WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict., c. 52) to 1906 (6 Edw. VII, c. 15), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the 29th day of October, 1901, between His late Majesty King Edward VII and His late Majesty the King of the Belgians for the extradition of criminals, which Treaty was amended by the supplementary Conventions concluded on the 5th March, 1907, and the 3rd March, 1911:

And whereas a further Convention was concluded on the 8th August, 1923, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, which Convention is in the terms following :—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, having deemed it necessary to apply to the Belgian Congo and to certain British protectorates the Extradition Treaty between Great Britain and Belgium of the 29th October, 1901, and the Conventions supplementary thereto of the 5th March, 1907, and the 3rd March, 1911, have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries for this purpose :

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India: the Most Honourable Marquess Curzon of Kedleston, K.G., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

His Majesty the King of the Belgians: his Excellency Baron Moncheur, Commander of the Order of Leopold, etc., etc., His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows :—

ARTICLE 1.

The provisions of the Extradition Treaty between Great Britain and Belgium of the 29th October, 1901, and the Conventions supplementary thereto of the 5th March, 1907, and the 3rd March, 1911, shall apply to the Belgian Congo and to the British protectorates mentioned in the list annexed to this Convention.

If, after the signature of this Convention, it should be considered advisable to extend its provisions to British protectorates other than those mentioned in the annexed list or to territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, then, after agreement arrived at between the respective Governments, its conditions shall apply also to these other protectorates or to such territories from the date prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

ARTICLE 2.

For the purposes of the application of the Treaty of the 29th October, 1901, and the said supplementary Conventions the natives of the Belgian Congo and of the said protectorates and territories shall be regarded as subjects of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

ARTICLE 3.

Requisitions for extradition under the present Convention shall be made in accordance with the provisions of the Treaty of the 29th October, 1901, and as if the said protectorates and territories were foreign possessions of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

Lesquels, après s'être communiqué réciproquement leurs pleins pouvoirs, reconnus en bonne et due forme, sont convenus des articles suivants :—

ARTICLE 1^{er}.

Les dispositions du Traité d'Extradition entre la Belgique et la Grande-Bretagne du 29 octobre 1901 et les Conventions additionnelles audit Traité du 5 mars 1907 et du 3 mars 1911 s'appliqueront au Congo belge et aux protectorats britanniques mentionnés dans la liste annexée à la présente Convention.

Si, après la signature de la présente Convention, il était estimé opportun d'étendre ses dispositions à des protectorats britanniques autres que ceux mentionnés dans la liste annexée ou à des territoires au sujet desquels un mandat au nom de la Société des Nations a été accepté par Sa Majesté Britannique, les dispositions de la présente Convention, après accord entre les Gouvernements respectifs, s'appliqueraient également à ces autres protectorats ou à pareils territoires, à partir de la date indiquée dans les notes à échanger en vue de réaliser l'extension.

ARTICLE 2.

Pour l'application du Traité du 29 octobre 1901 et des Conventions additionnelles prémentionnées, les indigènes du Congo belge et ceux desdits protectorats et territoires seront respectivement considérés comme sujets des Hautes Parties contractantes.

ARTICLE 3.

Les demandes d'extradition, en vertu de la présente Convention, seront faites conformément aux dispositions du Traité du 29 octobre 1901 et comme si lesdits protectorats et territoires étaient respectivement des possessions extérieures des Hautes Parties contractantes.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible. It shall come into operation ten days after its publication, in conformity with the laws of the High Contracting Parties and shall remain in force as long as the Extradition Treaty between Great Britain and Belgium of the 29th October, 1901, and shall lapse with the termination of that Treaty.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate at London, the 8th day of August, 1923.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of Chapter 155 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.
