THis Morning one Simon Van Hant，laden from＇ Hokiant with fer eral Cominodinies to a confide－， rable value，in ended for London，ran bis Vel－ fel on Ihore nerr Deal Caftle；the Veffel being \＆Gallint Hoy of 100 Tuns，much broken：but the great－ eff part of her lading like to be prefer ved．
Venice，Dec．22．Fro ul Mefina we are advifed，that the 17 th paft，Sir Daniel Harvy，Ambaffadour from His Maje－ fly of ．peat Brizain，lailed by that place，intended for Con ffatinop．e，and that thee Corfai＇s of Tripoli have been cruifing in that Gulf，where they feifed three French Ihips and one R ：rk．
Here are late＇y arrived three fhips from Candia，and up－ on them fome perfons of Honour，who have liber：y given them for fonte rime to vifi this place；they came from thence the 26 th of the laft mone $h$ ，by whofe report，as well as by the imp ax of all the Letters brought with them from the principal Commahders there，we are affed，that the Gar－ rifon is full of courage and relo ution to defend that place to the laft againg the Turks，and are plentifully provided with all neceflaries，having within the Town above in elve thou－ fand able and well refolved men，amoligtt whom are atcount－ ed the 1200 French la＇ely arrived，moit of them reformed Officers，and weil texperfenced in Miterty affairs，who Tad in feveral fallies given evideat proofs alfo of their valor． They rell us，that the Turks have wi turawn themfelves to a farther diftance from before the Fort di sabionera，but， concique fill with much obftinscy before the to $t s t$ ，Andre， endeavonring by their advancing upon the lhoar，to fhut up the entry into the Hapen；upon whom，Ceveral brisk falies had been made with fonfiderable exe utions，in one of them． efpecially，the Tarks were very fenfible of their valour， wherein，the French marching out in four ditifirns under the Command of the Dake de Roanner，who 含ftill onned there by his ancient Title of de la Feuillade， b at offthe E－ nemy with extraordinay 1 a ughter，but not with ．ut the lofs of many of their own party；and che berier．to beat off the Turks from their defi，${ }^{2}$ ，our people were labouting hard at Atir Mines，and had two reaty in fpring about the point of the Fort St．Andre，whith if they fucceede faccording to the confidence they had in them，they invend $d$ at the lame time to make a lufty fatly and hoped to dillodge the rurks for this winter．
The Senate fias ortered General Vetrimiller to be fent in－ to Dalmatia with the Title of Great Mafter of the Artil－ lery，add the allowanti of 4000 Ducats yearly for his fube fiftirce．

Legorn，Decemb．29．A thip larely arriving from the Levant，informs us，thas the $6 . h$ inftant arived ft $S m$ ipe． nateveral Engl：fh thips with a Mzn of War，havirg on board his Excellency Sir Daniel harvey \＆His N＇a！fty of Great Aritain＇s Ambalfadour，bound for Confinnteropile： They farther tell us，that about 900 Jannas ies atcula ely put into chios，intended for cianca．for the revirfarcement of the Tuikufh Army；and that fonse French Men of War were gone towards the Dardanelles，intenc ng for Conftana tinople；where they are to attend the Fiench Ambafiadours who having concluded lris Negotiati it there，is preparing Tor fis return；onely waiting for their arrival．

From Parma we are rel，shat the Ccunt San Seconde one of the P̈rincipal S ibjects to that Duse，is la ely ena－ plaied thence or Rome，in quality of Ambaffadour to the Pope；with Intructions to adjouft the long difpured bu氏－ nefs of Caftro ：and＇tis faid fince the reftoring of it has met with fo many difficulties，to compound for is for a confib derable furn of moneys to be advanced by the Pope；who is allo to quir him of the $\Gamma$ ebr of 2600 houfana Crowns which is alrency owing re the（hurde

From Venice they write that the Pope in favour to that Republick，and to enable chem with more eafe to defay the vaft expences 1 ing on them in making theit defence againit the Octoman power，freely gave them leave to raile Mo－ neys upon the Lands of feveral Conve ts within thai jurif－ didian，and no difolve thei，$O$ vers of Religion；but in rea turn defired that the Republick would in recompenfe to the Church，difpenfe with their Law，（ prohibitiug the giving of any Iands to Religious scundations）ull the charity of well difpored people lhould hav made uponly as much ar was upon this urgent neccffity taken aways but to this point tic Repubick fe t thei tacule，fince they had put is out of their power，to própole a y diffenfation for that Laws but have（n far comply＇d with him，as to give leave ooth $x$ Ecclefiaftical foundarions，to purchatsallo wha prethry plonfe of thofe Lanus which are by the P pes permiffion to be alienated．

Hambourgh，fan．1．The Luzenbourgh Leavis for the affitance of th－Repub，ick of Venicein the defence of Candia being compleated，are $n u w$ upon thei march，all of them full of zealand courage for the fervice，having befire their des parsure，Proclanarion magueamon it them giving free li－ bery to all fuch as dillike $\ddagger$ that marah，to leave the fervice and to fay at home，which in all the cumber was accepred of only by two difeafed perfanf，whofe indilpofitions excufed them，and one other who for his want of courage was pubt lickly fiript fom his Soldiers coar，which was immediately be fowed upon anocher，who frecly offered himfelf to fill his place．

