Oxford University.

Adding a further sub-clause to *Statt. Tit. XIX. Section 19, cl. 13 (iv)* (p. 356, ed. 1922), "enabling Christ Church to reckon as an additional deduction as from January 1, 1922, a sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred pounds when in any one year such

Exeter College.

Amending Statute II, Section 4, lines 1-2 (*Statutes 1921, p. 7*), by omitting the words "and having held Office for fifteen years."

CHAIN TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

CANCELLATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MAKING CERTAIN SIZES OF DOLLIED OR TOMMIED CHAIN AND OF HAND-HAMMERED CHAIN AND FIXING OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR SUCH WORK FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT ON THE "COST OF LIVING" INDEX FIGURE.

Effective as from 1st February, 1924.

NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 7th February, 1924.

SCHEDULE I.

CANCELLATION OF GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND FIXING OF GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE "COST OF LIVING" FIGURE (AS DEFINED IN SECTION II OF PART III OF THIS SCHEDULE).

PART I.

CANCELLATION OF MINIMUM RATES.

The General Minimum Time-Rates and General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in the Notice C. (11) issued by the Trade Board and dated 4th April, 1921 (which applied to workers employed in the making of certain sizes of Dollied or Tommied Chain and of Hand-Hammered Chain from iron supplied by the Employer) are cancelled as from 1st February, 1924.

PART II.

MINIMUM RATES AS FIXED FOR MAKING CERTAIN SIZES OF DOLLIED OR TOMMIED CHAIN AND OF HAND-HAMMERED CHAIN WHETHER OR NOT THE EMPLOYER PROVIDES THE IRON.

The GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES as FIXED for the Period WHEN THE COST OF LIVING FIGURE IS LESS THAN 90 but MORE THAN 72 are the Minimum Rates set out in Schedule II below.

PART III.

CLAUSES DEFINING "COST OF LIVING" PERIOD AND "COST OF LIVING" FIGURE.

SECTION I.

Each "Cost of Living" period referred to in Columns 1 to 16 of the Table in Part II of this Schedule is a period from the first day of the month following the publication in the "Ministry of Labour Gazette" of a "Cost of Living" Figure (as defined in Section II below) within the range specified in the appropriate column, until the first day of the month following the publication of a figure within the range specified in another column.

Provided that, in cases where the first day of the month does not coincide with the beginning of the weekly pay period, the "Cost of Living" period shall begin or end (as the case may be) at the beginning of the next following weekly pay period.

SECTION II.

The "Cost of Living" Figure specified in this Schedule is the average percentage increase since July, 1914, in retail prices (all items) in the United Kingdom, as published each month in the "Ministry of Labour Gazette."

SECTION III.

The minimum rates as provided in this Notice shall be operative only during the several periods specified in Schedule I or until such time as the cancellation or variations thereof may become effective.

The minimum rates payable on the date specified by the Minister of Labour as the date from which the minimum rates shall become effective, viz., 1st February, 1924, are the rates specified in Column 10 of the Table in Part II of this Schedule.

PART IV.

The minimum rates of wages as provided in this Notice must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

NOTE :—(1) THE MINIMUM RATES APPLICABLE ON THE DATE SPECIFIED BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AS THE DATE FROM WHICH THE MINIMUM RATES BECOME EFFECTIVE, VIZ. : 1ST FEBRUARY, 1924, ARE THOSE SPECIFIED IN COLUMN 10 OF THE TABLE IN PART II OF SCHEDULE I.

(2) NOTIFICATION WILL BE SENT TO ALL KNOWN EMPLOYERS IN THE TRADE WHEN AN ALTERATION IN THE "COST OF LIVING" FIGURE NECESSITATES A CHANGE IN THE MINIMUM RATES.

The piece rates set out above are the *minimum* rates for Chain of the various sizes specified. The piece rates are based on Chain of the commonest finish or workmanship, and higher qualities are payable at correspondingly higher rates.

PART III.

SECTION I. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

For the purposes of this Notice.

