.

NOTE.—Proviso (b) does not apply in cases where the number of hours worked per week in the establishment is less than 48 by reason of systematic short time being worked.

PART I—*continued.*

SECTION III.

For the purpose of the application of the above rates to workers employed on piece-work, in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 (1) (b) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ORDINARY WORKER not less than the weekly wage, as set out in Section I above, or, in cases where the number of hours customarily worked is less than 48, the rate applicable as provided by Section II (b) above.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OTHER THAN APPRENTICES IN THE CIGAR SECTION OF THE TRADE.

SECTION I.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE TO BE as follows :

In any week	48
On any weekday (other than Saturday)...	9
On Saturday	5

Provided that all time worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

The Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers to apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates which would otherwise be applicable in respect of all time worked by Male and Female Workers, whether employed on Time-work or on Piece-work, in excess of the declared Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade shall be as follows :—

- (1) During the FIRST TWO HOURS' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (2) For Overtime AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (3) For all time worked on SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.
- (4) For all time worked in any week in excess of 48 hours One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section.

The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that :—

Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

NOTE.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, the Education Acts, and the Shop Acts.

PART III.

The respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to Male and Female Workers other than Apprentices in the Cigar Section of the Trade in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of Tobacco, Cigars, Cigarettes, Cigarette Tubes and Snuff, including all preparatory processes, and including also the operations of storing and store-keeping, boxing, packeting, labelling, parcelling and despatching, and all other warehousing and packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

PART IV.

SECTION I.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

PART V.

CANCELLATION OF A PROVISION EXCLUDING A CLASS OF WORKERS FROM THE OPERATION OF THE MINIMUM RATES.

The following provision relating to the applicability of the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Section I of Part I above has been CANCELLED as from 14th January, 1924 :—

Provided also that the above General Minimum Time-Rates shall not apply during the first twelve months of his or her learnership to any male or female Learner to Hand or Mould Cigar making who

- (a) is employed under a verbal or written agreement (not being an Indenture of Apprenticeship), providing for his or her effective instruction in the making of hand or mould cigars for a period of four years, such period to include a probationary period of six months, on the completion of which the learnership may be determined at the instance either of the employer or learner ; and
- (b) has been registered, in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such registration, which has been duly acknowledged, and is still under consideration.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE APPRENTICES IN THE CIGAR SECTION OF THE TRADE.

This Notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Apprentices in the Cigar Section of the Trade which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board and Confirmed by Orders of the Minister of Labour and which are at present effective under the Trade Boards Acts.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as from 14th January, 1924. (Note :—The Rates set out below have been effective in the case of apprentices indentured in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as from 1st September, 1921, as set out in the Board's Notice N (8) now replaced by this Notice.)

SCHEDULE.

SECTION II.—Sub-Section I.

- (a) In the case of classes of whole time workers, employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48, "a week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question ;

Sub-Section II.

For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the rates set out in Sections I and II must be divided :—

- (a) In the case of the workers referred to in Sub-Section I (a) above by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question ;

- (3) For all time worked on SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable.
- (4) For all time worked in any week in excess of 48 hours, One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section.
The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Where attendance on 5 Days a week only is required.

Provided that :—

Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

NOTE :—The Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, the Education Acts and the Shop Acts.

PART IV.

Conditions attached to the employment of apprentices at the minimum rates set out in Part I.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Part I of this Schedule the Apprentice shall be a worker who :—

- (a) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship are not complied with ; and

- (b) Is employed during the whole of his or her time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an Indenture (duly stamped) for a period of five years in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part V. of this Schedule *or in any other form approved by the Trade Board* ; and
- (c) Is employed under conditions where the employment of Apprentices is limited as follows :—

- (i) In the case of Apprentices to Cigar Making :—

1 APPRENTICE to every 3 JOURNEYWORKERS in the service of the employer as Cigar Makers during the period of twelve months prior to the date of Application for Registration.

- (ii) In the case of Apprentices to Cigar Sorting and/or Bundling :—

1 APPRENTICE to not less than 5 JOURNEYWORKERS in the service of the employer as Cigar Sorters and/or Bundlers, during the period of *twelve* months prior to the date of Application for Registration.

