And whereas by Article 3 (2) of the said Turkey Order-in-Council, 1922, it is provided that the Secretary of State shall from time to time give notice of any such suspension of the said Ottoman Order-in-Council, 1910, and shall specify the areas within which such suspension shall operate;

And whereas notice was given on the 1st November, 1923, of the suspension in Syria within the boundaries of the area under French mandate of the operation of so much of the Ottoman Order-in-Council, 1910, as relates to the power and jurisdiction of courts;

And whereas the coming into operation of the courts established in Syria by the French Republic and recognised by His Majesty as competent to exercise jurisdiction over British subjects and their property and over British ships was subsequently postponed until the 1st February, 1924;

And whereas by notice, dated the 16th January, 1924, the said notice, dated the 1st November, 1923, was cancelled, and notice was given that the operation of so much of the Ottoman Order-in-Council, 1910, as relates to the power and jurisdiction of courts would be suspended in Syria within the boundaries of the area under French mandate as from the 1st February, 1924;

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend certain

Local Acts in force in the said Borough, as follows:—

(1) To alter and amend the Blackpool Improvement Act, 1893, so as to extend and apply the provisions of section 85 (Power to contribute to funds of hospitals &c.), and of section 86 (Power to make byelaws as to hospitals, &c.), of the said Act to any Hostel or Home for the Welfare and protection of women and girls who are temporarily out of employment and require assistance or accommodation;

(2) To alter or amend the Blackpool Improvement Acts, 1865, 1893, 1896, 1898, 1899, 1917, and 1920, so as to empower the Corporation notwithstanding anything in those Acts to provide and maintain refreshment rooms, in or on any part or parts of the public walks, promenades and open-air Swimming Baths belonging to them, and either manage such refreshment rooms themselves or let the rooms to any person, any expenses of the Corporation to be defrayed out of the fund or rate, applicable to the promenades, public walks, or swimming baths as the case may be, and any receipts to be carried to the credit of the same fund or rate;

(3) To alter or amend section 46 of the Blackpool Improvement Act, 1901, relating to temporary or movable buildings or structures, so as

(i) To provide that if any temporary or movable building or structure is commenced, erected or set up without application being first made to the Corporation as required by the section, or without the approval of the Corporation, or if any such building or structure is not removed within the period allowed by the Corporation, the owner or occupier of the building or structure shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings and to a daily penalty not exceeding a like amount, and the Corporation may cause the building or structure to be pulled down or removed and may recover any expense incurred by them in so doing, and

(ii) to remove the exemption in paragraph (B) of sub-section (6) in respect of tables or boards on trestles (not exceeding in any part four feet in height above the ground) and not fixed to the ground or enclosed on the sides or ends thereof and not having any roof or other covering and not used for the sale or exposure for sale thereon of fish, shell-fish, meat vegetables or other perishable articles.

(4) To alter or amend the Blackpool Improvement Acts, 1865, 1893, 1899, 1917 and 1920, so as to empower the Corporation on such days (excluding Sundays) as they think fit (not exceeding fourteen days in one year or five consecutive days on any one occasion) to close to the public such one or more portions as they may from time to time select of the following parts or sections of the Promenades as are situate—

(a) between the North Pier and the northerly boundary of the premises of Blackpool Pleasure Beach limited, or

(b) between the Central Pier and the northerly boundary of the said premises, or

(c) between the northerly boundary of the said premises and the southerly boundary of the Borough,

and to set apart and use the same for the purpose of public processions, carnivals, motor races, sports, shows and exhibitions of any kind, or for any public purpose, and to charge for admission to the section so set apart; and further, to close such part of the tramway as is co-extensive with the part or section of the adjacent promenades to be closed.

(5) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

1. In this Order:—

" The Prohibited Area " means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

" The Controlled Area " means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled;

The Prohibited Area and the Controlled Area are respectively described in the First and Second Schedules hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within such Area;

" Animals " means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

" Slaughterhouse " means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Area.

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of the Prohibited Area, except as herein-after provided;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Prohibited Area;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure, refuse or offals, or other parts of a carcase intended for feeding animals shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Area.

(e) "The landing of animals at the approved Landing Place at the port of Liverpool (Birkenhead and Wallasey) is hereby prohibited except for animals intended for slaughter. Animals shall only be removed from the Landing Place direct to a slaughterhouse within the Prohibited Area, or an Infected Area to which the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 applies. Animals so moved shall be subject to the provisions of the respective Orders applying to the areas in which the places of destination are situated."

Control of Dogs in Prohibited Area.

3.—(a) Dogs in the Prohibited Area shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept by the owner thereof under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(b) Any dog which is not kept under control as prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with. No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purpose of vivisection.

Provision for Movement into the Prohibited Area of Animals for Immediate Slaughter.

4. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in the Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from an Inspector of the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination: Provided that where the distance from the railway station in the Prohibited Area to the place of destination is

greater than the distance to be covered within the Area, if the movement were to take place by road, the Inspector granting the licence may specify therein, any other route if he thinks it desirable, and may require the animals to be moved by float.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

5.—(a) No animals shall be moved out of the Controlled Area except into the Prohibited Area. Such movement shall be limited to animals intended for immediate slaughter, as provided in the preceding Article.

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Articles 4 or 6 of this Order:—

(i) Into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter, or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;

(e) No slaughterhouse manure, refuse or offals, or other parts of a carcase intended for feeding animals shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

6.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licences "Occupation Licence."