The Journeymen rates are applicable where the employer provides the workshop, tools, and fuel, whether or not the employer also provides the iron, and are on the basis that the hearth filling is done by or at the expense of the worker. If done by or at the expense of the employer the minimum rates may be reduced by an amount not exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the rate otherwise applicable.

The Mastermen rates are applicable where the worker provides the workshop in which the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel, or any of these three heads of outlay, whether or not the employer provides the iron, and are on the basis that any carriage to or from the premises of the employer is performed by the worker. If performed by the employer the minimum rates may be reduced by an amount not exceeding 2d. per cwt. for carriage either way.

SECTION II.

In the application of the minimum rates set out in this Notice the following provisions shall also apply :—

- (a) Fractional parts of a cwt. shall be paid for proportionately ;
- (b) Short Link Chain shall be deemed to be chain consisting of links the length of which is not more than five and a quarter times the diameter of the iron used, such measurement to be from end to end outside.
- (c) The minimum rates for sizes $\frac{11}{16}$ in. to $\frac{15}{16}$ in. plus $\frac{1}{32}$ in. inclusive are on the basis that the iron received by the worker shall be cut free of charge into lengths suitable for making links. If the iron be cut by the worker he shall be paid 7s. 2d. per ton extra.

NOTE.—Under the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, in cases where the iron is provided by or at the expense of the worker, the employer is under obligation, in addition to paying the worker at not less than the Minimum Rates Fixed by the Trade Board, to reimburse the worker for any necessary expenditure in connection with the provision of the iron.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 21st January, 1924, confirming the cancellation and fixing of Minimum Rates by the Trade Board and set out above and specifying the dates provided in this Schedule as the dates from which the respective Rates become effective.

Under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator by Article 1 (XIV) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920-23, I hereby prescribe the 7th day of February, 1924, as the final date by which

(a) Proofs by British nationals to whom an extension of time may be granted under the second paragraph of the rule issued by me, dated the 5th (fifth) February, 1923, in respect of debts due to them by Austrian nationals, or of pecuniary obligations of the Austrian Government under Article 248 of the Treaty of Saint Germain-en-Laye,

(b) Claims by British nationals against the Austrian Government, with the payment of which the property, rights, and interests within His Majesty's Dominions or Protectorates belonging to nationals of the former Austrian Empire at the date when the said Treaty came into force (not being property rights or interests acquired under any general licence issued by or on behalf of His Majesty), and the net proceeds of their sale, liquidation or other dealings therewith are charged by Article 1 (IX) of the above mentioned Orders in Council

must be made upon the prescribed Forms and lodged with this Department in order to rank for payment of the third dividend to be declared by me out of the funds in my hands arising from the liquidation of the above mentioned property rights and interests belonging to nationals of the former Austrian Empire or received by me from the Austrian Clearing Office under paragraph 11 of the Annex to Article 248 of the above mentioned Treaty, in pursuance of the Note of His Majesty's Government to the Austrian Government of the 27th August, 1920, published in the London Gazette of the 15th October, 1920 (No. 32886), or arising out of any other available property.

RENFREWSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1924.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order:—

“The Controlled Area” means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled.

The Controlled Area is described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs.

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in force in the Controlled Area.

2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area.

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 3 of this Order—

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area.

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area.

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such sale on any premises within a radius of five miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

(e) No slaughterhouse manure, refuse or offals, or other parts of a carcase intended for feeding animals shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

(f) The landing of animals at the Approved Landing Place and Imported Animals Wharf at the Port of Glasgow (Merklands) is hereby prohibited, except for the purpose of slaughter within the Landing Place or Wharf within 96 hours of the time of landing.

Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

3. Licences may be granted by an Inspector

of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area; animals so moved must be slaughtered within 96 hours of the time of arrival at the slaughterhouse.

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area.

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area; animals so moved must be slaughtered within 96 hours of the time of arrival at the slaughterhouse.

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence."

(e) In the case of animals, the movement of which is necessary for breeding or wintering only, for movement from premises outside the Controlled Area to premises in the Controlled Area.

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Declaration for Issue of Licences.