2 APPRENTICES to 7 such JOURNEYWORKERS.

4 " " 20 " "

And thereafter one additional APPRENTICE to every additional 5 such JOURNEYWORKERS.

For the purpose of determining the proportion of apprentices to Journeyworkers, the number of Journeyworkers shall be taken as the average, arrived at by dividing by 52 the sum of the numbers of Journeyworkers employed in each of the 52 weeks prior to the date of application.

The form of Indenture of Apprenticeship referred to in paragraph (a) of Part IV. of this Schedule is as follows:—

2. The term of service shall be 5 years from the _____ day of _____ 19 _____, unless determined as hereinafter mentioned.

3. The Employer shall pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of wages as fixed and as varied from time to time for Apprentices by the Tobacco Trade Board (Great Britain).

4. The Apprentice shall during the said term diligently apply _____ self to the work given to _____ to do and shall faithfully serve the Employer and keep all his secrets and obey all the lawful commands of the Employer and shall not do any damage to the Employer's property or business or waste spoil or destroy lend or dispose of his goods or property or absent _____ self from work without the previous consent of the Employer but shall in all things conduct _____ self with propriety, diligence and sobriety as a good and faithful Apprentice towards the Employer.

5. The Employer shall during the said term unless determined as hereinafter mentioned provided the Apprentice shall properly conduct _____ self and perform and observe the covenants, terms and conditions herein contained, use his best endeavours to teach and instruct or cause the Apprentice to be taught and instructed in the said art of* _____ as practised by the said Employer at his said establishment.

6. The Employer shall supply to the Apprentice forthwith upon the execution of these presents a true copy of this Indenture.

7. Where in the opinion of the Employer the work performed by the Apprentice is unsatisfactory it shall be returned to h _____ for alteration and the minimum rates applicable under the Determinations of the Tobacco Trade Board (Great Britain) shall not be payable in respect of such work. Provided that where work is accepted by or on behalf of the employer it shall be paid for at the appropriate minimum rates as fixed by the Trade Board and made effective under the Trade Boards Acts.

8. In consideration of the premises the Guardian covenants and agrees with the Employer that the Apprentice shall honestly and diligently serve the Employer as his Apprentice during the term aforesaid and perform and observe the terms and conditions, covenants, provisos and agreements on the part of the Apprentice herein contained and that h _____ Guardian, h _____ Executors or Administrators will at h _____ or their own expense find and provide the Apprentice with good and sufficient board, lodging, clothing, washing and medical attendance and all other necessities during the said term.

9. Should the Apprentice be incapacitated by illness or other cause (save as hereinafter mentioned) from attending to h _____ duties during any portion of the said term exceeding one week at any one time the period of such incapacity shall not be reckoned in the period of five years but shall be made good and served in addition thereto, and the expression "the said term" whenever herein appearing shall be deemed if the context requires or admits it to include such additional period.

10. In case the Apprentice shall during the said term commit any breach of the provisions of the fourth clause hereof or be guilty of any insubordination or of misconduct, or being a female shall contract matrimony during the said term, or in case _____ Guardian or any other persons with whom _____ shall reside shall while _____ shall be residing with them sell or deal in or be interested in tobacco without the consent in writing of the Employer, or if the Apprentice shall carry on or be concerned or interested in or about any business, trade or occupation other than that of the Employer, without the like consent, it shall be lawful for the Employer without notice to determine and put an end to the Apprenticeship hereby created, and to dismiss the Apprentice forthwith without making any payment in lieu of Notice and thereupon the said Apprenticeship shall cease and determine.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—*Applicability of Rates.*

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule apply to *Male and Female Apprentices* in respect of all time during which they are employed in the *Cigar Section of the Trade* specified in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919. Provided only that they shall not apply to *Indentured Apprentices in the Cigar Section of the Trade employed under an Indenture entered into prior to 1st September, 1921.*

SECTION II.—*Definition of Trade to which Trade Boards Acts applies.*

The Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919, is as follows :—

The manufacture of Tobacco, Cigars, Cigarettes, Cigarette Tubes and Snuff including all preparatory processes, and including also the operations of storing and store-keeping, boxing, packeting, labelling, parcelling, and despatching, and all other warehousing and packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

PART VII.

SECTION I.—*Rates to be paid clear of all deductions.*

The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.
