**UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACTS,
1877-1923.**

Notice is hereby given of the submission to His Majesty in Council of the following Statutes which have the consent of the University of Oxford Commissioners in writing under their Seal.

Oxford University.

Adding a further sub-clause to *Statt. Tit. XIX. Section 19, cl. 13 (iv)* (p. 356, ed. 1922), "enabling Christ Church to reckon as an additional deduction as from January 1, 1922, a sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred pounds when in any one year such

a sum has been contributed by the Governing Body of Christ Church to the Chapter Fund."

Exeter College.

Amending Statute II, Section 4, lines 1-2 (*Statutes 1921, p. 7*), by omitting the words "and having held Office for fifteen years."

Amending Statute II, Section 4, line 6, by altering £500 to £600.

Amending Statute VII, Section 1, sub. fin. (*Statutes 1921, p. 33*), by omitting the words "provided that" down to "from the Tuition Fund."

Christ Church.

Adding the following words to Statute VII:—

"The Governing Body may contribute, at their discretion, if the funds at their disposal permit, a further annual sum, not exceeding £2,250, towards the maintenance of the Choir School, or for purposes to which the Chapter Fund is applied."