(e) In the case of store cattle (including cows and heifers) only, for movement from premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to premises in the Controlled Area.

(2) No licence shall be granted under this Order for the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale.

Conditions of Licences.

7.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose dis-

hibit the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse or other premises in such Area, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse or place of destination is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in the Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Area or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

8. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Area, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

9.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be slaughtered within 96 hours of arrival thereat;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hind-quarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail

Sheep.—A letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) pro-

hibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding, or tending the animals, but no other persons shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

General Power to Control Dogs and Poultry.

11.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

12. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

13. Any contravention of this Order, or of any notice served thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Orders.

14. The Orders described in the Third Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

Application of North Midlands (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923, No. 10.

15. The North Midlands (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 10) shall be read and have effect as if it referred to this Order and to the areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto, instead of to the North Midlands (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 14).

Commencement.

16. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Short Title.

17. This Order may be cited as the NORTH MIDLANDS (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1924.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER of 1924 (No. 10).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Revocation of Previous Orders.

1. The Orders described in the Third Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

Contraction of certain Areas.

2. The Areas described in the First Schedule hereto shall cease to form part of any infected area, and are accordingly released from restrictions.

Meaning of Terms.

3. In this Order:—

“An Infected Area” means an Area described in the Second Schedule hereto.

If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside an Infected Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Infected Areas.

4.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of an Infected Area except to a slaughterhouse in

another Infected Area as provided in Article 4 of this Order.

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 5 of this Order:—

(i) into an Infected Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within an Infected Area.

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in an Infected Area.

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in an Infected Area; except a market or sale of fat animals intended for immediate slaughter or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such market or sale on any premises within a radius of five miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease: Provided that any such premises on which all affected animals thereon have been slaughtered, shall cease to be regarded as a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease at the expiration of twenty-eight days from the date upon which the slaughter of the stock was completed, if the final disinfection of the premises has been completed to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Ministry.

(e) No slaughterhouse manure, refuse, or offals or other parts of a carcass intended for feeding animals shall be moved out of an Infected Area or be brought into contact with animals in any such Area.

(f) The landing of animals at the approved Landing Places at the Ports of Fleetwood, Heysham, Silloth, Preston and Manchester is hereby prohibited, except for animals intended for slaughter. Such animals shall be moved from the Landing Place only to a slaughterhouse in an Infected Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence Into or Within the Infected Areas.

5.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside any Infected Area to a slaughterhouse in an Infected Area.

(b) From premises outside any Infected Area to a farm in an Infected Area.

(c) From a farm in an Infected Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in the same Area.

(d) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in an Infected Area or from a farm or other premises in an Infected Area to a slaughterhouse in the same Infected Area or in another Infected Area.

(e) From one farm to another in the same Infected Area or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence").

(2) Where a Licence is granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority under paragraph (b) for the movement of animals from premises outside any Infected Area to a farm in an Infected Area, or under paragraph (e) for movement from one farm to another in an Infected Area, it shall be a condition of the licence that the animals shall on arrival at the destination specified in the licence be detained thereon for a period of twenty-eight days:

Provided that this provision shall not apply to licences in respect of the movement of animals for breeding purposes.

During such period the animals may be slaughtered on the premises, but shall not be removed therefrom for any purpose.

(3) No licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale, or (ii) the movement of any animal to or from any place or along any road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease: Provided that any such premises on which all affected animals thereon have been slaughtered, shall cease to be regarded as a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease at the expiration of twenty-eight days from the date upon which the slaughter of the stock was completed, if the final disinfection of the premises has been completed to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Ministry.

Time Limit for Slaughter of Animals.

6. Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse they shall be slaughtered within 96 hours of the time of arrival at the slaughterhouse, provided that the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate may, if they think fit, require any such animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours.

Conditions of Licences.

7.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the dis-

trict in which the place of destination is situate and a licence shall not be available for the movement of the animals, unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the animals are to be moved.

(b) Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order the Inspector granting or countersigning the licence may if he thinks it desirable specify therein the route by which the animals are to be moved, and may require the animals to be moved by float or other suitable vehicle.

(c) Licences for movement within an Infected Area, or from one Infected Area to another shall not permit movement on any road outside the Infected Area.

(d) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such Licence was granted.

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station or to an Officer of the Local Authority immediately after completion of the movement.

(f) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for six days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement.

(g) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by rail, by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals. Animals being moved under this Order by railway shall not be untrucked until they reach the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

(h) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority.

(i) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Infected Areas by Railway Permitted.

8. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through an Infected Area from a place outside any such Area to another place outside any such Area, but the animals shall not be untrucked within any Infected Area or Areas through which they are so moved.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

9.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered.

(b) Before such movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hind-quarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in an Infected Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

11.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in an Infected Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Movement of Imported Animals.

12. Imported animals intended to be moved from an approved Landing Place to a destination within any of the Infected Areas shall be accompanied throughout the movement by (1) a licence issued under this Order by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination, and in the case of cattle, sheep or goats, by (2) the licence granted by the Inspector of the Ministry under the Imported Animals Order of 1923 (No. 2) authorising the removal of the animals from the Landing Place. The last mentioned licence shall not be issued until the Local Authority's licence is produced to the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

13. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

14. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder or of the conditions of any licence granted thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.