4. No licence shall be issued under this Order for the movement of any animals from any premises within the Controlled Area unless and until the owner of the animals has made and produced to the Inspector granting the licence a Declaration in writing stating that to the best of his knowledge and belief no animal on the premises from which the animals are proposed to be moved is affected with any disease.

Conditions of Licences.

5.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of (i) movement from premises outside the Controlled Area, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination is situate; (ii) movement of animals from premises within the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate and shall not be available for the movement of the animals unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the animals are to be moved.

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in that Area.

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector

of the Local Authority on the person to whom such Licence was granted.

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement.

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement.

(f) Animals, while being moved with a licence under this Order, shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route, and without avoidable delay, to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals.

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority.

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

6. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Controlled Area if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

Animals for Slaughter.

7.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered.

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hind-quarter, and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

(c) Where any animals are moved with a licence to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area, the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate may, if they think fit, require the animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours from the time of their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Controlled Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents, or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence

to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

10. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

11. Any contravention of this Order, or of any notice served thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Orders.

12. The Renfrewshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1923 (Nos. 6 to 12) are hereby revoked, but any notice served thereunder shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,

1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order:—

“The Controlled Area” means the Area described in the Schedule hereto in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled. If any farm (*excluding any detached part*) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area.

“ Animals ” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs.

“ Slaughterhouse ” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in force in the Controlled Area.

2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area, except as provided in Article 3 of this Order.

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 3 of this Order—

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area.

(c) No animals shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area.

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale of fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such market or sale on any premises within a radius of five miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

(e) No slaughterhouse manure, refuse or offals, or other parts of a carcass intended for feeding animals shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence into, within or out of the Controlled Area.

3. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only :—

(a) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area.

(b) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a farm in the Controlled Area.

(c) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area.

(d) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in such Area.

(e) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence “ Occupation Licence ”.)

(f) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm in that area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area to which the Renfrewshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1924, and the Fife and Perthshire District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1924 for

the time being apply. In the case of such movement the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated, and shall not be available unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the movement commences.

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Conditions of Licence.

4.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except where otherwise expressly stated and also except in the case of movement from premises outside the Controlled Area to a destination in such Area, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination is situate.

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Infected Place, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in that Area.

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted.

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement.

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement.

(f) Animals, while being moved with a licence under this Order, shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route, and without avoidable delay, to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals.

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority.

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

5. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Controlled Area if the animals are not untrucked within the Area.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

6.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered.

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hind-quarter, and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Power to Reduce Time Limit for Slaughter of Animals.

7. Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated may, if they think fit, require the animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours from the time of their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Controlled Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents, or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

10. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

11. Any contravention of this Order, or of any notice served thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation of Previous Order.

12. The Forfarshire (Foot- and - Mouth Disease) Order of 1924 is hereby revoked, but any notice served thereunder shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of a Controlled Area, except as provided in Article 3 of this Order.

Movement of Animals by Licence into, within, or out of a Controlled Area.

3. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside a Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in that Controlled Area;

(b) From premises outside a Controlled Area to a farm in that Controlled Area;

(c) From a farm in a Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;

(d) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in a Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in a Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(e) From one farm to another in a Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

(f) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in a Controlled Area or from a farm in such area to any slaughterhouse in a Controlled Area to which the Renfrewshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1924, for the time being applies. In the case of such movement the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated, and shall not be available unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the movement commences.

Provided that no licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of any animal on a road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or (ii) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Conditions of Licence.

4.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except where otherwise expressly stated and also except in the case of movement from premises outside a Controlled Area to a destination in such Area, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road within a radius of two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, or movement out of a Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in that Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals, while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route, and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority.

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

5. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through a Controlled Area if the animals are not untrucked within the Area.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

6.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Power to Reduce Time Limit for Slaughter of Animals.

7. Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated may, if they think fit, require the animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours from the time of their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in a Controlled Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents, or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in a Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

10. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

11. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Order.

12. The Fife and Perthshire District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 6) is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as the FIFE AND PERTHSHIRE DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1924.