Froma Whay faw we are advifed，that Gnce she fepraxioa of the ate Afiembly，there have been itveral leffer meetings of the Nobility for the preferiation of the peace of the Kings do $3_{3}$ which they iniend to pur into furi a Pr fture，as may i prubsbility prevent al dif rdem ant bave in ald places as greed，that the Arrzer ban br in readinefs，and the whole Counrrey pur into a pofture of oefence，fo as to be in armat upon any occafions which undy offer themedres．

The Crown forees are laid to be diflatisfied with theit Winter Quarters a and contre y to the Orders from their General sobiesky，to have pu themfodves en sheir march， raking the way towardseserefonsto：The faid General is nor $y$ et fatisfied with the advances of money from the Cler－ gy，which they were to pay for theipexemprion from Quir－ zering of Soldiers，the Sum which thay，have offered of 300 －Thoufand Franchs；－being not thoughr fufficient：－whereup－ on the Bifhop of Promiflic and the Palatine of Rave haye had fe veral Conference with the General；but as yet they are not come to any refolu ion．

General Paz，who commands the furces in Lytinuanid， being diffarisfied with fome practices of the Prioce Radzt． ville upon the Army，oceafioning difpures upon the poim of Quarters 3 and thereby fulpected to intend the drawing the foreds incta Confederatio：；haslately changed his Quar rers，and is ．rawn towards pyrczcie．

They fpeak coo fidently of the promifing hopes the Princes of L̇orrain has to fucceed in the lucceffion，and as confidenta ly，that the Prince of conde has by his Leteter to the Bithop， of B．fers，declared，that he las no ambision for the Crown of Poland，but on the eontrary preffes him to follicite all his friends on the behalf of the Duke of Newbourg．The time appointed for the eletion，is in fure next enfueing， but the Bies to aitemble：he 2 d of May，which times and the Gint to be ptppoled to all perions concerned in the Ele－ ation，wes egreed dipon by the generality of the late Alfembly thoughtifiere wanted not fo reperfons，who emploied theif tndeavers tom ke oppodition．

From Stockbolme＇zue sre told，that the King，Queen－ Mother，and the greateft part of the Seniatols，are again retirned thither ；where feveral Councils have beeth held about the weighty affirs of the Kingdom．

The Bran de Bafferde Envoye Extraordinary from His Imperial Majetlys is till there；bur may inf few dayes de－ parts intending to be prefent at an Affembly which is in lit－ tle time to be held with the Deputies of feveral other Prini： res，Wrc．where fomewhat may be refolved to his fatif fation in the affairs for which the was empl ed tothat

Paris，Yan．16．The number of the Forces intend． ed to miarch towards th Frohtiers of Lorrain are encreafed to about 16 thoufand men，and amongit them 24 Compa－ nies of the Regiment of the Erench Gards，and 8 Coms panies of the Swiffes 3 the reft drawn out of the Garilons of Artoiss extep：ing onely 3 Troops of His Majefties Houmold．The Marefhal de Crequy is gone to Verdun the place appoisted for their Rendezvouz ：fron whence he is to acquaiat the Dulse of Lorrain wich His Majefties plea－ fure 5 shat he forthwith loy down his arms：His Majefty having iffued out an Act of Garranty to the faid Duke，to the Eleftors Palative and Mentz，and all otter Princes and Stanes interefled in the bufneis of the Wildfangs and matters thereen depending：promiling woproft shem fom all violence，and to proceed with his whole power againlt the Aggreflor，till the differences now on foot can be ami－ cably compofed．He has allo difpatched a Declaration to the Conftable of Caftille，affuring him he has i this to 0 － ther defign，than to oblige the Duke of Lorrain so fubmic a the Otder of the Enaperour，and to preferve the publi－k Peace．

On Sunday laft in the Morning arrived here at th Cost Two Officers of the Dike of Lorrain＇s army ；inform ng His Majefty that in Obedience to his（ommanús they had quitred the faid Dukes fervice：giving，mecunt that the Dukes forces confited of about 6000 Hi ir nd near as many Foot ：and that he expefted of a 5 of Horie from Germany，but that his forces＇＊et formed in to a Body．

The Chevalier de Lorrain gone poft to Nancr tr $^{\prime}$ d＇$^{\prime}$ Hatcourt to teturn ix．

On Priday，the Count de Lillebonne arrived at cie Pa－俔ais d＇Orlans，to whom was fene Monfieur de Ljoine from苗lis Majeßly，to know wherher be came a a publick or pri－婴ate pertions to which the anfwoped，khatde was ferr from he Duke of Lorrain to Anegocizte with His Majeity，to hich he received this reply；that if be came not to infotm推is Majefly，that the Duke had laid down his armas，he wss mmediafety to depart，which tee accordingly did，without cing admitted to the Kings prefence．
Letets of the 28 ch of November from Candia teil us，that Council of war being called upon the arrival of the Frencty olubteers，and oches forces，with the 1700 Germans，it was rdered，that the general Sally which was much defired ould be deferred till ths roth of December，by which time hey expected the arriyal of the Einights of Maltha，with the ldiers intended fhicher．
